Mission statement: Our mission is to develop new ideas and technologies that help people with mild to severe disabilities (including disabilities as outlined by ADA definition) to experience more mobility and productivity to have “Motion” for “Life” and a Better Quality of Life. The community mission is to organize, support, and collaborate with other non-profits networking to provide a higher quality of service for people with disabilities. MfL spear-headed many activities organizing and updating other non-profit's resources and services in the community (provided technology service for health and social communication with conferences with public schools, highlighting and supporting their services. Like having health fairs, Healthy Good Meet-ups, raising funds, etc. MfL collaborated with Interagency Organizations, Hospitals, MHMR Centers, Schools, Home School Groups, Technology classes, Life Skill Students,--- in technology and Life Skills training. Together they set up a website for community services.

Funds were raised to promote Motion Control Products that are universal and help people with disabilities. A faucet lighting device and a faucet was designed. The prototype of the faucet was exhibited at THE FESTIVAL OF THE FUTURE Toronto, Canada, editdx.org, but has not yet been produced. Motion for Life is not a business but designed to support people that are creating new technology that is universal and is a help to people with disabilities.
