Christ & Common Sense



Pastor Tim Dinkins



The English pastor, John Bunyan, spent many years in prison because of his commitment to preach the **gospel.** He is known for writing *The* Pilgrims Progress, but he should also be known for being a man of prayer. He wrote, õPrayer is a sincere, sensible, affectionate pouring out of the heart or soul to God, through Christ, in the strength and assistance of the Holy Spirit, for such things as God has promised, or according to his Word, for the good of the church, with submission in faith to the will of God.ö Pastor Bunyan understood the indispensable need for believers to pray.

In this article I want to show you five ways you can make sure you are protecting your

prayer life. The first protection comes from Ephesians 6:18 where Paul wrote, õPraying at all times with all prayer and petition in the Spirit.ö (Legacy Standard Bible) Along with putting on the belt of truth, the breastplate of righteousness, and the shoes of the gospel, believers are to always stay connected with God in prayer. This is easier said than done. The Christian life is full of distractions and responsibilities that often make it People often forget that prayer is mentioned in Paul's famous description of the armor of God in Ephesians chapter six. Prayer is not illustrated with a piece of armor or a weapon, but it is certainly emphasized as one of the most important ways for a Christian to withstand the attack of the enemy. This makes sense because prayer is communicating with God. How can a soldier know what the general wants him to do if he does not keep an open line of communication?



difficult to keep alert in prayer, but the believer must learn to create a habit of prayer. Philippians 4:6-7 says, õBe anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and petition with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all comprehension, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.ö

The second prayer protection is also found in Ephesians 6:18. Believers are to pray in the Spirit. This is important because it is easy for believers to be focused on themselves. The apostle Paul corrects against this by commanding Christians to communicate with God the way the Spirit wants them to. If you want to know how to do this, you can use the Lordøs Prayer in Matthew 6:9-13 as a guide. From the very first line, õOur Father who is in heaven,ö the prayer is focused on God the Father, not our own personal pains and pleasures. There is a time for bringing our own requests to God, but it

should be done in a spirit-filled way, not a flesh-filled way.

The third way to protect the supply line of prayer is to pray while fully alert. The apostle Paul wrote in Ephesians 6:18, õand to this end, being on the alert with all perseverance and petition for all the saints. Ö Anyone who has tried praying right before going to bed has learned how difficult it is to pray when you are tired. It is good to pray at all times, but it is good to pray with a watchful attitude. This means making sure that our minds are engaged. This means praying for specific concerns and praising God when he answers our prayers.

The fourth way to stay focused in prayer is to make sure that we are praying for other believers. Paul mentioned this when he said making õpetition for all the saints.ö Once again, it is important for believers to be focused on others in prayer. This does not mean we are to only pray for Christians (1 Timothy 2:1-2), but it is important to keep our prayers focused on those in our families and churches. This is a very practical way to guard against selfish prayer.

The fifth and last way to protect our prayer lives is to pray with boldness. This can be seen in the last two verses of this section (v. 19-20) which say, õas well as on my behalf, that words may be given to me in the opening of my mouth, to make known with boldness the mystery of the gospelô for which I am an ambassador in chainsô so that in *proclaiming* it I may speak boldly, as I ought to speak.ö It is always important to make note of repetition in Scripture. Paul was clearly emphasizing the need for him to be bold in sharing the gospel because he mentioned it twice in this passage. There is a natural tendency for believers to be timid in battle. The apostle Paul is commanding believers to pray that he will be bold in sharing the gospel. This prayer can also be applied to all believers. Any soldier of Christ needs to pray for boldness in sharing the gospel. We need to be bold in putting on the helmet of salvation and taking up the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God.

I appreciate how Paul included prayer in his description of the armor of God. Instead of being overlooked by believers, it needs to be thought of as a vital part of the arsenal of Godøs army. May all believers be motivated to keep the communication line always open with God so they will be able to stand firm against the enemy and his attacks.

The gods of Technology *In effect, AI is impacting ethnography of language.*

Every day we are hearing more discussions on Artificial Intelligence (AI). Since my fifty year career in technology, I have watched and participated in systems development, making humans subject to computer outcomes. I have had challenges with the numerous organizations dealing with false information residing in databases, both on myself and on clients. The attitude is "the computer is right" and you must prove otherwise. AI is making this even more challenging.

