CHILDREN'S DAY

As salaam o Alaikum my dear friends, We are going to celebrate our favourite day:

ISLAMIC CHILDREN's DAY in the month of Rajab. Rajab itself is a very special month for all of us. In this month we celebrate our first Imam's birthday and Fathers day as well.

As a kid, Children's Day is a very special occasion for me. On this day, we get gifts from our parents, and they make us feel very special. As we are talking about children's day, how can we forget our inspirations? How can we forget those kids who gave their lives for us and for Islam? How can we forget our two super kids: Bibi Sakina Bint Al Hussain (A) and Hazrat Ali Asghar (A). Yes, I'm talking about the wonderful children of Imam Hussain!

Bibi Sakina (A) - the little Hashemite princess

Bibi Sakina (A) was the youngest daughter of Imam Hussain (A) and Bibi Rubab (A). She was born on 20th of Rajab, 57 Hijri, in Madina. Her real name is Ruqqayah bint Al Hussain (S). Bibi Sakina (S) was a lovely child, full of love and happiness, and everyone loved her very much. She was also known as a very religious little girl who enjoyed reading Qur'an. Her love for the Holy Qur'an showed in the fact that she was a haafiz-e Qur'an at the tender age of 4.

Bibi Sakina (S)'s inspirational story begins when she joined her father Imam Hussain (A) against the military of Yazeed in Karbala. She was very young that time. Bibi Sakina (A) had to watch her uncle Hazrat Abbas (A), her brother Ali Akbar (A), Ali Asghar (A) and her father İmam Hussain (A) being martyred in the battle of Karbala. After Imam Hussain (A) passed away, the little girl suffered a lot of hardship and oppression.

While she was imprisoned in the palace of Yazeed and was detained in a dark prison, she was prohibited from crying over the death of her father Imam Hussain (A). One night she woke up, crying and screaming for her father, Imam Hussain (A). When Yazeed heard those voices he ordered his servant to send them Imam Hussain (as)'s head which was placed in a silver tray. When Bibi Sakina (A) saw her father's head she cried so hard, for so long, but suddenly, she fell silent. Imam Zain ul Abideen (A), as who was her brother, thought she was asleep but after that he noticed the little girl Bibi Sakina stopped breathing and she died. She died in Damascus on 13th safar in the year of 61 Hijri. She was just 4 years old.

Hazrat Ali Asghar (A)

He was born on 9th of Rajab 60 Hijri in Madina. He was the youngest child of İmam Hussain (A). He was the youngest child in the battle of Karbala.

He was only 6 months old when the battle of Karbala was fought.

From 7th Muharram there was not a single drop of water in the camps. Hazrat Ali Asghar (A) was in great pain because of thirst. On the day of Ashura when everyone was killed, imam Hussain (A) was standing outside the camps and he prepared himself for the battle, all of a sudden, he heard that Ali Asghar (A) was crying. Imam (A) walked into the Bibi Rubab's camp (mother of Bibi Sakina (S) and Ali Asghar (A), lifted the baby and said to Rubab (A) "I'm going to take him to Yazeed's army, and I'm sure they will not deny to give him few drop of water".

Bibi Rubab changed Ali Asghar (A) clothes. Then Imam Hussain (A) carried the son to the battle field. Walking up to the Yazeed's army Imam Hussain (A) said "This child will not harm you, he is dying of thirst, it is my request to give him some drops of water". But they laughed and denied to give him even a drop of water. Then, Imam Hussain (A) asked Ali Asghar (A) "Oh my son, show them how thirsty you are!" Then Ali Asghar (A) turned his head towards the enemies. He smiled, opened his mouth and brought his dry tongue out and moved it over lips. Yazeed's army was so moved by him and they started crying, but still they were afraid of Yazeed and none of them came forward to give him water.

