



FROM JOSH –

“Dear children, let us not love with words or speech but with actions and in truth.” - 1 John 3:18

We've all heard the saying, "talk is cheap." It reminds us how easy it is to speak good intentions and how difficult it can be to live them out. This is true in our faith as well. We promise faithfulness, forgiveness, and care for others, yet often fall short when love requires sacrifice or inconvenience.

In the last half of 1 John chapter 3, we see the difference between love and hate. John urges believers to recall the message we have heard from the beginning of time, "to love one another" (1 John: 3:11). He then points us to the true measure of love, not our effort, but Christ's. "**By this we know love, that He laid down His life for us**" (1 John 3:16). Before John ever calls us to action, he directs our eyes to the cross.

Numerous times Scripture shares that a mark of a true believer is the spiritual fruit that is produced in their lives. John is calling attention to the fact that as Christ's followers, we cannot simply say we love people; how we live our lives will be a walking testimony of God's love. Those who are born again don't live by the "do as I say, not as I do" mantra; instead, they invite others to "imitate me as I imitate Christ" (1 Corinthians 11:1).

There are moments when words alone are appropriate. When prayer, encouragement, or presence is enough. But often, love calls for more. A meal prepared, a gift given, time sacrificed, or simply sitting quietly with someone who is hurting. In a world that glorifies busyness, choosing to be present can itself be an act of profound love.

God did not merely declare His love for the world; He gave His only Son (John 3:16). That gift stands at the center of our faith. As we receive again Christ's mercy and forgiveness, we are freed, not burdened, to love our neighbor in tangible ways.
