Items needed for each kit:

- (1) 30-centimeter or 12-inch ruler;
- (1) pencil sharpener;
- (1) pair blunt scissors;
- (1) 2-inch eraser;
- (5) ball point pens;
- (5) unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers;
- (1) box 16-24 crayons.
- (4) 70-count spiral notebooks
- Please bring these items to the church as soon as possible.

Personal Care Kits –

Items needed for each kit:

- (1) light to medium-weight bath-size towel (dark color);
- (2) bath-size bars of soap (in original wrapping);
- (1) adult-size tooth brush (in original wrapping);
- sturdy comb
 (removed from packaging);
- metal nail clippers (removed from packaging).

Please donate any of these items and bring them to the church by the end of September
Items can be put in the wooden church by the elevator.

Baby Care Kits -

Items needed for each kit:

- (2) lightweight cotton T-shirts;
- (2) long-sleeved or short-sleeved gowns or sleepers (without feet);
- (1) jacket, sweater or sweatshirt with hood (or include a baby cap);
- (2) receiving blankets (cotton, flannel, crocheted, or knitted 52" square);
- (1) dark hand towel;
- (2) bath-size bars of soap (in original wrapping);
- (4) flat-fold diapers;
- (2) diaper pins;
- (2) pair socks.

Sewing Kits –

Items needed for each kit:

- (2) pieces of cotton or cotton blend fabrics (either 2^{1/4} yards of 60-inch wide or 3 yards of 44-45-inch wide or 4 yards of 36-inch wide);

What a calling to hope, peace, eternal life! In these verses, all of us are called children of God. Clearly, this is on account of God's power and wisdom, not our own.

This powerful call is the one that comes to all believers through God's Word in Holy Baptism. That is why Martin Luther was bold to insist that "the ministry of the Word belongs to all." And again, "There is no other Word of God than that which is given all Christians to proclaim." (from Luther's Concerning the Ministry, 1523) Just as all Christians share the promise, so too do we share the task of proclaiming the good news. Most of us take up the task in the ministry of daily life. Others, we ask to do so publicly for the community so faith can be created and sustained in us. So, we see that in the economy of God's grace the ministry of those called and ordained follows from the call which has come to all who believe.

How do we sense God's call most clearly? In which aspect of life do we find God's Word, the promise, the hope, the peace being "proclaimed" in the strongest way? The Bible even speaks of us as "holy partners in a heavenly calling." (Hebrews 3;1) What do you think that might mean for daily living?


