Hello church family and friends!

So there I was, half awake early this morning and scrolling on Facebook when I happened upon a post by a pastor friend of mine named Grace Imathiu. It was a very sweet way to start the day. I thought I'd share her words with you.

"Captain's Log, July 19, 2021 [I love that she begins like this]

"Yesterday after worship, my Son and I head on to LePeep, a local breakfast joint. The couple in front of me are talking to each other in short sentences. They look to me like graduate students. One speaks and they both laugh and the other speaks and they both chuckle. They are obviously just overjoyed with the miracle of finding each other.

"They are in love. It's obvious from where I am standing behind them in a long line waiting to be seated. They are not holding hands but it's obvious they are holding hearts. They remind me of a younger T and L; or L and L; or J and C. Or maybe like me and Husband. It's the kind of love that is sheer gift and those who have it know that. The kind of love that has jumped over the barbed wire of social constructs of race or gender or class. That's why my eyes get all misty standing in line at LePeep.

"The hostess takes their name and tells them it's a ten minute wait. I overhear their diagnosis and groan inside. I tell myself 'Ugggh. That's a problem. I don't know if I can wait.' They look at each other and then say to the hostess, 'No problem. We'll wait.' She smiles, relieved. Suddenly I too can wait.

"I think to myself, love does that. It leaks on those around you. So I tell myself: for those days when I am not in love, I will seek those in love so their love can leak into my life.

"Maybe that's why some people come to church. Maybe they come hoping love will leak on them from people who love God and each other and the world."

United Methodist Men Virtual National Gathering Saturday, August 28 2021

The General Commission on United Methodist Men announces the 2021 Virtual National Men's Gathering. The gathering will be held Saturday, August 28, 2021. The event will begin at 10:00am central and will end around 4:00pm central. Our keynote speakers will be the Rev. Dr. Ron Bell and the Rev Tom Albin.

Rev. Dr Bell is the senior pastor of Camphor Memorial UMC and a regular guest columnist for the Saint Paul Monitor. He has written articles for The Upper Room, UMNews.org and has published articles in the Minnesota Coalition for Death Education and Support quarterly journal among other publications. He has written three books: *Bigger Than Hip Hop 7 Questions for Reaching Young Adults in Ministry, Is There Space for Me Embracing Greif through Art*, and his latest book: *The Four Promises Journeying through Past and Present Trauma*. He has also created an ongoing webinar series on Trauma and Empathy that he has led with several universities including St. Paul College, Bethel University, University of Maryland Eastern Shore, Fuller Theological Seminary, and several others, as well as with numerous nonprofits and county agencies.

Ron is married to Dr. Eboni M. Bell, and they have two sons. Ron will be speaking in the session on "Combating and Healing the Trauma of Racism."

Rev Albin is currently the Executive Director of the United Christian Ashrams International and President of Albin Consulting. He recently retired from his work as the Director of Spiritual Formation and Congregational Life for The Upper Room, a branch of The United Methodist Discipleship Ministries in Nashville, TN. Tom is passionate about helping others come to know Jesus Christ and grow into the mature, life-giving, joy filled, people God created us to be. He sees evangelism and discipleship are the natural consequences of our life in Christ and the result of the Holy Spirit's work in us.

Rev Albin received a Bachelor of Arts degree Magna Cum Laude in 1973. After serving as a full-time youth director at First United Methodist Church in Tulsa, Oklahoma, he answered God's call to ministry, completed his Master's Degree at Fuller Theological Seminary, and began work on a Ph.D. in Ecclesiastical History in 1978 at the University of Cambridge in England. Tom has authored or contributed to numerous books, written numerous articles, online courses, and reference works.

Tom and his wife, Maryle, have three married daughters and eight grandchildren. Tom will be speaking in the session on "Evangelism and Discipleship."
