On the street just outside of the church, the city has painted the crosswalk in front of the cenotaph in honour members of the armed forces who have made the ultimate sacrifice for our freedoms. On **Remembrance Day** we remember the fallen. Southminster lost 32 young men in the First World War, a number that is absolutely unimaginable in our congregation's modern context.



We should never take lightly what that experience must have been like for the members of our church 110 years ago.

I wish to offer tremendous thanks to members of the **Men's Club** for another excellent **Fall Supper** two weeks ago. Soon we'll be saying the same about the **United Church Women (UCW)** in their hosting of the **Christmas Tea & Bazaar** on November 15th.

Working together to end global hunger

October brought us into our fall luncheon in support of the Canadian Foodgrains Bank. Many hands assisted in this luncheon from the sign up sheet going up by Rev Taylor, the eager sign ups for each item we needed and the hands to help set up and even add extra tables when we needed more seating! It's always a team effort and I'm grateful and thankful for so much support.

With the help of the congregation, we raised \$780.95 for the Canadian Foodgrains Bank. Through its ongoing grant agreement with the Government of Canada, donations to the Foodgrains Bank's used for food assistance projects are eligible for a 4:1 match, up to \$25 million a year. Foodgrains Bank also enters into other grant agreements with the Government of Canada that often match donations on a 3:1 basis.

We continue to educate and raise awareness for global hunger through this fundraising luncheon yearly. Thank you so much for being supportive of this event!

The City of Lethbridge has installed a commemorative Remembrance
Day/Veterans Crosswalk in our block at the intersection of 4 Avenue South and 10 Street South. Located near the Cenotaph, the initiative honours our veterans and continues our tradition of decorative crosswalks that reflect community values.


The crosswalk design was selected by the Lethbridge Legion. It features a soldier silhouette inspired by the Cenotaph statue, along with the phrase "LEST WE FORGET" in English and "IHTAISSKSINI'PA" in Blackfoot. This term was interpreted by Blood Tribe Elder Martin Heavy Head as "So that we know". The French version "NOUS NOUS SOUVIENDRONS" is also included.

The Memorial Organ

This month is for remembrance, and we look back on the history of our magnificent Cassavant organ. One hundred and five years ago the Wesley Methodist Church Official Board began a series of talks for the purpose of purchasing a pipe organ. The initial meeting was held at the beginning of 1914, however the First World War and the Spanish Influenza that followed forestalled further inquiries.

It was at the end of the war in 1918 that discussions began again. Claude Hughes, Wesley Church organist 1915-1920, was instrumental in spearheading the discussions. By the fall of 1920, the matter of a new pipe organ became a reality. The Cassavant Freres Company in Quebec promised the instrument would be delivered by October 1920 and preparations were made for its arrival and recitals scheduled.

The Cassavant organ was **dedicated in a concert January 7, 1921**. Three other recitals were scheduled for the months of January, February and March.

Through the years, the organ has been repaired and refurbished. It has been heard every Sunday morning, accompanying the hymns and choir anthems. It has been played by many guest organists who made the instrument sing and fill the sanctuary with unique sounds.

And this month we remember the organ's beginnings and the reason it is dubbed the 'memorial organ'- In remembrance of the men who served and those who died in the Great War. Their names are listed on the two plagues at the back of the sanctuary. ******

Fortunately, our construction crews can still get in to complete plumbing, electrical, and flooring projects before the camp is sealed up for the winter (which will happen soon!). Work will resume at the beginning of May 2026 to prepare for **CAMP OPENING IN MID-JUNE!**

The board of directors held a planning workshop at Southminster on October 18 to get things ready for next season. We are happy to say that we will be offering 6 weeks of youth camps in July/August 2026. Here are the proposed camp dates:

July 19-24, 2026	Ages 12-14 years
August 4-7, 2026	Ages 6-9 years
August 9-14, 2026	Ages 13-15 years
August 16-21, 2026	Ages 14-18 years

You can also mark your calendars for **3 family camp weekends** (June 19-21. July 17-19, and August 7-9). You don't need to have children to go to family camp! We are also planning a **Women's Camp Weekend** as well as a **CCC Alumni Weekend**. Watch for details on those. Registrations for all camps will open online early in the new year.


