HONOREES 2020-2021



VERLENE THOMPSON EDMOND is a native Texan. She attended the Houston Public Schools, graduating from Phillis Wheatley High School in 1948.

In 1951, Verlene married Edward Lee Edmond; and the same year graduated from Prairie View A&M University. Her first nursing job was at Hermann Hospital; continued her nursing career at Depelchin Faith Home and Children's Bureau as Supervisor of the health program for the and later became a Staff Nurse at M.D. Anderson Cancer Institute

Negro Child Center Clinic; and, later became a Staff Nurse at M.D. Anderson Cancer Institute.

In 1959, Mrs. Edmond was employed by Houston Independent School District as a School Nurse. In 1976, Verlene and her husband relocated to Memphis, Tennessee; employed as the first Black supervisor over the Memphis Public School Health Program paving the way for the hiring of twenty-five other Black nurses. In 1979, Mrs. Edmond and her husband returned to Houston; and she was re-hired by HISD as a school Nurse.

July of 1987, Mr. Edmond passed. After his death, Verlene organized and served as President of the Edward L. Edmond Scholarship Foundation. Today, the Foundation has awarded 175 High School graduates with scholarships in the amount of \$1,000.00 per graduate.

Church Affiliations: Member of New Pleasant Grove Missionary Baptist Church. Active in many Auxiliaries such as President of Mission, Sunday school teacher, Deaconess Board, and etc.

Community organizations: Active member of the Order of the Eastern Starts; Phillis Wheatley alumni; Retired Nurses Association; PV Nurses Alumni Chapter (renewing membership each year); member of the NAACP, and etc.

Verlene is the mother of two (2) daughters, Laquita and Carmita; the grandmother of Edward and Brittni. She is the great- grandmother of Madison. She loves traveling and working in the yard. After 28 years of dedicated service to the HISD, Mrs. Edmond retired in May of 1987.

Her favorite saying is, "To God be the glory."



JAMESIA FRANSAW, is a Registered Nurse in the Harris Health System. She currently works as an Intermediate Care Unit Nurse at Lyndon B. Johnson Hospital, a Level III Trauma and Distinguished Regional Center. There, she also serves as a Community of Practice Chair, Charge Nurse, Magnet Champion and on various committees. In 1959 she came to Houston, Texas, where she met and married Leon Dillard and they had two daughters, Kim and Crystal.

She has worked as a Clinical Instructor in Operating Room Technique at Prairie View A & M University and Ben Taub General Hospital. More opportunities opened to her at St. Luke's Hospital, Veteran's Administration Hospital and Woman's Hospital of Texas where she worked with the Anesthesia Specialists of Houston group until 1998.

After retirement, Frankie began volunteering as a CPR instructor with the American Red Cross. She was also the Health and Wellness Ministry lead at Jones Memorial United Methodist Church, of which she has been a member since 1961.

After much research and planning, Frankie joined her daughters Kim and Crystal in founding Hannibal Men's Specialty Apparel, an online men's clothing company that specialized in apparel for the "super athletic physique". In early 2000, she was diagnosed withHodgkin's Lymphoma. She has been in remission for 19 years.

The pull of nursing, her first love, came calling again. And in 2009, she began working with Walgreens/Option Care in their ambulatory infusion center
