

Thank you so very much for the generous gift given recently towards bringing the Truth of Jesus into the heart of rural Bangladesh. Your prayers of support that accompany these funds are deeply appreciated too. Jackie will be in Bangladesh in February to bring your love and greetings in person.

We'll take this opportunity also to share the next step in the journey the Lord has us on. Within 7 months of moving to Jay's home area, very sadly his brother Arlen passed. We very much appreciated your thoughtful support at that time. Most of us know the legalities involved in such a scenario when land and property are involved. What a blessing to be here as we process this all together as a family. The plan, at the moment, is that we will move into the farmhouse sometime in the spring of '25.

Meanwhile, in terms of ministry, our loving Father has called us to an interesting role in the World Mission Prayer League. The mission you're now already aware of, pray for and support. We've been accepted as Associate (not full-time) Workers to support our fellow workers overseas with 1:1 visits when needed. Working overseas in different cultures has many challenges. Rather than wait until they become critical, and people have to return home, we are available to spend short amounts of time to provide counsel, prayer and support. Our first assignment is to spend January, May and September next year with a family serving in the Middle East. Alongside this, when in the US - which we expect to be most of the time - we will represent WMPL at churches and other events. Jay continues with pulpit supply on request. Jackie continues with her Kingdom Business, Motif.

As this season of Good Will continues to unfold, our hearts are full of gratitude. Thankful to be one with you, we keep the fellowship of St John Lutheran Church in our prayers for the journey of growth you're on as our Father prepares you for your next pastor, and the next pastor for you.