Umar Saad was worried. He thought that Ali Asghar's (A) innocence will melt his soldiers' hearts and they might go against Yazeed. So he ordered Hurmala - who was a famous archerer - to pin down Imam Hussain's baby. Hurmala aimed his arrow to Ali Asghar (A) and it pierced the neck of little Ali Asghar (A) and he lodged on the chest of Imam Hussain (A). Imam Hussain (A) looked at the sky and prayed "Ya Allah give me courage in this most difficult moment of my life"

So, Hazrat Ali Asghar (A) was martyred on the day of Ashura as a brave and youngest martyr of the battle of Karbala.

This whole story tells us that no matter how young you are, you can make a big difference and impact if you are on the path of truth and obedience of your imam.

On this occasion of Children's day, we should never forget to follow the footprints of Baby Ali Asghar (A) and Bibi Sakina (S). May Allah give us courage to follow Ahlubayt (A) and count us in the army of Imam-e Zamaana (ATF) - InshaAllah!

A GLIMPSE ON THE LIFE OF IMAMTAQI(A)

Introduction:

Imam Muhammad Bin Ali (A) - known more by his title Taqi (or the pious one) - is our ninth Imam. He was born on 10th Rajab 195 A.H. in Medina and was martyred when he was only 25 years of age on 29th Zilqaad 220 AH. He was buried next to his grandfather, Imam Musa Kazim (A) in Kadhmain, Iraq. As a matter of fact, the city of Kadhmain (or the two Kaadhims) has acquired its name from Imam Musa Kaadhim (A) and Imam Muhammad Taqi (A), the two Kaadhims.

His Family:

His first marriage was to Ummul Fazl, the daughter of Mamoon, the Caliph of the time. His second marriage was to a Nubian lady from the same clan as Ammar Yasir, the Prophet's dear companion. Her name was Sumannah. She was the mother of our tenth Imam, Ali Naqi (A).

According to Mufid, the Imam had one more son, named Musa and two daughters, Fatima and Imama.

Childhood - Imamate:

He spent the first five years of his life with his father, and He was the first among Imams from the House of the Prophet to have been separated from his father at a very young age. At the time of the martyrdom of Imam Reza (A) Imam Taqi (A) was only nine years old.

An Inspiration of 'Humility':


His unsurpassable knowledge, and his high position in the court of Mamoon and his special relationship with Mamoon as his father-in-law never got into the head of our Imam (A). His close friends who had expected his living-style and his behavior towards them to change after his marriage to the princess of the land were shocked to see that he remained as humble as before.

Once Imam (A) was very sick. A visitor came to see him for some urgent matters. Imam's family members wanted to send away the visitor, but the Imam (A) saw he must meet him. The Imam (A) was helped by his servants to get out of his bed. The visitor had wished that the Imam (A) would visit the former's father who was on his deathbed and wanted to relate his will to the Imam before dying. The visitor then said, "But seeing your condition, I cannot ask you to come with me to see my father." The Imam (A) insisted on visiting the sick person and did so despite his own sickness.

Conclusion:


Despite the sickness, Imam Taqi (A) went to visit the sick. Here the humility of the Imam (A) inspires me to always be humble and caring with our close ones and the ones whom you've known for a short period of time. Not only did the Imam (A) show humility, but he also showed generosity, piety, bravery and more.

- Eloquence: He was eloquent and had great oratory. He knew how to explain himself among other people. In addition to that, Nahjul Balagha is a book compiled with his sermons, letters and sayings of Imam Ali (A) reflecting the profound wisdom and oratory that he possessed.
- Infallible: He was one of the fourteen infallibles who was protected from errors, (sins and mistakes) and divinely appointed by Allah (SWT) as the Holy Prophet's rightful successor.
- His Knowledge & Wisdom was incomparable: One of the famous virtues among many
 that Imam Ali has is Knowledge and Wisdom from Allah swt. The knowledge and
 wisdom that Prophet Mohammed received was passed down to Imam Ali as he was
 his successor and inheritor. A very famous hadith back this up is: The Holy Prophet
 (S) has said "I am the city of Knowledge and Wisdom and Ali is its Gate".

