The Board of Urbana Township Trustees met on this date with Trustee Blair Stinson, Trustee Roger Koerner, and Trustee Matt Harrigan present.

The October 20, 2025 Meeting Minutes and Financial Status Reports were reviewed and accepted. Mr. Stinson moved, to approve the October 20, 2025 meeting minutes, along with the status reports. Mr. Koerner seconded the request. Roll call was as follows: Mr. Stinson, yes; Mr. Harrigan, yes; Mr. Koerner, yes.

**Road and Maintenance Report**

Mr. Harrigan – Final road mowing going on out through the township. There was a road sign check. We do have some signs that we want to replace due to lettering for Jadora and Oakview Drive. It will be nicer, bolder signs. Due to reflectivity at night, you can't see the signs.

Mower repairs, we had a new battery. On November 10<sup>th</sup> we did have some snow and we got salt and grit. Roger helped with the road updates. We are preparing for a burial tomorrow, so we prepped today.

Fire Chief Dean Ortlieb – bringing quarterly report. (see attached). Township stats on the back. Sandi provided tanker bill that was sent to the township.

Mr. Stinson indicated he would be up at the end of the year to discuss services.

Mr. Ortlieb – indicated there are two new directors, so we will see how they want to handle things.

**Zoning and Cemetery Report**

Mr. Tullis – see attached.

Zoning commission had a meeting and reorganization on October 16<sup>th</sup>. We had a zoning training by LUC regarding agriculture zoning rules.

On the zoning timeline, you guys can look at that and if you are ok with it, you need to schedule a public hearing, and notify the public at least ten days before. Then we will have the hearing and they will vote. If approved, it goes back to LUC and will take affect in 30 days. It's dealing

with fence rules, increasing the height of a barn so residents can have a taller door for campers and such, and shipping containers used as storage buildings.

### Cemetery Report

Burying Jane Stephens tomorrow. Sold six gravesites around the first of October, and two more gravesites to Mr. & Mrs. Stephen.

Mr. Tullis – one last thing, did reach out to Ms. Dunlavy about 1230 South Avenue, Urbana, OH 43078. Three things neighbors complaining about. I sent her plan for how she is going to deal with it. She is going to board up building by December 5<sup>th</sup>. She is cleaning up yard waste by May 1<sup>st</sup>. Also there is a vehicle there that is abandoned. She doesn't have a title for it, and is asking for until April 1<sup>st</sup> to make that happen. She has a plan and is committed to it, so we will see if she follows through or not. (see attached reply from Ms. Dunlavy regarding the complaints)

Mr. Stinson – just to reply to the other complaint, the gentleman up in Briarwood has withdrawn his request for a noise ordinance. He is just going to withdraw his request.

Mr. Cassidy – I previously spoke with Trustee Stinson about what I was here to talk to you about the inside millage on property tax.

The commission voted a month ago to forgo the \$962,000 of increased millage to our general fund. With us doing that, it would have very little effect to the average tax payer. There are 28 entities that receive inside millage. Visited all but 3 townships. I asked each to consider doing the same. One of the reasons I thought this was a good thing for the county to do, if the rules didn't change at the 11<sup>th</sup> hour. I serve on the state tax and finance committee. When HB 335 came out, the intention was to cap the increase in inside millage at the rate of inflation. Which is what the commission was trying to do. We were trying to cancel out the spikes and jump increases in property taxes. Champaign County will have roughly have a 22-26% increase in property taxes largely due to inside millage. Valuation goes up, inside millage goes up at a 1 to 1 ration.

We were all on board in supporting HB 335, on capping that at the rate of inflation, which is 2.9%. However, at the last minute they added language that added that any entity that capped the inside millage would have to apply to have that inside millage reinstated the next tax cycle. Our intention was to forgo the inside millage for one year. On the next tax cycle, we anticipated HB 335 being law, to cap the inside millage. Everywhere across the county there is going to be a property tax increase. Since that language has been added to HB 335, it's in the Senate now and I think it's at three reads. The commissioners association is trying to get that language removed but it hasn't been at this point. The commissioners have rescinded their previous motion to forgo the collection of those mills. The reason why is we can afford to do that for one tax cycle. The law comes in effect and it evens it out. We can't give up that .6 mills in perpetuity, nor can we advise that anyone else do that. It is going to be hard to maintain the services we have in the county. So there is no way I could ask you folks to do that and I am here to tell you not to do that with that language is in there.

Almost every entity that I went to seriously looked at doing this and wanted to do this. The townships were the most willing to step up. Every other entity has an alternate form of income, and the townships do not.

Our colleague on LUC, testified before the Senate and used Champaign County as an example. At this point, if they took the language out, we are not circling back. I don't think it is ever wrong to fight for the people. It is unfortunate that we are not able to do that.

Ms. Perry – what is the increase we are going to see?

