
"Say to the daughter of Zion, 'Behold, your king is coming to you,









Jesus Sends Two Disciples




The Disciples Get the Donkey

Jesus Rides the Donkey


















This Was All Foretold

Result of People's Failure

- Misunderstood Jesus's purpose and ministry
- Wanted Jesus to lead a military rebellion against Rome
- They turned against Jesus when he did not lead a rebellion
- They betrayed Jesus by shouting, "Crucify him!"
- They missed out on what they really needed and wanted: spiritual salvation

Psalm 118 Is a Messianic Psalm

²¹ I thank you that you have answered me and have become my salvation. ("my yeshua")
