Scripture and the Supernatural

בראשית בּרְא אֱלֹהִים אֵת 1:1 et Elohim bara b'reshit Aleph Tav God created in beginning

In Hebrew the noun must always equal the number and gender of the verb which proceeds it

The verb here is "bara" which means to create, it is in the singular perfect tense (qal) form in this verse

But the noun here "Elohim" is in the plural form (im), while the verb is singular.

Col 2:9 For in Him dwells all the fullness of the Godhead bodily.

Deu 6:4 "Hear, O Israel: The LORD our God, the LORD is one.

Deu 6:4 Hear, O, Israel. Jehovah our God *is* one Jehovah.

(MKJV, LITV, ASV, YLT)

Deu 6:4 "Hear, O Yisra'ěl: הוה our Elohim, הוה is one! (TS2009)

Ge 3:5 For God doth know that in the day ye eat thereof, then your eyes shall be opened, and ye shall be as gods, knowing good and evil.

1Ki 18:21-40 is a conflict between the prophet of the true God, Elijah (Yah is God) and 450 prophets of the false "god", Baal (lord, master)

The conflict is,
who is "Elohim"
is His name Yehovah?
or
is his name Baal?

The name "YEHOVAH" (LORD) has attributes or characteristics that applies to no other being, divine or human

Elohei ha elohim = God of the gods

Adonai ha adoniym = LORD of the lords

Dt 10:17 For Jehovah your God, He is the God of gods, and the Lord of lords; the great, the mighty, the fearful God who does not lift up faces, nor take a bribe.

(LITV)

Dt 10:17 For Yahuah Elohaykem is Elohai ha'elohiym, and Adonai ha'adoniym, the great El, the mighty, and the terrible, which regards not persons, nor takes reward:

(Cepher)

This distinction is seen throughout the whole of the Scripture, in both Old and New Testaments, Ps 82, Jn 10:34-35

There are many Elohim/elohim in Scripture,

But only One is Yah,

He has no equal
