



Some of you have escaped to the warmer climate of Florida for some therapeutic warmth and sunshine. If that's you, you're not missing much up here in the Long Island cold.

We've started the year off with excellent momentum and I am excited for what 2025 will hold for the club and our members. For starters, we're growing. At this time last year, our roster had only 34 members. I'm happy to report that we were just over 40 at the end of 2024 and we have several prospects that have expressed interest in joining this year. Our goal still remains lofty at 50 members. It seemed like a stretch last year but as we are gaining ground, it feels like we will definitely get there in 2025 with everyone doing their part to help.

Increases in membership have a ripple affect that runs through everything we do. Our dinner meetings, the bar, fundraising activities and outside events all benefit as we continue to grow. So, what does it look like for 2025? Let me share a financial update for you. Last year our income forecast was almost \$48,000. Because of our growth and some new fundraising events we actually generated over \$53,000 in 2024. This gave the Bridge the opportunity to pay back all of our outstanding loans and make plans to make some improvements around the club. Our goal for 2025 is to raise over \$60,000. If we are successful, the club will have a much needed facelift, we will have some safety reserves, and we will be able to do more to help our community. All good stuff.

On the expense side our expense budget for 2025 is just over \$51,000. Included below are a couple of graphics that give you some more detail on what is included in both our income and expense budget plans for 2025. It's going to be a great year. I can feel it!
