



Beginning in July, we are partnering with Kelli Kelly and the Fallon Food Hub on a grant that (**IF** we are awarded the grant) will provide similar boxes of fresh local produce every other week from July through Thanksgiving. So there are lots of ways to serve, and we really need your help. If you have never volunteered before, we pray that you will step out in faith to be a part of all that we do. - Help host our laundry and shower services on Mondays, Tuesdays, or Thursday afternoons. It is really easy, and is such a gift to folks in need.
- Help staff the sign-in desk at the Epworth Food Pantry on Mondays from 9:30am til 1pm
- Volunteer to escort folks through the pantry, to help them get what they need.
- Help unload and shelve new food that comes in on Monday mornings



Annual Conference is something we look forward to every year. It can be exciting, and frustrating, and surprising, and disappointing, and sometimes just boring and ordinary. It is a time to see old friends and meet new ones from all over California and Nevada, celebrate our shared ministries, and learn about new ones. Ordinarily it is held at the end of June each year, but Covid-19 caused it to be postponed until September. Our official voting delegates this year are Margaret Knox and Barbara McGarity, and our youth delegate is Kenny Coval. Doug Coval and Kathy Fraker, who have been our delegates in years past, are substitutes. Here is some information from our Conference website:

"The annual conference is the basic body in The United Methodist Church and sessions of the annual conference have historically been a time for the people called Methodists to gather, give account to God of the work they have done and their stewardship of the resources God has given them since they last met. It has also been a holy time to discern God's will for their future, a time when persons called to ordained ministry are commissioned and ordained, and both clergy and lay personnel and financial resources are deployed for ministry. Above all, annual conference sessions have been connectional gatherings where the gathered have experienced the presence of the Holy Spirit and have been revived for God's holy work."

All of Annual Conference is open to EVERYONE. Not everyone can vote of course, only official delegates can do that, but all are welcome and encouraged to attend, to experience what happens there, and to add your voices and perspectives and prayers to the important work we do there. Please keep all of the church in prayer, that the Holy Spirit move through us and work among us in powerful ways!
