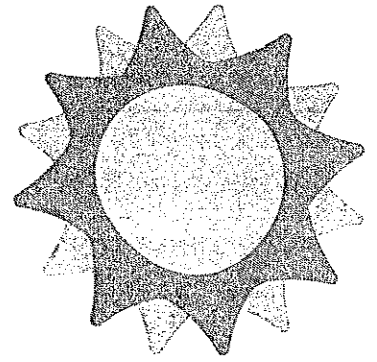
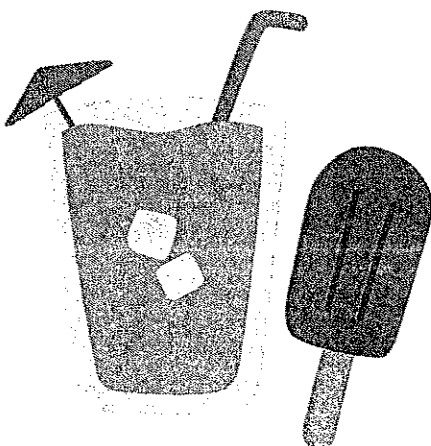
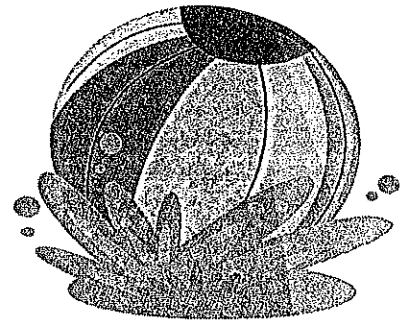




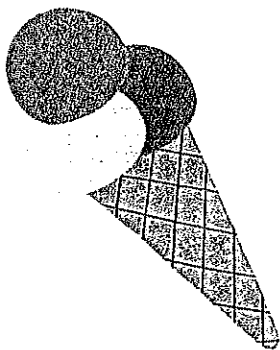
Summer Packet to Prepare for Kindergarten!





Future Kindergartener,

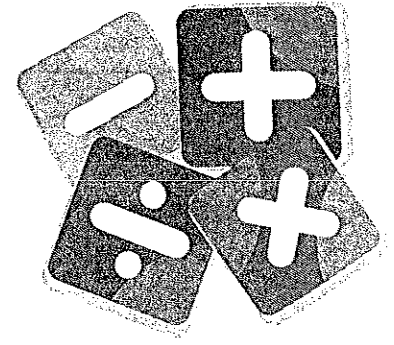

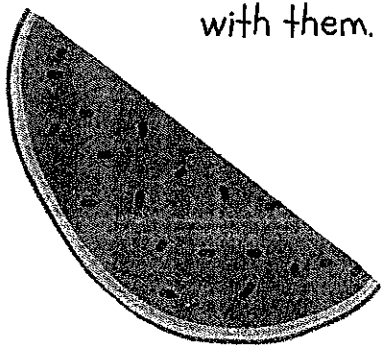

MATH PRACTICE



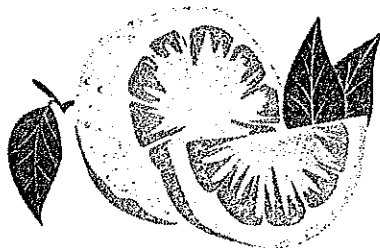
- Count the steps when you go up and down them
- Use a bag of M&Ms or fruit snacks, count them out and sort them by their colors
- At snack times have your child ask for a certain amount (Ex "I want 4 animal crackers) and practice counting them.
- Identify the colors of the cars as you walk by them in a parking lot
- Stickers-make a picture using stickers and count them as you put them on the picture
- Foam numbers from the dollar tree-stick up in the bathtub when wet
- Blow bubbles, count them as you pop them
- Comparing groups, which has more, less, are they equal?
- Go on a shape hunt- cut out shapes of paper and hide them around the house, see if your child can find the hiding shapes
- Dollar tree sells large dice- roll them, count the dots, then count out an object- could be a favorite toy, such as cars, or a snack item
- Practice one to one correspondence while counting, have your child point to one thing at a time and count aloud with them.



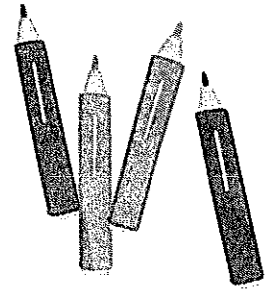


LETTER PRACTICE

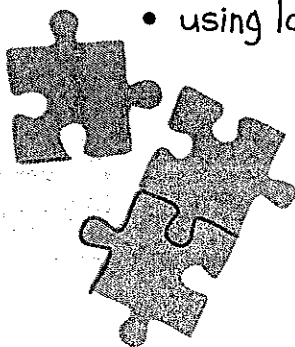
- Use sidewalk chalk to practice writing and identifying letters
- draw out a hopscotch game with sidewalk chalk, but use letters instead of numbers
- write letters on pieces of paper, have your child drive a car to the letter you say
- Look for letters while you are out at a store or in the car, reading road signs!
- Make an ABC memory game, students match their ABCs
- Go on a letter hunt, put letters on post its or small pieces of paper around the house. See if your child can find all the letters
- Put some foam shaving cream on a tray or table. Practice making letters in the shaving cream
- put a piece of paper in a plastic page protector. Use dry erase markers to practice writing your child's name or ABCs
- Say the ABCs while going up steps
- Sing the ABC song while brushing your teeth
- Practice spelling your name aloud



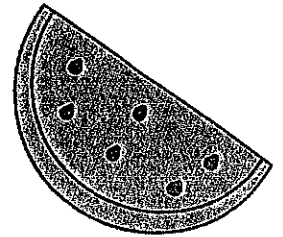
FINE MOTOR SKILLS



- Playing with play-doh roll out snakes, make balls, hide small buttons in the play doh, students have to find them and take them out
- putting coins into a piggy bank
- put holes in the top of a recycled plastic container. Use pom-poms and push them through the holes
- String plastic beads onto a pipe cleaner
- pop bubble wrap
- clip clothespins onto a card, paper, anything really (pinching to put them on and take them off)
- Draw lines on a piece of paper, practice cutting
- puzzles without frames
- building with Legos
- Practice picking up Cheerios one at a time with a pincer grasp (pointer and thumb ONLY)
- Playing with silly putty - strengthen hand muscles
- coloring with markers or crayons (tri-grip)
- tracing shapes or letters
- side walk chalk
- practice opening snacks, containers
- Practice zipping coats
- hooking link toys together and unhooking
- using large tweezers or tongs to pick up small toys
