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
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JULY 2025 HIGHLIGHTS OF THE MONTH

HONORING UOG'S 64TH STUDENT GOVERNMENT ASSOCIATION








SEPTEMBER 2025 HIGHLIGHTS OF THE MONTH






CHALAN-PAGO ORDOT MULTIPURPOSE EMERGENCY SHELTER RIBBON-CUTTING CEREMONY



CELEBRATING CONSTITUTION DAY WITH ADACAO ELEMENTARY SCHOOL


