CORONAVIRUS DISEASE 2019 (COVID-19)

Take steps to protect yourself:

Clean your hands often: Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds. If soap and water are not available, use a hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol. Cover all surfaces of your hands and rub them together until they feel dry. Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands. Avoid close contact with people who are sick. Take steps to protect others: Stay home if you are sick, except to get medical care. Cover coughs and sneezes. Wear a facemask if you are sick. If you are not sick, you do not need a facemask unless you are caring for someone who is sick and they are unable to wear a facemask. They are in short supply and should be saved for caregivers.
