HOUSEHOLD ARTS

DIVISION 1

1. One entry per person per class.
2. **Household Arts, Culinary Arts** and **School Arts** entries **MUST** be submitted on separate entry forms.
3. The Superintendent reserves the right not to accept entries that require extraordinary protection. Subject matter of art should be suitable for a family atmosphere.
4. Exhibitor cards are available at the **MAIN GATE**. Both top and bottom of cards must be filled out and signed. Please attach the cards to the exhibit in a manner that will not interfere with the judging of the entry. Show officials reserve the right to move cards as necessary.
5. Exhibits must have completed exhibitor cards and copy of entry form.
6. Exhibits must be entirely the work of the exhibitor unless otherwise stated in the rules and must have been completed within the last two years. Previously entered articles will not be accepted.
7. Entries (paintings, graphics and photography) must be ready to hang (no exposed glass edges) with proper frame and wire for hanging. Sculptures will be displayed as presented – if there is no stand, the artwork will be displayed at the discretion of the Superintendent.
8. Works may be any size, but space is limited.
9. Exhibit cards should state whether the article is of original design or from a pattern or kit.

10. The Chenango County Fair will provide limited security for the exhibitions. Entries will be handled with all possible care, but the Chenango County Fair will not assume responsibility for the loss of, or damage to, works while in transit or on the premises.
11. Please note that any class that is subdivided by an “a,” “b,” “c,” etc. is considered a separate class. **EX: class 5a is a separate class from class 5b.**

CULINARY ARTS **DIVISION 2**

1. No food items, other than canned goods, will be returned to the exhibitor at the end of the Fair. **However, the entrant may come to pick up the remainder of their perishable food item(s) after judging.**
2. Recipes can be handwritten or typed on a 4x6 index card and need to accompany EACH entry.
3. Place recipe card and entry cards in a resealable sandwich bag. Recipes will not be returned to the exhibitor.
4. **Baked goods may not be made from boxed mixes, premixed purchased products such as slice and baked cookies or purchased “bake and serve” products such as ready-to-bake pies, crusts, brown and serve rolls etc. with the exception of classes 77, 79 and 81.**
5. No perishable dairy components or uncooked ingredients may be used such as egg custard fillings, cheesecakes, pumpkin pies, whipped cream toppings, etc.

*Breads are to be baked in a loaf pan, sized for the recipe, or shaped as specified in the recipe. When cool, remove from pan BUT DO NOT SLICE. Place loaf in appropriate sized resealable bag.

*Entries that have 3 pieces need to be placed on a paper plate when cool and the placed in a resealable bag appropriate for size.

- *date of processing

*Recipe card and processing instructions must be placed in resealable bag and brought with exhibits. Two identical jars of same product must be submitted for each entry for comparison of contents.

*Judges reserve the right to open or not open 1 jar for judging purposes. Exhibitor may take home open jar after judging.

*Color and flavor should be as close as possible to the natural fruit or vegetable.

*Syrup or liquid should be clear and free from seeds.

*Pack jar with reference to best use of space. Make as large a proportion of solids to liquids as possible.

*Fruit or vegetable should be uniform in shape, size and ripeness.

*All preserved food should be exhibited in standard containers.

*Entry must have been processed between August 2022 and August 2023.

YOUTH AND SCHOOL ARTS DIVISION 3

Creative expression through fine arts is a vital part of the educational and cultural development of American youth. To encourage and promote the achievements of our youth, the Chenango County Agricultural Society

cordially invites every youth in Chenango County to enter their works of art in the Chenango County Fair.

1. Work may be submitted by Art instructors, but is not required. Each exhibit must have an entry tag attached. Entry forms and tags are available at the Main Gate office. Each school's group of exhibits must be brought to the Exhibition Hall on Sunday prior to fair **between 10:00am and 2:00pm for judging**. Exhibits will not be accepted without entry forms and tags. Teachers are for delivery and pick up.
2. Any youth may enter on their own if their Art teacher is not collecting the entries. Their exhibits may be brought to the Main Gate during the last week prior to opening of the Fair. Forms and tags may be filled out at that time. **Exhibits submitted after 2:00pm on the Sunday prior to fair will not be accepted.**
3. **Exhibits are released for pick-up on Sunday of fair week, beginning at approximately 3:00 pm.**
4. All work must be original work and produced in the last year. Any work that is not original must be so labeled, that it is a derived work, and credit given to the artist. No kits are allowed.
5. All work must be properly labeled and identified with the name of the youth, the school, teacher, grade and the youth's phone number.
6. **Art work that is to be hung on the wall must be entered ready to hang or it will not be accepted.** Frames are not required, but work must be firmly mounted on stiff backing larger than the object (and matting if used). This ensures that the art itself is not

damaged with thumb tacks or other hanging device. Frames must have picture hanging wire or other means to hang it on the wall.

7. Objects must be in good physical condition and not torn, bent or damaged in any way when submitted. They must be presented in a neat and clean fashion.
8. **Each student may enter as many classes as desired but may not enter more than 2 exhibits in any case.**