A recent Wall Street Journal article authored by Peggy Noonan entitled,öAI Is the Y2K Crisis, Only This Time Itø Realö summarizes it all. Ms. Noonan makes the point the great icon of the age, Appleø logo with the bite out of it, takes us back to Garden of Eden, a pivotal moment when Eve and Adam ate the forbidden fruit. The serpent (Satan) told Eve if they would eat the fruit they would become all-knowing like God, in fact equal to God. She went on to write that ö....those fueling and funding AI want, possible unconsciously, to be God, and on some level believe they are God.ö

I agree with her but God is not in just knowledge, he is spirit too. In order to be like God, technology must emulate the spiritual side of God by controlling human free-will, faith, and outcomes. The influences of AI are both good and evil which are still under the control of humans. The good side generates positive outcomes in medicine, science, and truth in content. The evil side is weaponized to create illusions, chaos and misinformation (images, pod casts, and news).

We must be able to discern good and evil more than ever before. AI technology can be a tool for creating spiritual (social) ills by mass indoctrination for a common mind set. The Bible refers to this as a õprincipality.ö So how does it work?

By weaponizing knowledge using the õtruth factorö, new meaning can be assign to basic facts. AI algorithms define what is true based on its database searches. If the searched data is biased or wrong, AI uses it anyway. A major element of war and conflict is to create misinformation. These dayø we see misinformation being applied all through our society, from environmental sciences to politics and from government to the news media. We are being encouraged to fact-check, but fact-checks are often times created by AI itself and õtruthö is still in question.

The use of AI in multiple languages also creates misinterpretations since words have different meaning based on how they are used. In effect, AI is impacting ethnography of language. We see this in Russia where Elvish (use by 23,000 Russians and based on õThe Hobbit and The Lord of the Rings) is becoming a new language that Vladimir Putin¢s council on interethinic relations considers a threat to Russia. Elvish has the phonology and grammar of Finnish, while Sindrin, or

Grey-eleven is influence by Welsh.

"While this is happening, Globalist, driven by the World Economic Forum, are working on a new Al generated global language. This languages will redefine truth on a global basis."

Creating õspiritual powerö is done through creating chaos and mistrust in the minds of humans. The foundation of the resulting spiritual power is social/mass chaos, hate and anger. We see this in several forms such as the hate against religious, ethnic, and social groups. When you combined this with a causes (such as environmental causes) it takes on a religious form separating it from human reasoning. This now plays into one¢ ability to have õfree-willöor lack of choice.



Free will is attacked through subliminal messaging contained in streamed content. While there are no studies or reports that I know of, my past work in steganography showed roughly 3% to 5% of posted streaming content contains subliminal messaging. This number increases to 27% with streamed content via digital services such as cable or internet TV streams. That number increases to nearly 30% for on-line social media posted from certain foreign demographics.

For those not familiar with subliminal messaging it is flashed content below the threshold of conscious perception. Meaning that a video frame containing images flashed for less the 1/30th of a second can produce results in the subconscience. This was first used in Coca Colaø advertising program in 1967. Subliminal messaging over the airwaves was later banned by the FCC. However, in the digital world of internet and cable TV, the FCCø ban does not apply.

Subliminal messaging can be found in nearly all forms of on-line streamed content (video, audio, and combination thereof) such as children cartoon shows, pod casts, streamed movies and more. It is a matter of õflashingö images (like a product, nudity, political scenes, war scenes, and religious scenes) within videos that are captured by our subsconscience mind. This effects individual õfree willö while also effecting social mind set on a larger scale.


In a setting, where society is being controlled by weaponized technology tools used by those in charge, Godly faith and discernment become extremely important in stabilizing us as individuals. This is critical as pointed out by Tucker Carlson in a recent interview saying, ö....we are no longer in a political battle but are in a battle between good and evil.ö Technology gods are AI tools in the hands of elite evil men. Klaus Schwab of the World Economic Forum is now claiming that AI should replace the process of democratic voting for government elections.

We need to remember, AI needs to be fed from the mind of humans to create a social/religious god syndrome. These are spiritual power, the power to control outcomes, healing power. attacks against manø free will, and attacks against Biblical God of Abraham, our moral compass, and our religious freedom.

We need to rethink where we stand relative to the new godø of technology. Not everyone will agree on the spiritual aspect presented here but the total control over individuals is taking place on all levels. Many citizen are looking at alternative economies, currencies, and support groups to bypass potential negative effects of digital currency, credit scoring, and more. This is not just a move against western society.

How long have you been working at the salon?

We have been at the Medeiros salon for about 25 years. Early on I was the janitor alongside my brother. It has been about 17 years that he has been cutting hair as a licensed cosmetologist.

Is there a verse from the Bible that inspires you in your daily work?

A foundational verse has been "The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom." (Proverbs 10:9-10 says) It is this idea that everything I bring to the table will fall apart as soon as I lose the fear of the Lord. As soon as I become self-sufficient and I don't depend on him then these other things will go away... So that has been a driving force for my work and my family and my ministry.

