

Director's Note

Hey, it's me! While writing this Director's Note, I started thinking about what my life would have been like if this project had never happened...

Eight months ago, my producer, Rebecca, and I were starting work on a show called *The Wild Party* by Andrew Lippa, a MUCH different story than *If/Then*. We then received news that we were unable to produce this show. We quickly realized, through our second round of researching into shows, that this was a great opportunity to tell another story, one we knew was incredibly important and meaningful, and that is the beautiful show you are about to see: *If/Then*.

So say "that it's fate, say it's foretold" little did we know we were having our very first 'If/Then' moment of the project. IF our original pitch had worked out, THEN the wonderful people who have formed connections with each other and the experiences we have all shared might never have happened. So whether this was all done by an act of the universe or turning a blind eye to the small print, I am so grateful our original show did not work out.

Just like this experience, this show teaches us to embrace the possibilities of our choices. I believe as human beings we can't help but wonder "What If?". If we could see where our choices would lead us, what would we do differently? The chance to change our lives moment to moment through our decisions, gives us both power and pressure. In If/Then, we watch Elizabeth struggle between playing it safe or taking risks as she tries to navigate her life in New York as both Beth and Liz, and how her paths change and collide from one single choice.

So the big question remains... how do we find a way to choose without fear? The answer lies simply within the lyrics and lines of this honest show: "Love While You Can", "Learn to Live Without", "No More Wasted Time" to name a few, but most importantly this show shows us that we are "Always Starting Over". Our choices allow us to keep moving forward, explore different paths and to form new connections.

As Liz says in the final scene of the show, "We get one life, and we let the rest go." The choices we have already made cannot be changed, and there is no way to know how things will work out with the choices we have yet to make. There are only the possibilities, and that in itself holds so much hope.

So whether we will fly or fall off the cliff, *If/Then* teaches us that it truly comes down to whether we are brave enough to make the leap at all.

Our Land

"Acknowledging territory shows recognition of and respect for Indigenous Peoples. It is recognition of their presence both in the past and the present. Recognition and respect are essential elements of establishing healthy, reciprocal relations. These relationships are key to reconciliation, a process to which Queen's is committed."

When the first Europeans arrived in Southern Ontario in the early 1600s, the north shore of Lake Ontario and the area known as *Katarokwi* (Kingston) were already home to both the Huron-Wendat Peoples and the Haudenosaunee people of the Five Nations/Iroquois confederacy.

Running from modern-day Quebec, along the St. Lawrence river and the Great Lakes (Northern Ontario, Michigan, Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Minnesota) lived the Anishinaabek, meaning Original People or Good People in the Anishinaabemowin language. The Anishinaabek comprise the Ojibwe, Potawatomi, Odawa (Ottawa), Chippewa, Mississauga, Saulteaux, Nipissing and Algonquin people.

Today, the Iroquois (Six Nations) Confederacy, known widely by the Cayuga word *Haudenosaunee* meaning the People of the Longhouse, have five communities across southern Ontario, eastern Quebec, and south into New York State. The Tyendinaga Mohawks of the Bay of Quinte is Kingston's closest First Nations reserve, and the only government-recognized territory within the Kingston region.

Queen's University offers Anishinaabemowin, Mohawk, and Inuktituk language and culture courses as an opportunity for students to expand their knowledge of Aboriginal history and life. Students can also participate in events organized by the Four Directions Aboriginal Student Centre, get involved with the Queen's Native Student Association, or volunteer at Kingston native community organizations.

This brief summary of the local history of the land is based on the Queen's Encyclopedia entry of Kingston's Traditional Territories.
