
Drug Checking in Fraser Health

December 2024



Key Findings

- In December, 298 drug checks were performed across the Fraser Health region (16 access points).
- The percentage of all opioids testing positive for benzodiazepines by FTIR and/or test strip increased from the previous month to 56.4% (119 of 211 samples).
- Benzodiazepines were detected by FTIR in 23.7% of unregulated opioids (49 of 207 samples), indicating their presence in higher concentrations. Of these, desalkylgidazepam was most frequently identified (23 samples), surpassing bromazolam for the second month in a row.
- Fentanyl was detected by FTIR in 40.6% of unregulated opioids (84 of 207 samples). Ortho-methylfentanyl was detected in 25.1% (52 samples), surpassing fluorofentanyl for the second month in a row (10.6%; 22 samples).
- Veterinary tranquilizers were detected by FTIR in 7.3% of unregulated opioids. Medetomidine was detected in 3.9% (8 samples), and xylazine in 3.4% (7 samples).








Components in unregulated opioids




Frequency (N=207)

*During the month of December, **56.4%** of expected opioid samples tested positive for benzodiazepines using test strips in our partner site in Fraser Health (**119 samples of 211 checked**). Opioid samples are checked for benzodiazepine-positivity using BTNX test strips and the FTIR spectrometer. The results presented here are derived from both of these technologies and are presumptive until confirmed by a laboratory.

December 12, 2024 Fraser Health region	Down/Fentanyl (Multiple samples)	See alert description*	N/A	N/A	Multiple samples in different colors and textures, containing several fentanyl analogs (including carfentanil), benzodiazepines, veterinary tranquilizers (tranq), and nitazenes (a group of potent opioids), were tested throughout the Fraser Health region. Combining multiple depressants can lead to complex overdoses.

*Results provided by complementary testing partner <u>Substance</u> using Paper Spray Mass Spectrometry, all other spectrometry results are determined by FTIR.

Health authorities and community organizations issue further toxic drug alerts from sources other than drug checking.

Data represented in this report is collected from our partner sites across the province utilizing Fourier Transform Infrared (FTIR) spectrometry in combination with BTNX fentanyl test strips, as well as benzodiazepine test strips when applicable. We note the FTIR spectrometer has a detection limit of approximately 5% concentration (McCrae, 2019).
