#### From Josh Frerichs ...

Dear Church Family,

I wanted to take a moment to share a message of encouragement from Romans 8:28: "And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose."

The meaning of this verse from the Book of Romans seems simple at first glance. But when we break it down, we begin to see the complexity of it.

Let's be clear about something... Some things simply are not good. In fact, they're bad. Things like war, famine, the unexpected death of a loved one, and many other hardships and tragedies. There's just nothing redeeming about them. Right?

Well, actually there is something redeeming in all of these things... the Lord Jesus Christ! He's the Redeemer and because of Him, God promises those of us who believe in Jesus that all things, even bad ones, work together for our good.

This verse offers us a powerful assurance: God is always at work, weaving together every detail of our lives for good. This doesn't mean every moment will feel good or that we'll be spared from hardship. But it does mean that nothing is wasted in God's hands. He takes our struggles, disappointments, and even our mistakes, and works them into His greater plan for our lives.

When we face trials, it can be hard to see how God could possibly bring good from them. Yet, when we look back, many of us can point to times when a painful season led to unexpected blessings, growth, or a deeper faith. God specializes in redemption turning what the enemy meant for harm into something purposeful and beautiful. "For I know the plans I have for you," declares the Lord, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future." – Jeremiah 29:11

Can you recall a time when God brought something good out of a difficult situation in your life? How might God be at work in your current circumstances, even if you can't see it yet? What would it look like to surrender your challenges fully to Him today?

There will always be highs and lows in life. But through each hill and valley, we have an opportunity to grow our faith and to see how God works all things together for our good. Even when we don't

#### **MISSION TRIP 2025**

During the week of July 20–26, four St. John members—Allison Ochs, Theo Smith, James Ketchum, and Laura Ketchum—joined members of Prince of Peace Lutheran Church and others from the community on a mission trip to Pewaukee, WI for a week of service, fellowship, and worship.

Upon arrival on Sunday, we settled into the Asa

Clark Middle School, which became our home for the week. There we shared meals, slept in classrooms, and gathered daily for spirit-filled, high-energy worship each morning and evening.

Each participant was placed into a six-person crew and assigned a service project to assist community members in need. These projects varied but often included painting, building steps, ramps, or decks, and completing general home repairs. Every afternoon, crews also paused for a devotional time together, grounding our work in scripture and prayer.

The theme for the week was **EQUIP**, focusing on the story of Saul and how God prepares us to serve Him. Each participant received a devotional handbook to guide our study. Our theme verse was 2 *Corinthians 9:8:* 

"And God is able to bless you abundantly, so that in all things at all times, having all that you need, you will abound in every good work." The EQUIP theme invited us to reflect on five steps of faith:

- **E** = **Evaluate** Gain clarity about our situation.
- **Q** = **Question** Be brave enough to ask for help when we don't have all the answers.
- **U** = **Understand** Absorb what we can, and trust Jesus with what we cannot.
- **I** = **Improve** Strengthen our spiritual "toolbox" with prayer, scripture, and faith practices.
- **P = Proclaim** Give thanks to God and share what He has done.

We are deeply grateful to all members of St. John for your financial support and, most importantly, for your prayers. Because of your generosity, we were able to participate in this meaningful week of service and spiritual growth. Please, be sure to ask the travelers about their experience.
