# Minister's Message:

June has arrived, and with it the **Centennial of the formation of the United Church of Canada.** For 100 years United Churches across Canada have lived out the faith we articulate in A New Creed: celebrating God's presence, living with respect in creation, loving and serving others, seeking justice and resisting evil.

Lethbridge United Churches will celebrate our **100 years** on Sunday, **June 1st at 7:00pm at McKillop United Church**. I hope to see many of you there for what is sure to be a very meaningful occasion.

On **June 8** another big celebration follows: **Pentecost Sunday**, the third holiest day in the Christian calendar. We will welcome several people as full members of the Southminster congregation as they sign their name to the Historic Roll. On this special Sunday, we will also celebrate the **sacrament of baptism!** And of course, with Pentecost comes our Food Truck Picnic in our North parking lot after

worship. **The Food Truck Sunday** is a favorite of many, and a very appropriate celebration of God's gift of the Holy Spirit and the birth of the church.

Once again, Southminster will participate in the **Lethbridge Pride Parade** on in June, on June 28. It is a great opportunity to share our inclusive message. I regret that I will be away on the day of the parade but I highly encourage you to fill my spot. At the time, I will be at the General Council Office in Toronto as we begin the 45th General Council. For the past 2.5 years I have served as the chair of the Planning Committee for this General Council. We will have online sessions on June 22 and 28, and meet in person at the Telus Convention Centre in downtown Calgary August 7-11.

In addition to the proposals sent for debate by each Regional Council, we will also discuss strategic planning for the whole United Church in a campaign called "Toward 2035." The General Council will also elect our **next Moderator**, the spiritual figurehead of our denomination, for a three-year term. Five candidates have been nominated by regional councils across the country, including one from our own.

Chinook Winds Regional Council has nominated Rev. John Pentland of Hillhurst United Church in Calgary. You can keep up to date with what I am doing at General Council over the summer at: **generalcouncil.ca**

**YOUnited Youth programs** are open to all youth aged 12 - 17.


Youth Pickleball is offered on Tuesdays at 3:30pm until June 17, then they will move to other summer activities. Pickleball returns in September.

### **GOLDEN MILE DROP IN CENTRE**


There are two big anniversaries the city will observe this year: In June, the *United Church of Canada celebrates 100 years*.

There are many country-wide events leading up to the special day of June 10th.

Then <u>in July</u>, the **Lethbridge Senior Citizen's Centre celebrates 50 years** in operation. Why is the latter special to Southminster? Because the L.S.C.C. had it's beginning in our building!

Way back in 1969, **Ann Farries**, a member of Southminster and an active member of the United Church Women, was the person behind the idea of a Drop-in centre for seniors. She called it **"The Golden Mile Drop-In Centre"**. Several interested people met in Room #1 to enjoy card games, a game of pool and to socialize. The church's custodian of that time **Jack Gard**, contributed to the program by painting golden footsteps on the sidewalk leading from 4th Avenue to the door of the center.

The fledgling program became popular, and the rising number of interested people coming through the door, necessitated a larger venue. The group moved to a larger room in the church basement located under Southminster hall.



Ann's vision to help seniors, blossomed from a few people to about 700 in the early 1970s. Once again, it was time for larger quarters. In 1975, a new facility was envisioned and built connecting it to the Fritz Sick Centre. The senior's program carried on as the Golden Mile Drop-In Center until 1979 when the board decided to disband it. The centre was renamed **Lethbridge Senior Citizens' Centre**.

It is thanks to Ann's vision the centre of today continues to be a place for seniors to enjoy the day meeting friends, participating in activities and enjoying a good meal.

**Ann Farries** was born in Ontario in 1900 and came west in 1911. She started a drop-in centre at the Y.W.C.A. where she was employed as a house mother.

She passed away in 1986 at the age of 86 years.




Join the Affirming Committee walking in this year's **Pride Parade!** Bright colours are encouraged—flags, ribbons, umbrellas, hats!

Things are happening at camp! The construction crews are busy, and it is fun to watch camp start to take shape again. So far in May they have framed and sheathed the new camper cabins, the girls' washroom, the new storage building, and the staff cabins. Plumbers, electricians, construction workers, and a generator repair person are on site making sure everything is going according to plan. Things are shaping up! Next time you are in Waterton, if you drive down Red Rock Parkway, take a minute and stop at the camp gate. Without all the trees blocking the view, you can see the progress.

**Do you know any youth interested in leadership at camp?** In preparation for next year's opening, we are running **2 leadership training camps** in Waterton:

- 1. Wednesday, August 15 Friday, August 18 for ages 16-21 years
- 2. Wednesday, August 20 Friday, August 22 for ages 13-17 years

At this point, we are planning to stay in the Waterton United Church while *hoping* we can spend some time at Canyon Church Camp. There is limited space available (maximum 20 campers). Arrival time will be mid-morning on Wednesday and pick up late afternoon on Friday. Cost: \$150

The program will be very similar to our typical Canyon Church Camp programs including hiking, games, water play, campfire, vespers, and fun meals as well as creativity, nature, and faith explorations. Throughout these experiences, campers will have an opportunity to also learn about and practice both camp-specific and transferable leadership skills such as table setting, hiking etiquette, Leave No Trace principles, and leading camp songs as well as self-awareness, effective communication, creating safety, and recognizing/responding to needs.

This is an excellent **opportunity for future Camp Counsellors and Counsellors-in-Training** as well as youth and young adults who are keen to connect with themselves, each other, and nature through inspiring camp experiences in beautiful Waterton Lakes National Park.
