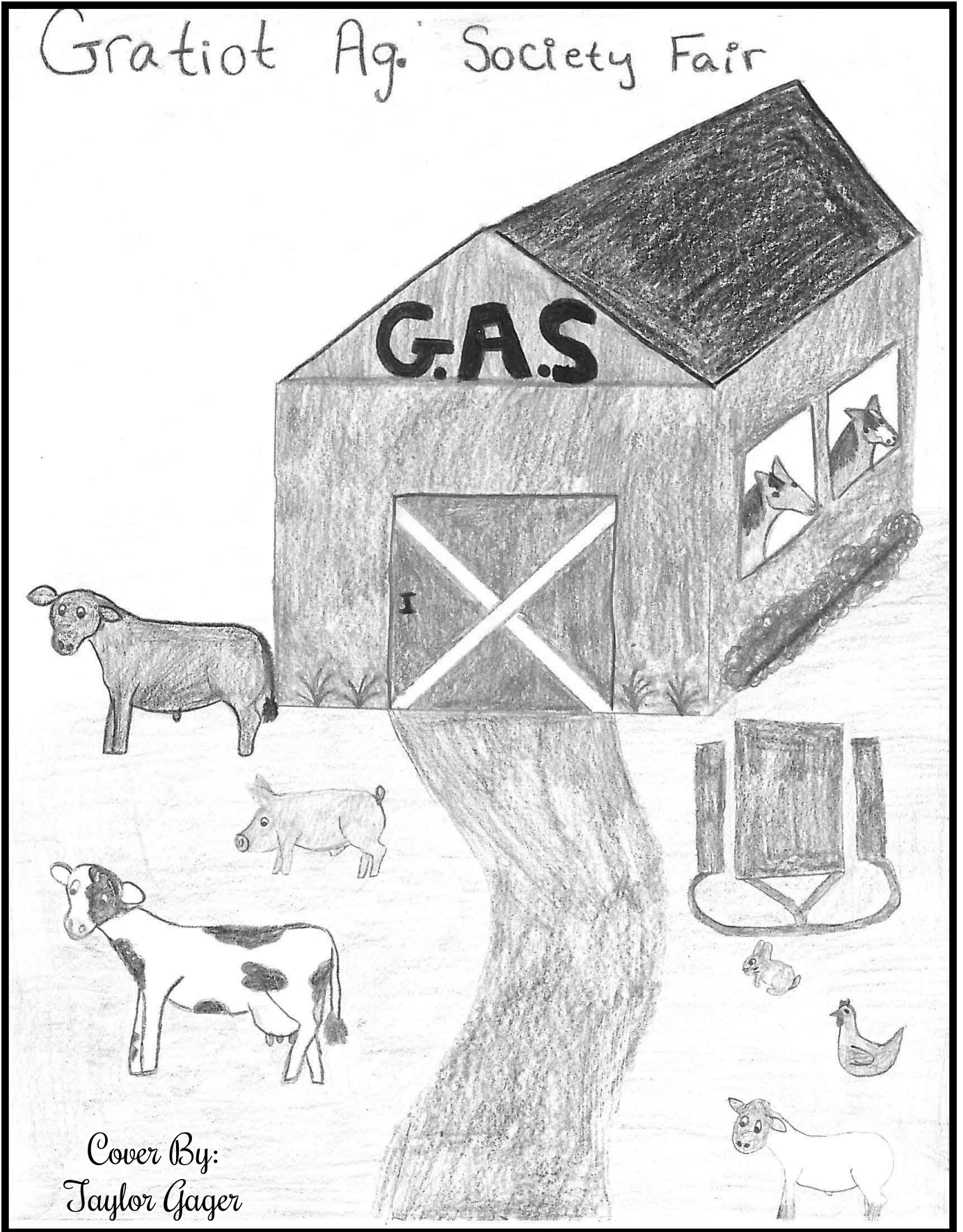

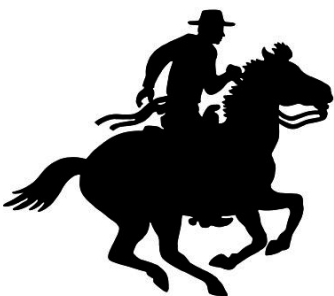

## Superintendents' Rules

1. Reserve and assign stalls for all livestock.
2. Be responsible for set-up and clean-up in your department.
3. Do not allow any animals into your building until you have checked it for any health problems and you have any health papers required.
4. Try and resolve any disagreements within your department, if unresolved report incidents to the Fair board.
5. Work with the Fair board each year to review and make project changes.
6. Report to the Fair board at their request.
7. The superintendent is expected to check their building and make any needs known one week prior to the fair.
8. The superintendent must return the judging sheet and folder to the fair office.
9. Superintendent cannot create new classes without consulting the Fair board.
10. A back-up person must be available whenever the superintendent is not, this rule does not pertain to exhibit building superintendents.
11. Strictly enforce the rule: NO SMOKING ALLOWED IN THE BARNES OR DISPLAY AREA.
12. Assign chore duty and always keep the barn neat for the public.
13. Please remind your exhibitors of the times for the trophy pictures.
14. NO DRINKING ON THE FAIRGROUNDS.
15. SUPERINTENDENTS ARE NOT ALLOWED TO GIVE THEIR OPINIONS TO THE JUDGES DURING OR BEFORE THE JUDGING. YOU ARE ONLY THERE TO ENTER JUDGEMENTS INTO THE JUDGE'S BOOKS.

## General Rules for Non-Livestock Exhibitor Entries

1. Print name, address, Social Security Number, and phone number clearly on entry form. Social Security Number is required for fair entries.
2. All entry forms are due to the fair office by June 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2019.
3. All exhibits are to be checked in on Wednesday June 19<sup>th</sup>, 2019 from 4-6PM.
4. All exhibits will be released on Sunday June 23<sup>rd</sup> 2019 from 7-9PM.
5. All exhibits will be judged on Wednesday June 19<sup>th</sup>, 2019 @ 6:30PM until done.
6. Entries of the previous year are not acceptable.
7. Entry fees must be paid before you can enter the fair.
8. Exhibitors are to demonstrate good sportsmanship. The superintendent and/or Fair board reserves the right to refuse entry or request removal from the fair if anyone behaves in an unsportsmanlike manner. Premium money will be forfeited.
9. Youth exhibitors must put their age on tags and entries.
10. Premium checks will be mailed within 30 days of the closing of the fair.
11. Exhibits which have not been claimed by the close of fair release time will be considered abandoned and will be disposed of as management sees fit. Premiums will not be paid on unclaimed items.
