Walter Meets with Church Leaders for Serious Discussions

Working toward unity in our teaching between Lutheran church bodies is an important aspect of mission work. This work is enhanced when various agencies in our Synod work together, each bringing their area of expertise to the talks.

This "spring" Walter joined members of LCMS Church Relations for significant discussions with the leadership of the Southeast of Lake Victoria Diocese of the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Tanzania. This is the same diocese with which he is working as we coordinate resources for the first confessional Lutheran seminary in Tanzania. It was good to gather with them again for these discussions.

During these meetings Walter was able to highlight cultural perspectives not readily discernible to those unfamiliar with the culture. Having worked closely with these faithful Tanzanian pastors for the past several years, he was also able to point out differences in practices that are necessary in their context. For the final two weeks of the "spring" semester, Walter taught 16 men their first installment of Biblical Greek.

Most of these men are school teachers who are also parish leaders in congregations without a pastor. They will be with us on campus three times a year for 2-week intensives, over a 4-year period, as they prepare to be ordained as pastors.

While full-time seminary studies are the best way to form pastors, this program will serve to meet the immediate need for trained pastors who can preach the Gospel faithfully.