Imam Ali (A) is indeed the finest example of the perfect man. In the words of the martyred scholar, Ayatollah Morteza Motahhari, if we take Imam Ali (A) as our role model and leader, we have made the perfect man our ideal, in whose dynamic personality reflects all humanitarian values that you can imagine.







THE GREAT VICTORY OF KHAYBAR

The battle of Khaybar was fought in early 628 CE (7 AH) between the early Muslims, led by Prophet Muhammad (S), and the Arabian Jews living in Khaybar- an oasis located 150 kilometers from the city of Medina.

There was a Jewish army with whom the Muslim army -lead by the Holy Prophet (S)- was battling for forty consecutive days. They went to battle daily but returned without fighting Marhab- a highly skilled soldier of the opposition, who was very difficult to defeat.

As a final resort, the Holy Prophet (S) declared: "Listen to me carefully! Whoever kills Marhab and comes forward tomorrow to take our Flag- the banner of Islam (Alam)- from me will be given the title of 'Ghayr e Farrar' (He who never retrieves). All must then call him 'Karraar' (he who attacks repeatedly)."

Everyone began pondering for a while, asking themselves, "Who will then fight Marhab?" Salman Farsi laughed and exclaimed, "The son of Imran is about to come!"

As soon as the Prophet (S) called out to Imam Ali (A), he appeared faster than the wind. Imam Ali (A) then went to fight, holding the banner high. With a big smile, he called out to Marhab, "Remind yourself of your mother's warning and return home. I am known as Haider and your fight is going to be futile."

Unfortunately for himself, Marhab was too arrogant and declared, "I will definitely fight this battle!"

Imam Ali (A) then said, "Bismillah" (In the name of God), and began to fight with Marhab. He quickly killed Marhab and then advanced further, shattering the gate of the fortress of Khayber.

Imam Ali (A) then called out to his companions "Come! This is a timely blessing! So, take away the wealth of plunder, but do not forget who it rightfully belongs to. The Fadak belongs to Hazrat Fatima (S)."

According to many traditions, this great battle was fought and won on 24th Rajab 7AH - adding to the many joyous events in the holy month of Rajab to celebrate for the Muslim ummah.



COMMEMORATING BAABUL HAWAIJ - THE DOORWAY TO FULFILLED WISHES; IMAM MUSA IBN JAFER

Our 7th Imam, Musa Ibne Ja'afer (A) - famously titled as Imam Musa Al Kaadhim (A) -was born on 7th Safar 128 AH at a place called Abwa (between Makkah & Madina). He spent 20 years with his father Imam Ja'afer Sadiq (A) and thereafter 35 years of his imaamat. As a child, Imam Kaadhim (A) showed incredible wisdom and kindness. He would help people in need and teach them about the importance of helping others.

His most famous title was Al-Kaadhim (Anger Controller). He was known also as Al-Abd Al-Salih (The Righteous Servant of Allah). In Medinah, he was known as Zain Al-Mutahajjideen (The Greatest Worshipper)

After his death, another title was made for him that superseded other titles. That was Babul-Hawaij (the Gate to fulfilling needs), as he was known for his miracles and that his prayers for people were met with favorable responses.


Imam Al Kaadhim (A) was imprisoned for almost 14 years of his life - where he was transferred from the darkness of one prison to another and subjected to very harsh conditions. Still, the Imam always viewed the situation positively and prayed frequently. Imam (A) turned a tragedy into a blessing; he found the prisons as an opportunity to get closer to Allah (SWT).

The reason of the change of prisons was that Haroon - the evil governor at that time - asked each of the prison in-charges to kill Imam (A) but they did not submit to his will. So finally, on 25th Rajab 183 AH, the cruel Caliph, Haroon Rasheed, poisoned the food of Imam Musa Al-Kaadhim (AS) in the prison of Baghdad. The dose proved fatal and the Imam (A) attained martyrdom. At last Imam Musa Al Kaadhim (A) was buried in Kaadhmain amid the sorrow, grief and anguish of the people.

