HEATHERS: "ON THE MUSICAL"

"Are there any happy endings?"

The teen black comedy film Heathers following Veronica Sawyer, troubled teen J.D., and the popular clique, the eponymous Heathers, was released in 1989. Written by David Waters and directed by Michael Lehmann, the film sought to skewer the positive and family-friendly version of high school found in most teen movies at the time. This film tackles subjects of bullying, suicide, murder and high school violence, all in its own unique, sardonic way. Since its release, Heathers garnered a cult following and continued to live in popular culture. This was helped by Waters' decision to invent his own teen slang and not rely on current teen lingo, which would date the movie. Despite this, it remains a snapshot of the high school ethos of the late 80s in small-town America.

Production on a musical adaptation of the film began by 2009 and, after time in Los Angeles, premiered Off-Broadway in 2014. With music, book, and lyrics by Laurence O'Keefe and Kevin Murphy, Heathers: The Musical both recaptures and reinvents the film it adapts. The musical follows seventeen-year-old Veronica Sawyer in her final year at Westerburg High. The musical's opening number establishes Veronica, her best friend Martha, the school dynamics and most importantly, the Heathers: the popular clique who rule the school.

Their leader, Heather Chandler, is cruel in equal measures to the inner circle and the rest of the student population of Westerburg High but is still very popular. When they learn Veronica can be useful to them, the Heathers allow her into their clique, making Veronica leave Martha behind. Further complicating things is the arrival of Jason "J.D." Dean, a mysterious new boy who shocks the students by standing up to the jocks Kurt and Ram. However, his violent nature intrigues Veronica, leading her to fall out with the Heathers in more ways than one.

Heathers leans into the idea of people taking other people's tragedy for themselves, satirizing some of the ways mental health and suicide are viewed in media and real life. A change from the film comes in the form of Heather Chandler appearing as a ghost to Veronica, haunting her for the rest of the show. This ghost echoes the words of what Veronica has absorbed from the expectations of her family, the Heathers, her school, and society at large.

"I wish your dad were good; I wish grownups understood. I wish we'd met before they convinced you life is war," is the thesis of the musical. Being in high school for most people feels like hell, and Heathers takes that to the extreme. It is messy, violent, romantic, harsh, and unfair. Heathers: The Musical doesn't shy away from any of the film's dark subject matter. If anything, the musical doubles down and goes deeper into some of the film's dark themes. Making J.D. a more fleshed-out character and exploring a troubled relationship with his father, the death of his mother, and his relationship with high school go a long way to humanize him while not excusing his violent actions.

Despite all the violence and chaos, there is optimism in Heathers. It is a cynical and dark story, but there is optimism; the "war" eventually ends. The final number of the show, "Seventeen (Reprise)," allows the characters to simply be flawed teenagers, not forgiving or condoning the bad but allowing for the possibility of good. The closing number reiterates that they are all just seventeen years old and in high school, and things will hopefully get better. Heathers knows what to poke fun at and what to take seriously. This is evident in its satirical exploration of the musical's many themes, such as bullying, violence, sexual assault, eating disorders, parental neglect, mental health and suicide. It is because of Heathers' ability to shine a light on so many serious subject matters in a way that feels approachable, (mostly) respectful, and entertaining, along with its endlessly catchy songs, that it's become a classic in its own right.