Mr. Cassady – if you take that and divide it in half, Urbana Township is going to be about a 15% increase. Agriculture is looking at 21.5%. Mechanicsburg is the highest place in the county. In town, about a 23% increase. Several entities had already passed the resolution. Mechanicsburg and Goshen Township were some of those. People were will to do the right thing. Part of our issue with the House and the Senate was people are willing to do this. The County Commissioners Association is an opponent of HB 335 without this additional language.

Mr. Stinson – Urbana Township still collects the smallest inside millage in Champaign County. No one pays less taxes, as far as what the township gathers. It hits all of us.

#### Website Report

Mr. Harrigan - I added two public meeting notices to the website regarding a November 24<sup>th</sup> meeting for a sign. Those two notices are on our website. Usually public notices are on the website and posted in the newspaper.

#### Unfinished Business

Mr. Stinson – the only old business we have is the resolution from Ms. Napier.

Ms. Perry – The Joyce Bowman indigent cremation. That was returned by the State. They are requiring that the Board vote at the meeting finding Ms. Bowman indigent. I have her death certificate, her burial transit permit, the bill for \$850.00, along with the affidavits from the funeral home and her son.

I looked her up and she doesn't own any property. She did live in our township. The funeral home declared her indigent and her son declared her indigent as well. Mr. Koerner moved, seconded by Mr. Stinson, to find deceased resident Joyce Bowman indigent for cremation purposes. Roll call was as follows: Mr. Koerner, yes; Mr. Stinson, yes; Mr. Harrigan, yes.

We also had the sub division lights that Roger was going to check with Pioneer on. If we are going to continue the assessments. They did go up didn't they Blair?

Mr. Stinson – to 19 cents from 14 cents per kilowatt.

Ms. Perry – are you wanting to renew these assessments at the rate we have then? Tecumseh Woods has 50 lots, with two street lights. Pullins Woods has 29 lots assessed \$29.80. Ward Manor has 8 street lights, 18 lots assessed at \$48.00. We can renew or revisit next year.

Mr. Koerner – I am saying we revisit next year.

Mr. Stinson – and there is enough carry over for this year right?

Ms. Perry – yes, but we need to revisit next year, because we may not have enough for another year.

Mr. Stinson – we have the resolution authorizing the Prosecuting Attorney to take all necessary action to enforce the restriction of certain solar and wind projects pursuant to HB 52 adopted. Which puts us firmly against solar. Mr. Koerner seconded the motion.

Mr. Harrigan read the Resolution. Roll call was as follows: Mr. Stinson, yes; Mr. Harrigan, yes; Mr. Koerner, yes.

Mr. Harrigan – we have been going to the meetings of RWE, and listening to the constituents.

Mr. Stinson – what you are going to need now is signatures. Signed petitions of residents that can be taken to the OPSB. That is going to be the public meeting for you to go and tell people how you feel. We know how you feel. We haven't had one person come up and say that they support this.

Mr. Harrigan – the county commissioners have a say in this and also the OPSB. They listen to what everyone has to say, good or bad, then they look at the trustees and commissioners are saying.

Mr. Stinson – it is a long road and it is in pre-application. They still have to get past that first stage.

Mr. Tullis – has contact of where you can contact OPSB. The document saying it is grandfathered. It is not grandfathered, that is what OPSB told Mr. Tullis. This is a new request. There will be more meetings, but because of the size of it, it is out of the township ability to affect it. If it is less than 50 megawatts then the township can have some input. The last time I looked at it, it was 117. They have dropped some of it north of Dugan. I don't know what the current acreage is, but it is still above the 50, so it still goes back to the state OPSB and county commission.

Mr. Stinson – I think everybody know this, but all 12 townships have voted for no commercial solar. The commissioners have voted no commercial solar. When you hit over that 100 megawatt, it is out of the commissioner and township hands. A small group of people stopped a multi billion dollar company on the turbines.

Mr. Harrigan – the only other unfinished business I had was the RC2 and I don't have an update on that.

#### New Business

Mr. Harrigan – I don't have anything other than the new signs for Jadora and Oakview Drive. I did get a quote on the company that provides the signs for \$75 a piece, total \$150.00.

Mr. Harrigan - The township has been part of the widening of Dugan Road and State Route 36. That is complete now. They didn't spend all of the money that they thought they needed. There was a culvert or two that they didn't need to replace. About \$23,000 less.

Mr. Harrigan – Wright State University wants to discontinue the holding of archives. It is civil dockets from 1871 – 1914, we have the option for the archives to maintain that through the State of Ohio.

Mr. Koerner moved, seconded by Mr. Stinson to approve and distribute bills. Roll call was as follows: Mr. Harrigan, yes; Mr. Stinson, yes; Mr. Koerner, yes.

Public Comment

Mr. Harrigan – explained the public comment process.