As you think about your sphere of influence do you think about your work as a way to make disciples?

Absolutely! In the original Greek the phrase "Panta ta Ethne" means "all the nations." The word "ethne" is where we get the word nations. This really opened up my mind to see that the Great Commission is more than borders. It is societal groups. Once I started going to jail ministry and other ministries, I realize that "Panta ta Ethne" is here, within Hanford. Accomplishing the Great Commission includes reaching people here with the gospel.

Are you able to share your faith with your clients?

Yes, that is one of my favorite parts of my job. Making disciples takes time, like it did with Jesus. He took three years. This really made me think of my clients as this ongoing ministry, not just drop-in ministry.

What is one way you have seen God use your business to bless other people?

The funniest example is from two weeks ago. This guy I have been discipling for a longtime tells me that I am his Christian confidant. He said, "You are my spiritual guru." I said, "we call that a pastor." He said, "I don't have anyone else that I talk to about my faith except you." That is an honor and kind of shocking and scary at the same time...I think if churches are serious about reaching the lost, there has to be a focus on marketplace ministry. I almost think the churches need a program where they are training barbers and hair stylists, dentists... The ones that sit next to their clients and talk to them for a long time.

There are a lot of Christians in Kings County who think about leaving. What is a reason you would tell them to stay?

I could write a book on this one! Ever since Covid this has been a big topic of people wanting to get out... but my dad set a standard of wanting to be committed to this place. As an immigrant, he really latched on here and felt like we have an opportunity here. This place has blessed our family. He grew up on dirt floors, almost homeless, extremely poor and to be where he is at now. He loves this place. And he actually means it. This place is a blessing. You need to give back to it because it is a place you have enjoyed ... Kings county is the Lord's. He is the King of Kings County, like we've said since we were kids and this is where we put the flag. This is where we live and die, unless the burning bush tells us otherwise.

Alivya, an accomplished, thrower and jumper, had never competed in the dreaded 400m sprint. One lap around the track might look simple from the stands, but it is among the most challenging events in track and field. Alivya didn't know what she was getting into and soon found out it was a miserable race that tested her body and mind to the limits. She slowly dreaded each race, but she was a team player and continued to compete. Alivya struggled with back issues throughout the season and could have used that as an excuse to skip the 400m, but she said, "I saw it as weak, so I never took that escape." Dread turned into anxiety, and the pressure to succeed was heavy. Alivya said, "I felt weak and like a failure; I was upset with myself for not being able to push through and endure."

Alivya admitted to limiting God in her track life because she didn't want to "bother" him with a problem she thought she could handle on her own. Trying to do it on her own led to tears and anxiety before each race. After seeking prayer and wise counsel from her parents, Alivya had a breakthrough. Lining up on the blocks in tears, she said, "I put aside my pride and asked God to run that race for me." The gun went off, and 100 meters in, She said out loud, "Jesus, Help me. I give this to you, be with me". In that race, Alivya said she felt closest to God; to this day, it "is the best experience" she has ever had. "I had His joy. I finally realized that if He was with me, then nothing could stand against me."

Alivya learned a lesson that day that will carry her through every situation: "Trust in Him and let go." Her story of God meeting her in her sport is why FCA exists.? The FCA strategy is to engage, equip, and empower coaches and athletes to use their experiences to impact others and connect with the local church to grow their relationship with Jesus Christ.

Every year, the prayer breakfast committee chooses one family to share their testimony at the prayer breakfast. This year they invited Mark Lundberg from Lundberg Family Farms in Richvale, a small farming community in the Sacramento valley.

Mark came to the prayer breakfast with his wife and a large selection of the ever growing Lundberg clan. Mark gave a compelling testimony to how God had brought their family through the difficulties of starting a rice farm back in 1937, when Albert and Frances Lundberg left the dustbowl in Nebraska with "four sons, a tractor, and a flatbed Chevy truck." Mark shared some generational advice when he said that "Everyone should have two books by their bed: the Bible and a joke book." His sense of humor certainly showed during his time on the stage.

Everyone present was able to learn more about the Lundberg family by

watching a short documentary that showed the different equipment and techniques the family has used to farm organic rice since the 1960s. One of the guiding principles of their farms has been to "leave it better than we found it." Regan Lundberg quoted from Psalm 19, "The heavens declare the glory of God and the sky above proclaims his handiwork." He described his love of farming as a connection between "God, science, and art." His love for his job was clearly visible as the video showed him passing on important skills and values to the next generation. Once the featured family was done, Dr. Tommy Henderson came on stage. Dr. Henderson is a professor of Agriculture at Chico State university. He shared how he grew up on a citrus



farm in Dinuba. After attending Reedly college, he transferred to Cal Poly San Luis Obispo. He taught at Dinuba High School for eight years before moving to Oregon. Most recently he has been teaching Ag Mechanics at Chico State. He is married to Christine and they have two daughters.

