

A State of Emergency on Childhood Trauma would direct resources for awareness, education, and treatment to address Health Care, Education, Nutrition, Child Welfare, Community Supports, and the Juvenile Justice System among other systems and institutions.

We are proposing a SECT program that would:

- Address health disparities by providing medical and behavioral health professionals with trauma responsive care and cultural humility training.
- Provide access to ongoing trauma responsive therapy for youth within communities impacted by system oppression
- Provide violence intervention programming in communities with high rates of poverty
- Provide trauma screening, support, psycho-education, and intervention to community members impacted by community violence and other system oppression
- Provide training for school Administrators, Resource Officers, and Educators in schools within the Ohio on trauma responsive care and cultural humility
- Provide education on nutrition and movement and increase access to wholistic methods of healing through community supports
- Require service agreements with other local community agencies and schools to provide trauma responsive services and integrated care for youth in communities impacted by systemic oppression
- Provide training for Juvenile and Family Court Judges and Personnel on trauma responsive care and cultural humility
- Provide clean-food grocery outlets in underserved communities and nutritional food programs through S.N.A,P to help educate on diets that create wellness
