


Our meeting with GDOE was focused on budget shortfalls and school-wide maintenance and repairs.

Our discussions centered on library services, infrastructure improvements, and future expansion.






Speaker Frank Blas, Jr., presents his initiatives for Guam's economy at the Guam's Chamber of Commerce General **Membership Meeting**

STRENGTHENING EDUCATIONAL PATHWAYS AT GUAM COMMUNITY COLLEGE







