What are Bridging Teams?



- Bridging Teams are groups of up to15 participants who meet weekly to share in food, fun, & storytelling.
- Teams are made up of people living in poverty, "Catalysts", and "Mentors", who are usually middleincome individuals and may or may not have lived experience in poverty.
- In a Team, everyone learns from each one another in a safe facilitated group setting.
- Bridges Peterborough has been offering the Bridging Team program since 2017.
- We have three New Bridging Teams that are starting in 2023!