12. **Ages will be determined as of January 1<sup>st</sup>, 2019.**

# General Rules for Livestock Exhibitor Entries

Horses, Cattle, Goats, and Sheep will be required to pay a \$2.00 per head stalling fee.

Chickens and Rabbits are required to pay a \$1.00 cage fee.

1. Print name, address, Social Security Number, and phone number clearly on entry form. Social Security Number is required for fair entries.
2. All entries are due to the fair office by June 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2019.
3. All livestock will be checked in on Wednesday June 19<sup>th</sup>, 2019 from 3-8 PM.
4. Livestock will be released Sunday June 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2019 after the scramble sale. Scramble animals will be released no later than Monday June 24<sup>th</sup>, 2019 at 9AM.
5. All exhibits must belong to the exhibitor or his/her immediate family (immediate family is grandparent, parent, or sibling).
6. The exhibitor must be present during the judging to handle their own animal. If needed, see the department rules. Exception is if the exhibitor is exhibiting in another area of the fairground at the time of judging. An unexcused absence will result in the exhibit not being judged, and no premium given.
7. Exhibitors are to demonstrate good sportsmanship. The superintendent and/or Fair board reserves the right to refuse entry or request removal from the fair if anyone behaves in an unsportsmanlike manner. Premium money will be forfeited.
8. The exhibitor is responsible for the proper care of his/her own animal. The exhibitor must furnish their own water and feed dishes and keep pens clean. Upon departure of the fair, the exhibitor must clean the stalls or premiums will be forfeited, this includes all livestock.
9. The fair does not provide bedding for your animals. If animals are not cared for you will forfeit your premiums. **Please use wood shavings for bedding compared to straw for ease of using a manure spreader.**
10. Premiums will be awarded according to the judge's sheet, not according to the ribbon on your exhibit. Youth can enter open classes of all livestock departments. Premium checks will be mailed within 30 days of the closing of the fair.
11. **NO ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES ARE ALLOWED ON THE FAIRGROUND.**
12. G.A.S. will not be responsible for any properties or exhibit not called for by the release time. G.A.S. is not responsible for accidental losses.
13. **Ages determined as of January 1<sup>st</sup>, 2019.**
14. **Peewee showmen (under 6 years of age) must be prearranged with respective superintendents.**

