#### <u>A NOTE FROM THE DIRECTOR</u>

You are about to see two parallel worlds come to life. Both are set in Los Angeles in the early 1940's, and though you will see a distinct shift in colour between them, be aware of the shift in tone as well. In the film noir world, we have incorporated a touch of melodrama to interact playfully with Stone's cynicism. This is a way of reconciling the two distinct styles that this script brings together: musical theatre and film noir.

You are going to experience the archetypal femme fatale at her best. Watch her with a careful eye to see how she spins her web. Hint: There are more than one! See if you can guess whodunit. I bet you'll be right.

This script is filmic in nature. It uses flashbacks, involves many locations, and its short scenes help to create a cinematic feel. Our set represents a film studio soundstage, a transient space in which both the real world and film world can exist in tandem. I invite the audience to engage with the interaction between these mutually dependant worlds. Though subtle at first, these instances gradually increase and become some of the most appealing moments of the show.

I would like to thank the production team and crews, the band, and the cast for sticking with me through this harebrained escapade through time and colour.
