Pastor Abraham Thiong' of South Sudan



Pastor Abraham Thiong' Presents the Attendees with Catechisms

In South Sudan, a country not long ago torn by civil war, The Rev. Abraham Thiong' Nyang' serves as the only fully-trained Lutheran pastor in the South Sudan Evangelical Lutheran Church (SSELC). He was one of my students in the Bachelor of Theology Program at Neema Lutheran College, Matongo, Kenya.

For seven days in December, he conducted youth training in the Small Catechism, the Lutheran Confessions, and basic Christian Doctrine. This was done to equip these young people so that they might be strong in the Faith and be ready to share the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ with those they meet.

Over 35 young men attended this training along with several women. Conducted in two sessions, one before and one after Christmas, he was able to tell them about how Jesus has died so that they might be set free from the guilt and shame of sin. He explained how they have new birth of water and the Spirit by their baptism into Christ. He emphasised the free grace of God in Christ, which is so counter to the core teaching of the various African Traditional Religions, to which a third of the population still hold.

One of the great challenges in South Sudan is the influence of Islam. Sudan to the north is majority Muslim. South Sudan only became independent from its northern neighbour in 2011. And although Muslims comprise only 6% of the population, Islam's influence is felt in the entire East African region. Pastor Thiong' teaches the truth so the youth of the Church are not led astray by its lies.

PRAYER REQUESTS:

- For Abraham as he continues to faithfully teach the youth and others in the South Sudan Evangelical Lutheran Church.
- For his safety and the safety of all the faithful churches in our region, that all attempts to disrupt the peace would come to nothing.
- For wisdom and strength for Walter as he works alongside the Principal and other faculty to increase the quality of teaching at Matongo.
- For Robyn as she continues to support the students.