5. Horses will be stalled under the direction of the superintendents.
6. No double riding or racing.
7. No one under age 18 may show a stallion.
8. You must send an entry form with the classes you wish to enter.
9. Classes of less than 4 will be combined at the superintendents discretion.
10. All horses must have a 2019 negative Coggins test on file with the superintendent before horses are unloaded from the trailer.
11. All stalls must be cleaned daily and inspected before release on June 23<sup>rd</sup> or premiums will be forfeited.
12. No horses may leave until release time or premiums will be forfeited.
13. Highpoint Divisions: 16 & Over; 13-15; 12 & Under; Novice Walk/Trot; PeeWee 10 & Under.
14. Novice Walk/Trot classes are for Novice Riders and/or Novice Horses.
15. Those entering Novice and PeeWee walk/trot classes may only compete in Walk/Trot Classes.
16. No horses will be allowed loose in the arena. Must be exercised by lunging or riding.
17. Show attire is optional.
18. Horses must be fed and always have water. Horses with no water will be watered by the superintendent and premiums will be forfeited.
19. Sick, lame, or malnourished horses will be sent home.
20. Refer to all general livestock rules.

### Rules:

1. Exhibitors must show their own animals unless special permission is granted.
2. Grooming Regulations: use of false tail heads/hemp/hair is prohibited. Coloring agents, **except powders**, may be used on the legs and tail switch. No coloring agents may be used above the flank. This includes colored show foams. Forced administration of fluids to create gut fill is not allowed.
3. All registered cattle must have registration, transfer papers, or application for respective breed.
4. Animals must be in control by exhibitor at all times.
5. Cattle infected with communicable disease may not be brought to the fair.
6. All bulls over 6 months must have a nose ring.
7. Classes of cattle will be based on date of birth.
8. Dual registered animals must declare a breed for the show.
9. Cattle must have RFID tags.

The cost will be \$0.50 per bird for youth and \$1.00 per bird for open exhibitors. Refer to the general livestock rules for the current requirements.
2. All exhibits must be free of infectious diseases. Any birds showing signs of illness will be removed.
3. Birds may not be caged until checked in by the superintendent or other Fair official before being penned.
4. Birds should be 4 ½ months old except for in meat classes.
5. All birds must remain on display for the duration of the fair. Removing birds early will result in the loss of premiums unless prior permission was given.
6. The Superintendent reserved the right to limit or turn away entries, if required due to space limitations and caging. Pre-enter as soon as possible.
7. Youth may enter both youth and open classes however the same bird may not compete in both divisions.
8. All classes will be judged using the APA Standard of Perfection as a guide and reference.
9. Only the owners and show staff are allowed to handle the birds, anyone caught handling someone else's birds without permission will be asked to remove their birds from the poultry barn and will forfeit premiums.
10. G.A.S. is not responsible for any damages or losses, every precaution will be taken to prevent problems.
11. Judges and superintendent decisions are final.

