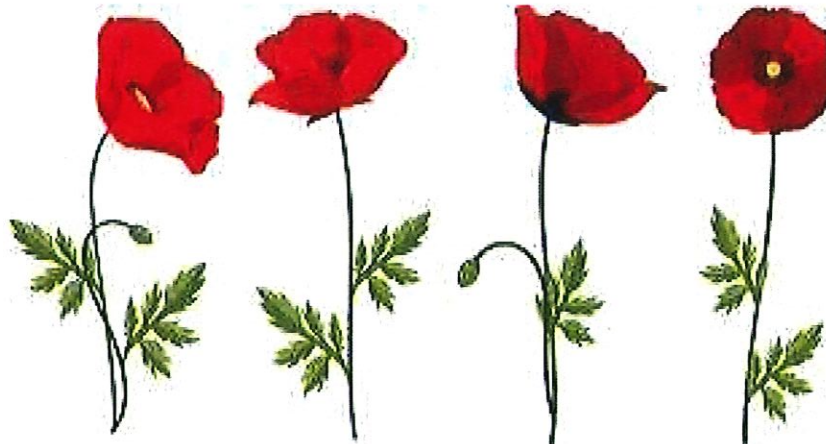

January is Cervical Awareness Month. The month aims to raise awareness and promote information on prevention, diagnosis, treatment, survivorship and cure. More than 80 out of every 100 will survive for 1 year or more after they are diagnosed, and 60 will survive their cancer for 5 years or more after diagnosis, 50 will survive their cancer for 10 years or more.

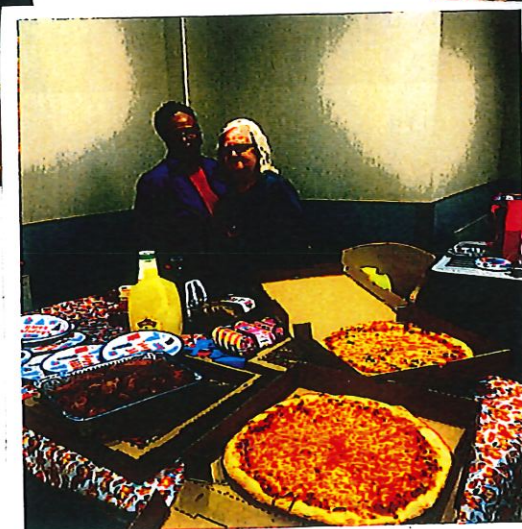

April is Easter time, the bunny loves to bring colored eggs and candy.

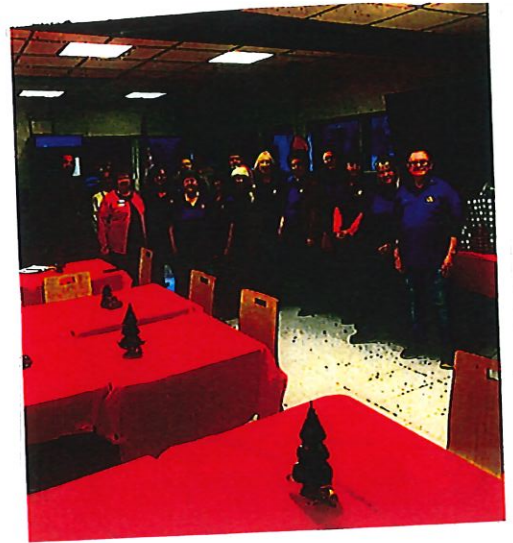

Legislation
January 2025

This month's Action Alert should look familiar. I've reported on it before. Your veterans and their families need you to support H.R. 8371, Senator Elizabeth Dole 21st Century Veterans Healthcare and Benefits Improvement Act. This will enhance services for veterans and caregivers. This bipartisan-negotiated legislation has been crafted from input collected from dozens of organizations representing veterans, caregivers, and survivors throughout the United States.

Specifically, it will reduce wait time for veterans to access necessary care. It will also maximize caregiver benefits. It seeks to guarantee access to care in the veterans' communities. Survivors of military personnel will be able to access a broader array of benefits. Long term veteran care will be more accessible. It aims to also reduce veteran suicide by analyzing the correlation of VA benefit usage to veteran suicides. Finally, it would give veterans more autonomy to choose where they receive healthcare.

Youth Activities January 2025

Brothers and Sisters,

Happy New Year. Now is the time to get all your promotions and activities done. If you have any questions don't hesitate to call or email me. These are ten tips you can do with the youth.

1. There is youth training programs. The boy scouts have one. You can find it online <http://www.scouting.org/Traning/youthprotection.aspx>
2. See when the youth are available as they could be doing something else and make it at a convenient time. The parents will appreciate that you finish on time
3. Invite the parents to stay and be a part of the activity.
4. Make sure the proper safety measures are taken and the events are appropriate.
5. Make sure you know the location where you bring the youth.
6. Be courteous about not having smoking, drinking and drugs around the youth.
7. Make sure you have a permission slip from the parents before you take them outside of the post home and school. If you are using a private vehicle.
8. See if you can receive training from your local Child Abuse Prevention Council or Child Protective Center on the Mandated Suspected Child Abuse Reporting Laws in your state for those working with the youth.
9. See if you need to have an individual fingerprinted before working with the youth/children before an event, they may have laws in your state that may require it.
10. You should model and maintain healthy boundaries with the children. Try to be a role model. Don't forget that your attitude towards others is not appropriate, for instance anger towards another person or abuse around the children as it may cause a fear in the child. It only takes a minute to make a difference in a child's life. You can do small things with a positive attitude. Giving words of praise and encouragement to a child can make a difference. Show the child that you listen to what is said. Just a small action can have a profound impact on the child's life. We can strengthen families and children in a real way.