His tomb is still the center point of Shias. It is now a holy place, being visited by believers from all over the world, and a gate through which the sinners can pass to ask Allah for forgiveness, and the help-seekers for the fulfillment of their needs, as they believe that petitions for needs are never declined if they are in the realm of Imam Musa Al-Kadhim. Such a belief made "Babul-Hawaij" (the Gate to fulfilling needs) the prominent title among other titles among the public.

EID E MAB'ATH: THE GREATEST DAY EVER



The day of Mab'ath is the formal appointment of the Last and Greatest Divine Messenger, of the Prophet Muhammad (S) - the person whose light God had created as the first ever creation eons ago when nothing had yet come into existence.

In the years before his mission, Prophet Muhammad (S) spent a lot of time in solitude, worshiping Allah (SWT). He would spend a month in solitude in a cave called Hira', in the mountains and would worship Allah (SWT) there.

After the month was completed, he returned to Mecca and circumambulated the Ka'bah seven times or more before returning home. He was in the cave of Hira' when the mission began and verses of the Qur'an were revealed to him (first 5 verses of Surah al Alaq). It is widely believed that the Prophet (S) was 40 years old at the beginning of his mission.

It is recorded that Prophet Muhammad (S) invited people secretly to Islam for three years after his mission. However, because of the order of the revelation of the verses of the Qur'an, some believe that the Prophet's (S) public invitation was carried out very shortly after the first revelation.

But who was the first and foremost to bear testimony to the mission of the Holy Prophet (S)? None other than his cousin, Imam Ali ibn Abi Talib (A), of course, who witnessed the glorious event of 27th Rajab in Cave Hira and which he so admirably relates in one of his famous sermons in the Nahj al-Balagha. Moreover, it was his testimony of the mission of Prophet Muhammad (S), as a ten-year boy which completed the kalema that every Muslim recites till this day: "Ash hado anna Muhammadan Rasoul-Allah (I testify Muhammad is the Messenger of Allah)."

Eid al-Mab'ath is an Eid for all human beings, not only for Muslims. In other words, it is an Eid for all of humanity, because Be'sat of the prophet revealed the utmost of God's mercy on mankind and humanity. Sending the Holy Prophet (S) on a mission to guide humankind, to lead humankind to their climax, is Allah's biggest grace on humanity.

The goal of Mab'ath is to wipe away the ultimate troubles in a society and the era of ignorance (Jahilliyah). Mab'ath is the day of returning to the divine nature. This is because all the sufferings, difficulties, and chaotic situations have been rejected in the divine nature of humankind, supporting truth, justice, and jihad in the way of the oppressed. In other words, the purpose of the prophets' Be'sat was to establish an ideal society.

The Holy prophet (S) was tasked with delivering the message of peace to humanity and declaring Allah's Oneness to idolaters and polytheists of the world. He was sent to confirm the essential teachings of monotheism as preached by earlier prophets, including Adam (A), Ibrahim (A), Musa (A) and Isa (A).

In one of his famous hadith, the Holy Prophet (S) has said: "I was the Prophet when Adam (A) was still in the (uncreated) state between water and clay."

No doubt, the mission of Prophet Muhammad (S) was foretold in all heavenly scriptures, which means that 27th Rajab was the day of formal Divine appointment of the Rehmatul-lil-'Aalameen: Mercy to all of Mankind, and thus a celebration for humanity.

IMAM HUSSAIN LEAVES FOR 'SAFAR E ISHQ'





AN ENLIGHTENING AFTERNOON CHAT WITH MAULANA KUMAIL MEHDAVI

While the month of Rajab was celebrated as the month of Baab e Madinatul 'Ilm - Imam Ali (A) and Baaqir al Uloom - Imam Muhammad Baqir (A), MIJS Online was extremely honored to have an enlightening afternoon with our community's respectable Aalim Maulana Kumail Mehdavi.

