# Entry and Exhibit Information

Entries are open to all people of the State of Alaska. Every exhibit must be entered in the name of the owner. Items that are not the work of the exhibitor may be entered for display only. Entries are to be delivered to the proper exhibit location.

Each exhibit must have an exhibitor tag. Tags may be obtained at the Delta Library or Alaska Farmers Co-op, starting Monday, July 21st, 2025. Having tags completed prior to entry will save time during the entry process. Exhibitor numbers will be assigned at time of entry.

Commercial/professional entries should indicate such near the exhibitor number. Exhibitors must include the correct Division, Unit, Class, and Lot for each exhibit he/she wishes to enter. An exhibitor may make only one entry per lot.

Please write legibly. Return address stickers may be used on tags. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to meet all deadlines. No exhibitors are exempt from paying the gate fee during Fair weekend. Exhibitors may not move exhibits during the fair or change space assignments.

Any non-classified entry will be accepted, and the superintendent will create a new lot or class as appropriate. The right to combine lots with less than three entries is left to the discretion of the superintendent as is the right to refuse to accept any entry offered. Except for plants, no entry shall have been previously exhibited at the Deltana Fair.

## Judging, Prizes & Premiums

Judging score cards are available to exhibitors on request. The Fair Association reserves the right to close exhibit areas to public viewing until judging is completed. Judging may begin in any division immediately following the close of entries.

Exhibits will be judged using the American or Danish systems. All judging decisions are final. Ribbons and cash premiums awards will be: First, blue ribbon and \$3; Second, red ribbon and \$2; Third, white ribbon and \$1; Grand Champion rosette ribbon and \$3; Reserve Champion rosette ribbon and \$2. These cash premiums will be awarded except where noted. Commercial exhibits will be awarded ribbons, but no cash premiums, and may be judged separately.

Exhibit Hall Cash Premiums will be available at the Exhibit Hall Friday,

August 8th, 2025, after 7 p.m.

Should any exhibitor obtain a premium through any false evidence or misrepresentation, or by any violation of any of the rules and regulations herein, the money or premium will be withheld by the superintendent upon ascertaining that such has been the case.

### **Removal of Exhibits**

No exhibits may be removed from the Fairgrounds before 4 pm on the Sunday of Fair weekend, August 10<sup>th</sup>, 2025. The Exhibit Halls will be open until 6 pm. Should you not be able to pick up exhibits on Sunday you may call the fair or exhibit manager until the following weekend to plan to pick up exhibits. The Fair Association will not be responsible for exhibits left after that time and exhibits may be destroyed.

Any exhibit removed in violation of this rule will forfeit all premiums that may be awarded and prohibit entry the following year.

### **Superintendents**

There will be a superintendents' meeting prior to the fair to coordinate paperwork to insure uniformity. It is the Superintendents' responsibility to verify the correct completion of exhibit tags before accepting any entry. Superintendents will supervise ribbon placing after judging is completed. Superintendents will enlist help to run their divisions, take entries and arrange displays (all day Tuesday and Thursday), and take down displays as exhibitors pick up their entries Sunday evening.

### **General Rules**

No smoking is allowed in exhibit areas. No drugs or drug paraphernalia are allowed on the Fairgrounds during the Fair. Beer may be consumed only in areas designated by the Board of Directors. No animals permitted on the Fairgrounds, except for service dogs, animals entered as exhibits, in contests, or in the pet show. Such animals may only be on the fairgrounds one hour prior to and following the event in which they are entered, except for livestock and other animals when approved arrangements have been made with the Fair Manager for keeping of the animals in the livestock/camping area. The Fair Management will use every possible precaution to protect the exhibits and property while on exhibition, but it is understood that the Fair Association shall not be held responsible for loss, damage or injury of any kind from any source whatsoever.

Due to conditions beyond our control, the Fair Management, or members will not be responsible for personal injuries, accidents or losses sustained by visitors, exhibitors, or any other person on the Fairgrounds. The Board of Directors reserves the final right to interpret these rules and regulations and arbitrarily settle and determine all matters, questions and differences in regard thereto, or arising out of, connected with or incidental to the Fair, and it reserves the right to rule on any questions not covered in these rules and regulations.



# Division 3 – Education

Please do not submit workbooks or tests. Creative assignments only, except for preschool (ages 0-5 years). All work must be done by the student during the immediate past school year.

Projects not assigned or given credit in school are to be entered in open divisions such as fine arts, creative crafts, photography, and needlework. Group exhibits [2 or more people] are welcome. Exhibit tag should state that it is a group project and list names of all participants.

Prepare each exhibit with a cover, mat, backing, or frame without glass – whatever is appropriate. Show that some thought went into the preparation.

If the exhibit does not comply with the above requirements, points will be deducted during judging. All exhibits will be judged by the Danish system.

## Special Requirements:

- Only one entry per lot for each exhibitor.
- Ingredients must accompany entry and should be clearly written or typed. An ingredients list is not required for fresh milk, natural honey products, or collections.
- Containers used must be standard Mason type canning jars when applicable. The jar must be labeled with the complete name of the product, date it was sealed, and the canning method.
- Vegetables and meats must be canned by the pressure cooker method.
- Containers may be opened and contents tasted by the judges. Any product not properly sealed will be disqualified.
- All canned entries must have rings to reseal jars. To avoid food waste, exhibitors may replace their exhibit immediately after judging with a like item by contacting the superintendent.
- Commercial/Professional entries will be judged separately. Please write "commercial" on the exhibit tag near ID number. See general rules.

# Division 6 – Vegetables & Fruit

In addition to the General Rules and Regulations section of this manual, all exhibitors shall conform to the guidelines in Publication No. 300B 00039 “Vegetables - Selection and Preparation for Display” available from the University of Alaska Cooperative Extension Service for \$1. Entries must be Alaska grown.

Vegetables should be fresh, clean, and uniform in size, shape, maturity, smoothness, and coloration, indicating trueness of variety. Select specimens of the size most commonly sold in commercial markets.

Root crops should have their tops trimmed to one inch in length, and all lateral roots removed leaving a single tap root for display.

Varieties should be indicated on the exhibit tag. Please enter the correct number of specimens as indicated. Outdoor (Unit 1) and Greenhouse (Unit 2) exhibits will be registered as such and judged separately.

No poisonous/inedible berries or mushrooms/toadstools of any kind will be allowed to enter as an exhibit.
