A Life-Saving Extension at Gaza's Most Vital Hospital

Once the beating heart of Gaza's healthcare system, Al-Shifa Hospital now stands in ruins.

Other major hospitals, including Indonesian, Al-Awda, and Kamal Adwan, have been shut down due to targeted attacks and repeated siege conditions.

The situation is critical. Al-Shifa is at 200-300% capacity. Patients are being treated on floors, in hallways, and in tents.

Children and the wounded are being turned away due to lack of space.

We are launching a project focused entirely on building the hospital structure needed to bring healthcare back to this region.

FIELD HOSPITAL EXTENSION PROJECT

PROJECT OVERVIEW:

- 140 inpatient beds
- 2 operating rooms
- Surgical recovery and triage space
- Full plumbing, drainage, and electrical
- Fortified infrastructure with basic safety measures

THREE-PHASE CONSTRUCTION:

- Phase 1 Site Clearance & Demolition: Clearing the remains of the Thalassemia, Engineering, and Maintenance buildings to prepare the site. Cost: \$50,000.
- Phase 2 Western Wing Construction:
 Building 80 inpatient beds, 2 operating rooms, and the recovery space. Cost: \$429,000.
- Phase 3 Eastern Wing Construction:
 Building the remaining 60 inpatient beds and support infrastructure. Cost: \$258,000.
