




STARTING STRONG



Educational We recently attended the Financial Supervisory Commission meeting, focusing on budget oversight to ensure highquality education for our students. During my meeting with **Superintendent Erik Swanson** and representatives from the University of Guam (UOG), we explored strategies to enhance student engagement, including plans for monthly town halls at every Guam **Department of Education (GDOE)** campus. These initiatives aim to foster a studentcentered approach to education policy.

I also had the opportunity to tour the facility alongside Vice Chair Senator Tina Muna Barnes. Our discussions centered on library services, infrastructure improvements, and future expansion plans. ENGAGEMENT & INSPIRATION: SCHOOL VISITS & EVENTS
















The 38th Guam Legislature
