WELCOME!

Fallison Lake Nature Trail System is our longest nature trail, with the longest trail loop at 2.34 miles. This scenic trail rolls through a mixed coniferous-deciduous forest of balsam, red pine, white pine, sugar maple, white birch and large-toothed aspen. The trail crosses bogs on the southwest and northeast sides and a hemlock glade on the south side. Watch for signs of beaver activity along the trail and along the shorelines. Loons, osprey and eagles are often seen on or around Fallison Lake Trail. Cross-country skiing is not encouraged on these ungroomed trails in the winter due to sets of stairs that might present difficulties. Snowshoeing and hiking in the winter months is welcomed. Pets/bikes are not allowed year-round on this trail. No fee or pass is required to utilize this trail.

Check out the hidden picnic area and hemlock glade on the south side of the trail.

TRAIL RULES

- A Wisconsin State Trail Pass is not required for the Fallison Lake Trail.
- No pets/bikes are allowed on the Fallison Lake Trail year-round.
- Carry out all litter and waste.
- No motorized vehicles allowed.
- A lost and found service is maintained at Crystal Lake and Clear Lake Visitor Stations. If lost items are found, please turn them in at one of these visitor stations. Help us return items to their rightful owners.

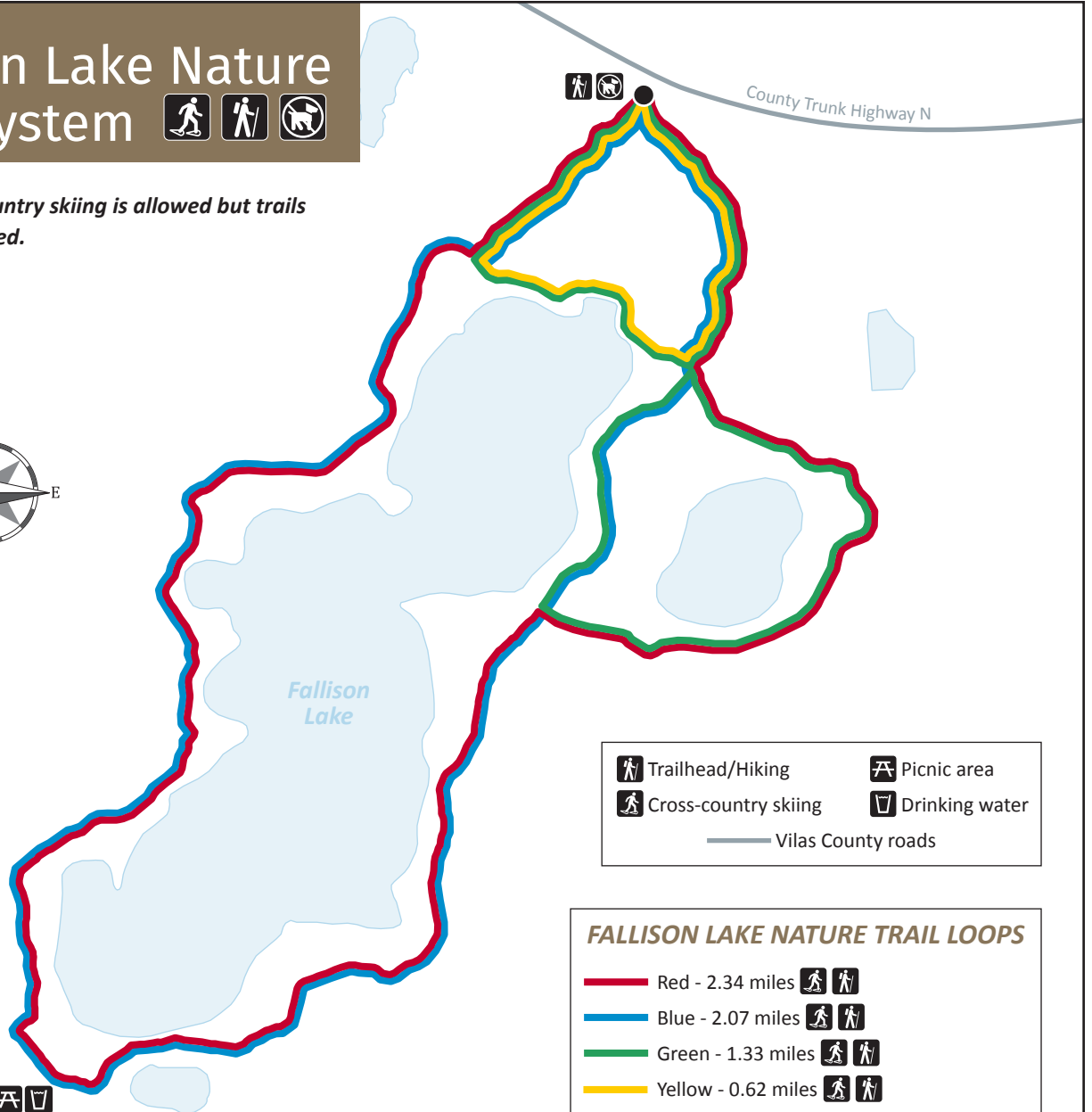
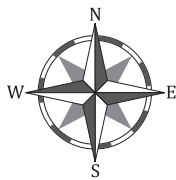
