—We have received some important training in Community Health Education, which will multiply opportunities for outreach in the years to come.

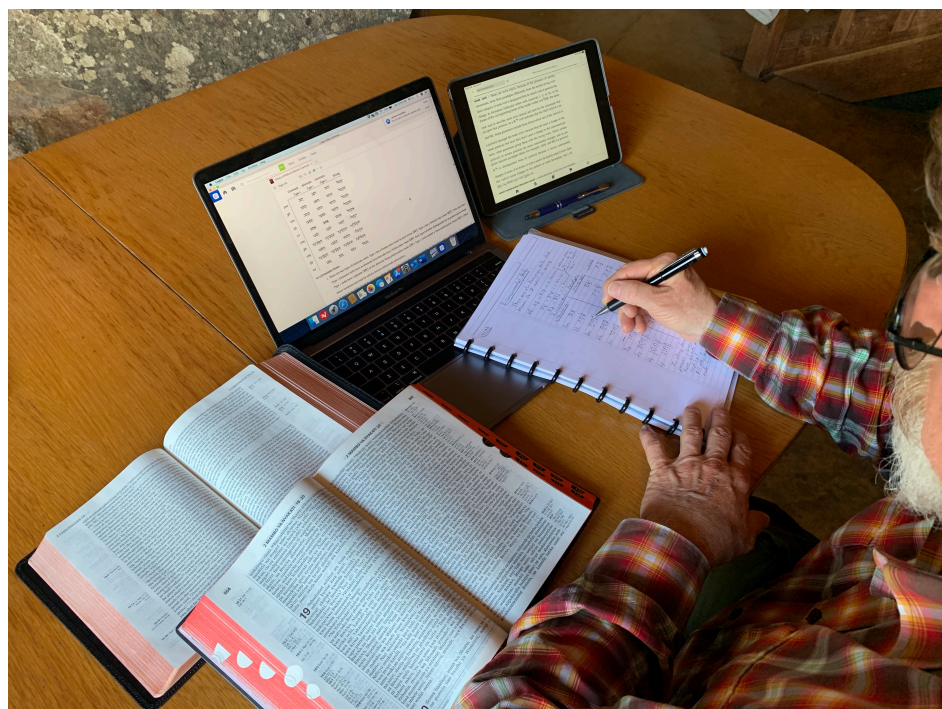
—Our health remains excellent as we continue to work on our Swahili language and other projects.

A while back, I read a story by our Regional Director, Shauen Trump, in which he mentioned these words from an East African laymen: “We don’t want ‘half-baked pastors.’”