### Rules:

1. Specify the number of pens desired, number of rabbits, and include the sex and breed on the entry form.
2. All stock must be permanently tattooed in the left ear and be legible. Judge will enforce the ear tattoo rule.
3. Fancy rabbits must have a pedigree.
4. All rabbits must be inspected by the superintendent or other Fair official before being penned.
5. Sick rabbits (runny noses, ear mites, sniffles, etc.) will not be allowed to enter. If a rabbit gets sick it will be sent home as to not contaminate other animals, premium will be lost.
6. Meat pens must be 3 rabbits between 3 ½ and 5 lbs., not over 70 days old, uniform size, breed, variety, and color. Meat pen rabbits may not be shown in breed competition.
7. Single Fryer (3 ½ to 5 lbs.) or Single Broiler (5lbs and up) consists of 1 rabbit not over 70 days of age.
8. Meat rabbits are judged on meat type only.
9. Rabbits must be entered in breed class to be entered in fur class.
10. No substitution will be allowed except in the same class and sex. THIS CHANGE MUST BE MADE BEFORE THE FOLDER GOES TO THE JUDGING TABLE.
11. No breeding of stock in the showroom.
12. Each exhibitor will be responsible for keeping their cages and rabbits fed and watered.
13. Only rabbits staying for the week may be sold in the small animal auction.
14. Exhibitors must show in showmanship to be eligible to sell in the auction.
15. Once an animal is put in the small animal auction it belongs to the fair. If the buyer does not want the animal after the sale, anyone may purchase it from the fair board.
16. Refer to general livestock rules.

### Definition – 4-class and 6-class:

Any breed having an ideal, senior weight of 9 lbs. or under is classified as a 4-class. This is specified on pg. 30 of the 1991-1995 Standard of Perfection.

Any breed having a minimum ideal, senior weight of 9 lbs. or over is classified as a 6-class.

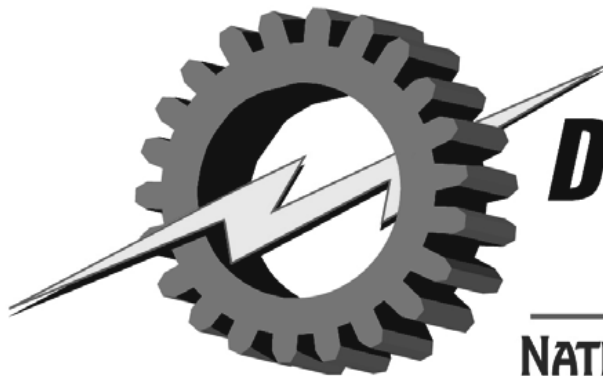


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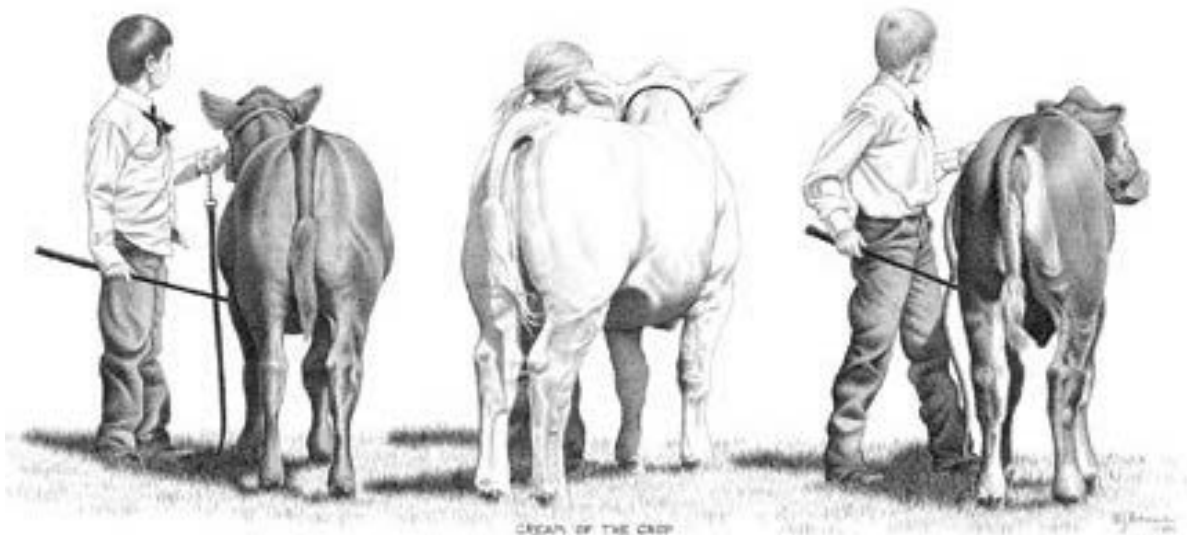
