There are many other active weekly/monthly groups at Southminster (see separate articles for more info):


- ➤ UCW (United Church Women), all women in the congregation are regarded as members the UCW. Their next event is the Annual Christmas Tea & Bazaar on Saturday, Nov. 23
- > Saturdays-at-10:30 (SATT) Faith Formation activities have also resumed for the fall. There will be moral and ethical discussions with our esteemed Minister Emeritus, Rev. Tad Mitsui in "Tad Talks"; adult Sunday School or creative pursuits with Amy Dodic; or discussing themes of faith in films with Gabrielle Dumont.

Canyon Church Camp Update

Construction has begun at camp! Elevate Construction has been hard at work for the last month. They have done demolition on the inside of the boys' washroom, found two leaks in the lodge roof (and are preparing for the repair), built a wheelchair ramp and new stairs on the lodge, and have begun construction on the girls' washroom! (see photos below) The trenching to re-establish the utilities will begin next week. They are trying to get as much work done as they can before the snow flies and Parks Canada closes Red Rock Parkway for the winter.

Our lodge fireplace is no longer certified, so we have been investigating how to fix it and it looks like our only option is a woodburning fireplace insert. This product comes with a large price tag, so hopefully the donations keep rolling in! We have put it on the backburner for now, but are hoping to revisit it in the spring. Elevate Construction has been excellent in keeping us updated on the progress, including lots of photos of what is happening. We have been posting some on our camp website, so check them out there (www.canyonchurchcamp.com), or pop in to the office on Tuesdays or Thursdays and I can show you the most recent ones on my computer!

MORE 1925 LETHBRIDGE & CHURCH FACTS

Archives Corner by Trish Purkis

- One of the first banks in town was the UNION BANK in operation since 1887. It was housed in a stone building on 5th Street [Round Street]. Renovations were made in 1925, and the bank merged with the Royal Bank soon after.
- ➤ Henderson Lake was designated a bird sanctuary in this vear.
- Lethbridge Exhibition ornate buildings were destroyed by fire in this year. (see photo below)



- Y.M.C.A. around since 1911 was taken over by the city and renamed the Lethbridge Young Peoples Christian Association. YMCA regained operation six years later. It was located to the west of Southminster Church.
- Rainbow Hall 5th Avenue North was at one time the home of the Ukrainian School and Labor Hall.
- ➤ In 1917 congregants of Westminster Methodist and St. Andrew's Presbyterian Churches on the north side of town, merged to form the North Lethbridge United Church following a fire in the Westminster Church. The use of the word 'United' simply noted the church was open to Christians of a variety of denominations and not to a specific group. It was in 1925 the two congregations amalgamated, and the name was changed from North Lethbridge United to First United Church and relocated to 502- 13 St. N.



This building (First United on 13th St. N.) was sold to another church group in the early 2000's

Today there is still a First United Church worshipping in the Generations Chapel on 13 St North.
