

谦卦(谦虚)由上坤荁(地),下艮荁(山)组成,又称"地山qiān"。卦象"上地下山",高山本来在地上,这里却埋藏在地下,象征君子(有才有德的人)不去大肆张扬自己的优点或成前,而是以谦虚的态度对待身边的人与事。如果懂得"谦受益,满招损"的含义,能做到处处谦虚,就能通达畅顺,言祥如意。

初六,'谦谦君子,用涉大川,吉'。非常谦虚的君子,可以用 giān bèi dì tài dù guỗn 川 zì yòng shè dò chuẩn 声, 非常谦虚的君子,可以用 giān bèi dì tài dù guỗn 川 zì ji ér shùn 川 dù guò dà hè (困难),吉祥。这是第一 yòo shuò míng nǐ suò chù dì wèi zhì huán zài chù ji jiè duàn 如果你能保持非常谦虚的 tài dù dù dùi biè rén 好的位置还在初级阶段。如果你能保持非常谦虚的 态度对待别人,而以谨慎的态度监督自己,时常进行反思改进, 避免犯错,就会顺利战胜面对的困难,而获得吉祥。

九三,'劳谦君子,有终,吉'。有功劳又谦虚的君子,有好结果,吉祥。当你取得成功时,不要妄自尊大,居功自傲;你的是很多人支持和帮助的成果。你不但要感谢所有帮助过你的人,还要不断提高自己,接受新事物和新挑战,才会获得更多人的支持和尊敬,有更大的发展。

iù wò '不富以其邻,利用侵伐,无不利'。不靠财富就得到邻庭的支持,适宜进行讨伐,一切顺利。虽然你谦虚的态度赢得了hèn duo rén dì xìn rèn hè zhì chí 中是由于有些人(团体)顽固不驯,不肯顺服,这时为了树立你的威严,可以采取强硬态度对待那些自以wéi shì dì rén 人,也不会有不利的事发生。



Qian Hexagram (humility) is combined with 坤豆 (earth) the above and 艮豆 (mountain) below. The image of Qian Hexagram shows the mountain is within the earth or buried in the ground and this represents a Junzi (a gentleman with high morality and ability) who never shows hubris and, like a mountain that has descended beneath the Earth, is humble and modest. As *I Ching* says: 'Humble brings benefits, pride incurs losses.' A truly humble leader is willing to accept different opinions and suggestions raised by others. If you are humble in your work, great benefits and success will follow.

The **Judgment** of 'Qian' (humility): 'Auspicious, Junzi (gentleman) persists humility till the end.' The hexagram indicates, that as a Junzi, you should understand that humility brings many benefits, and persistent efforts to be humble and modest is the way to gain justice and truth. A true humble leader applies tolerant attitudes, constantly improve one's ability, and helps those in need. They do not take credit nor seek awards for one's achievements. Remembering this will help the leader build a solid foundation for success.

Chu-Liu, 'A very humble Junzi cross the river, safe and auspicious'. This is the first line of this hexagram which shows your position is still inferior. Humility will help draw others towards yourself, so, if you show humble attitudes toward others, pay attention to the words you use, reflect on and improve yourself, and avoid arrogance and pride. In doing so you will successfully overcome difficulties you encounter and stay safe and auspicious.

Liu-Er, 'Your reputation of humble attitude is widely heard, to be steadfast is auspicious.' A Junzi who should always treat others with humility. Your humble attitude inspires many people around you and those who are willing to learn from you. As a humble Junzi, you not only gain your leaders' attention but also earn your colleagues' trust and this will help you achieve your goals.

Jiu-San, 'A diligent Junzi with humility, has an auspicious ending.' To be a capable and humble Junzi you should not seek reward or credit for your achievements: you should acknowledge and thank those people who helped and supported you to reach your goals. In order to make further achievements and have an auspicious ending continue to work hard without boastfulness, be humble, and be open-minded. Seek to learn something new and accept new challenges and strive to gain more people's respect and support.

Liu-Si, 'All things profit, so long you maintain your humility manner.' This position states that no matter what situation you are facing, you must consistently self-cultivate by keeping in mind the principles of the *Dao* (nature law) and being humble with your superiors and subordinates. These measures will bring you the trust and support of your leaders and colleagues and help you achieve your goals.

Liu-Wu, 'Wealth is not shared, it is profit to make necessary force the unruly neighbors.' Your humble attitude has gained many people's trust and support, but some small people (organizations) are still arrogant and unruly and do not obey the Dao (nature law). To make these recalcitrant improve their behavior, and build on your majestic image, you can adopt tough action to force these people to change their behavior. There will be no harm to you.

Shang-Liu, 'Your reputation of humility is wildly heard, send an army to attack the small countries (your own cities).' The key to learning the Qian (humility)

hexagram is adopting a modest manner in dealing with people around you to successfully achieve your goals. Humility is a virtue and not a sign of weakness. When humbly interacting with others, some may think your ability is limited and seek to dominate you. In order to embody the principle of solidarity, you can take strong measures to disciple those who are arrogant and unjust and so help to achieve your greater goals.

Qian Hexagram (humility) is combined with 坤(earth) and 艮豆(mountain). In the image of Qian Hexagram, Kun (earth) is above (outer hexagram) and Gen (mountain) at the bottom (inner hexagram) which represents a Junzi, while having many strengths and achievements, persists in the ways of humility and justice. If you want to further your success and reach your ultimate goal, you must be humble to deal with everyone and everything around you; be enlightened and self-effacing, and keep in mind the old saying 'humble brings benefit and pride incurs losses'. If you want to further progress in a humble manner, the next 'Yu hexagram' will give you some tips.