Nicole Doyle – Lives at 2757 State Route 54. She and her husband own the property and wanted to let you know we are opposed to the solar. It would greatly impact our property and our farm. The site proposed would impact the farming revenue. It would also impact our wildlife and I don't want to restrict that with fences and solar. We have a lot of birds. The visual appearance is concerning. That would be all you can see down that road. As I understand it, we are right across the street and it would never power us. I talked to who they would sell that to. Renewable energy is great, but not on our prime farmland.

I know you said that you are against it. If there is anything that citizens can do, let us know. I feel powerless. I feel like they came in and said this is what they are going to do. Is zoning a thing for this?

Mr. Tullis – the best thing is to contact them, email them, voice mails, letters, let them know.

Ms. Doyle - I did submit our comment to their website.

Mr. Koerner – I don't think you are powerless. Sometimes you have to stand up for what you think is right.

Mr. Stinson – petitions. Rally. There is a good group of people who I think are going to go door to door. Get ahold of Brad Winner, Jr. He is coordinating this.

Mr. Tullis - They provide free signs.

Mr. Rector - 2855 State Route 54. Just going to piggy back off of them. Solar itself is probably the way we are going, but not on farmland. There are negative effects on wildlife species. Also, property values both residential and ag tend to go through the floor. There are runoff issues. A lot of the land being leased for these projects is from people living out of state. I think I am in agreeance with my neighbors. There are numerous studies that will show the negative impact. Other than the studies by the solar companies, there are studies that affect the micro-climate. Other than people who are leasing the land and the solar companies, nobody in the immediate area benefits from this. You brought up zoning, with all of this being zoned as ag land, if it would have to be changed to commercial property.

Mr. Tullis – there is a small portion in our zoning about solar, and all we are able to manage or zone is less than fifty megawatts. Then it goes to the county commissioners and the OPSB. As far as zoning, our hands are tied. The lady from the state said write to them, email them. Signed petitions are the best way to let them know how strongly our residents of Urbana Township feel.

Mr. Rector – the galvanizing materials they are putting in the ground negatively affects the surrounding farm land based on the metals they are putting in the ground to support the infrastructure for the transmission of power.

Mr. Stinson – they are starting up petitions. I talked to Brad (Winner) today. We have to have something when we go there. We would like to be able to have a stack of petitions to say these people say no. There are 3,000 residents in Urbana Township not including the city. They could go to the council meeting and pressure the city to get involved to join the fight.

Mr. Koerner – they are a little smarter now. They will take every avenue to win. You have to take every avenue to win also.

Mr. Tullis – RWE's feather in their cap is saying the energy goes to the grid. My comment was that is code for it goes to the east coast. The other thing they are hanging their hat on is the tax income for the community. That is usually what their response is.

Mr. Ballard - 2005 Oakview Drive, Urbana, OH. Thank you for passing the resolution to fight this solar. There are a lot better options. Thank you for your allegiance. Congratulate Blair and Roger for re-election. Also before you replace the sign can you check to see if it is Oak View, two words, and Oakview, one word. I get half my mail both ways. No one including they county can tell me if it is supposed to be one or two. Unfortunately Jack Stultz is dead. My wife wants it to stay two words but if you punch it in google, it comes up one word. Is it possible to find out.

Thomas Strange - 3230 Adelle Drive. I am here to support the township. Do like the fact that you are on board with no solar. I went to the last meeting in town because I didn't know where the solar panels were going to be. I had heard that there was one grouping that was taken off of their plans. It was kind of information but I was hearing the same things. I asked how does it benefit the township and Urbana. We don't need to lose more farmland for solar. There is a

lot of other opportunities. Put it on parking lots and Walmart. Congratulations to you guys on the election.

Mr. Harrigan – thank you for the comments. We don’t always hear the positive.

Ms. Perry – Mr. Evilsizor also wished Roger and Blair congratulations with the election. He sent me an email.

Mr. Harrigan – any time you want to come, you can voice your questions. You can also submit your questions on the website.

Mr. Harrigan - one other thing, we want to renew the Zoning Appeals Board for Jim Heiser. Mr. Harrigan reached out to him and he will accept the re-appointment. Mr. Stinson moved to reappoint, James Heiser to the Zoning Appeals Board. Mr. Koerner seconded the request. Roll call was as follows: Mr. Stinson, yes; Mr. Koerner, yes; Mr. Harrigan, yes.

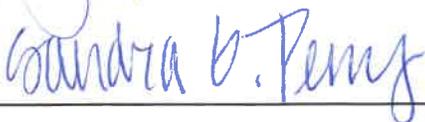
Executive Session started at 6:17 P.M. and ended at 6:29 P.M.

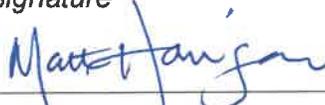