Dr. Tommy's concern for the next generation was clearly seen in his message. He shared of his desire to be the hands and feet of Christ to those around him. He quoted from 1 Peter 5:3, which says, "being examples to the flock." He also mentioned how important it is to see children as a gift, "Behold, children are a heritage from the LORD, the fruit of the womb a reward. Like arrows in the hand of a warrior are the children of one's youth. Blessed is the man who fills his quiver with them! He shall not be put to shame when he speaks with his enemies in the gate."

(Psalm 127:3-5 English Standard Version) His parting encouragement was for those at the prayer breakfast to seek to use their influence to bring a positive change in the youth.

DEAR NOELLE by Noelle B. Nightingale Biblical Counsel for Christian Women

Dear Noelle,

My husband and I just had our first baby. We are happy to have a child, but every day is so mundane. I used to work a full-time job, but we have decided it's best if I stay home to take care of the baby. Now it feels like I get nothing done, and I feel useless. I want to take care of the baby, but I also feel this pull back to work where I can feel more useful. What should I do?

Dear Mom,

Congratulations on your first baby! The Bible says, "Behold, children are a heritage from the LORD, the fruit of the womb a reward." (Psalm 127:3) You have been given one of the most wonderful gifts that can be experienced in life, and I hope you will be able to see your baby the same way God does!

I completely understand the difficulty of transitioning from a full-time working woman to a full-time mom. This is a huge change in your life, and the world makes it super hard to make this transition. If anything, the worldly influences in our lives want to discourage women from having children at all and want to keep moms away from their children and busy in the workplace. So we need to go to God's word to know how He wants us to think about motherhood. Having God's perspective about this incredibly high calling of being a mom can completely change the way that we think about the mundane tasks of changing diapers and cleaning up messes. If we know that we have a divine calling in being a mom, the pull to return to the workplace is considerably lessened.

Now before we talk about what you should do, it's important to talk about how to think. God wants us to think what is right (Phil. 4:8), not being conformed to this world but being transformed by the renewing of our minds (Rom. 12:2). Children are not a nuisance, but a blessing (Ps. 127:3). We need to retrain our thoughts to think about our children in this way. Whenever you are tempted to complain about your baby, turn that thought around and give thanks out loud to the Lord for how He has blessed you with this baby.

Thinking biblically about children is an important first step because the Bible's instructions to young moms are extremely counter-cultural. The world says that young moms should go back to work, but Titus 2:4-5 tells "young women to love their husbands and children, to be self-controlled, pure, <u>working at home</u>, kind, and submissive to their own husbands, that the word of God may not be reviled." In other words, God wants young moms to make their service to their husbands and children the most important thing in their day. And by loving your husband and baby and by working in the home, the amazing thing is that you are loving God and serving Him. This is an incredibly high calling that God gives to you as a young mom. So don't think about checking boxes off in your day, but instead think about how God is pleased with you as you do those messy tasks. He sees your efforts and gives value to your day.

Arriving at KCS in the fifth grade, Ronnie quickly distinguished himself as a dedicated and talented athlete, capturing the attention of both his peers and faculty, including the principal and his future basketball coach, Kevin Dalafu.

"Ronnie was the kid who would hustle out to recess to grab the basketball and start shooting baskets before anyone else finished their snack. He always had a love for the game," recalls Coach Dalafu, reflecting on Ronnie's early days at KCS.

Throughout his junior high and high school years, Ronnie's focus on basketball yielded unprecedented success. He set numerous school records, including points in a season—a record he broke twice in his junior (800 points) and senior years (866 points). He also set a new school record for points in a career with 2,467.

Beyond the court, Ronnie's commitment to his faith and community has been exemplary. As a member of the KCS Student Leadership Team, Ronnie has consistently served his peers embodying the KCS values of S.H.I.E.L.D.: Service, Honor, Integrity, Excellence, Learner, and Disciple.

Ronnie's leadership contributions have been instrumental in fostering a winning culture at KCS. The Kings Christian School Crusaders boys basketball team just capped off its record-setting season completing a school record of 27 wins in 30 games which included a 19-game winning streak. The Crusaders ended their season as back-to-back league championships respectably. If you include the end of last season, since January of 2023, the boy's team has won 40 out of 45 games. Quite a massive achievement for a high school of less than 70 students!??






