



VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL – SAVE THE DATE!




Come join us for an ultimate Alaskan adventure where the northern lights shine over majestic mountains, racing rivers, and sparkling glaciers. You will trek the tundra and



The NALC currently has 67 congregations actively seeking to call a pastor. There are 39 openings for full-time ministry and 28 congregations in need of a part-time pastor.

The period without a pastor can be one of the most challenging seasons in the life of any church. Additionally, we are not the same congregation we were last year, or ten years ago. Times have changed, things have changed, we have changed since last calling a pastor. What do those changes mean for the calling of a new one? What is different now? Changing demographics, aging populations, members leaving and new members joining, all these factors play a big role in our mission, ministry, service, and witness for the community of faith we have here at St. John.

It's crucial to remember that change is an inevitable and enriching part of every congregation's life, and that stagnation can weaken the message and harden hearts. Are we evolving with the changing times or are we stagnant?

As we continue our path to call our next pastor, let's take some time to reflect on the challenges we face as a changing congregation and refresh ourselves in these words from scripture about our life in the Spirit: Romans 8:26-28. We are so called according to God's purpose. The times may be changing, but we are standing on the solid promise of God's word.

Romans 8:26-28 NIV

- (1) 2-inch eraser;
- (5) ball point pens;
- (5) unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers;
- (1) box 16-24 crayons.
- (4) 70-count spiral notebooks
 Please bring these items to the church as soon as possible.

Personal Care Kits -

Items needed for each kit:

- (1) light to medium-weight bath-size towel (dark color);
- (2) bath-size bars of soap(in original wrapping);
- adult-size tooth brush (in original wrapping);
- (1) sturdy comb (removed from packaging);
- (1) metal nail clippers

Baby Care Kits –

Items needed for each kit:

- (2) lightweight cotton T-shirts;
- (2) long-sleeved or short-sleeved gowns or sleepers (without feet);
- (1) jacket, sweater or sweatshirt with hood (or include a baby cap);
- (2) receiving blankets (cotton, flannel, crocheted, or knitted 52" square);
- (1) dark hand towel;
- (2) bath-size bars of soap (in original wrapping);
- (4) flat-fold diapers;