After our grade 12 student Muhammad Mehdi welcomed respectable Maulana sahab, he gave a brief introduction to MIJS Online which was then followed by a wonderful interview done by our grade 7 student - Syed Ali Naqi Zaidi. Here are some valuable snippets he shared with us:

Ali Naqi: Respectable Maulana Sahab, can you please enlighten us on your **basic education higher education and religious education** – so it can give insight and inspiration to youth on how to tread this path of Knowledge.

Maulana Kumail Mehdavi replied: In 1998, I managed to complete my matriculation (10th grade) earlier than usual - at the age of 14, and right after that, I got the opportunity to join Qur'an o Itrat Academy. I used to study in the Madressa in mornings, and joined Government Commerce College in evenings. When I got My Bachelors Degree,I went ahead for my Masters in Economics from Karachi University and since my matriculation was done early, my Masters degree was done early as well.

I had done my primary religious education in Karachi and also completed my Masters from there, and then we moved to Qom (Iran) in 2004 where I got the honor to pursue further higher Islamic education in the Hawza-e-Ilmiyah, Alhamdulillah.

I concluded my 6 years of studies in Qom with my graduating thesis in persian – which was based on the logic of Ahkaam (waajibaat ordained in Islam) in the light of narrations of Janaab e Fatima Zahra (SA) from Khutba e Fadak.

During our studies in Qom, we were privately also pursuing a Masters in Islamiyat and a Masters in Arabic from Punjab board- trying to keep education on both religious and worldly terms together.

Our quest for knowledge made us venture out to the city of Baab e madinatul ilm - Najaf e Ashraf as well. Our time there was short lived but we still managed to gain as much as we could before we proceeded to a new stage in our lives when we eventually started travelling around the world to spread the knowledge we had (and are still pursuing) - in the form of regular majaalis and lectures around the globe.

Ali Naqi: What were the habits that were instilled since childhood that lead you and your brother Maulana Taqi Mehdavi towards this success?

Maulana Kumail Mehdavi replied: Parents have the most important role in instilling habits, and indeed for us as well - they have been instrumental in molding us for this journey.

My father is a religious scholar himself and also the principal at Qur'an o Itrat Academy - where he has spent endless amount of years serving this cause,; he has closely witnessed and helped numerous students reach their highest potential by availing religious education from that platform.

I remember a conversation my father had with someone back in my school years – where the person asked my father if his children also intend to become scholars in this field. I recall that my father immediately replied that my sons can go into any field they want to.

He then talked about Surah Baqarah verse 124 where Allah appoints Prophet Ibrahim (A) as the leader for all mankind - and at that time Prophet Ibrahim (A) has a great desire in his heart and questions if Allah (SWT) will appoint leaders from his children. To this, Allah (SWT) promises that there will be leaders to perform this great mission from his progeny, but reminding that this position will not be given to those who oppress or go astray - from his future generations.

After mentioning this incident, my father said, in a similar fashion to Prophet Ibrahim (A), my heart too desires the passing down of my hard work and passion - and that the quest for deeper knowledge of our religion, and the devotion to serve in the way of Allah (SWT) moves down into my generations. It was my father's wish that sparked the light in us - and of course Allah's will - to make us embark on this journey of deeper learning of our Deen. I will be honest that there were a few struggles in pursuing this path - but Allah (SWT) has been very Kind to make this route smooth sailing for us - Alhamdulillah.

Ali Naqi: We would love to learn about your favorite Hadeeth and any specific verses from the Holy Qur'an which motivates you all the time!

Maulana Kumail Mehdavi replied: Amongst my many favorite hadeeth, I reflect most on this one: "The one who did not recognize the Imam of his time, dies the death of ignorance {Jahiliya}"

The word Jahiliya means the time period before Islam. This hadeeth is a wonderful reminder that even if someone becomes a highly honoured PhD anywhere in the world, or however successful business tycoon becomes, regardless of his 'worldly' status, if he doesn't the capacity hold recognizing the Imam of our time, then he dies the death of the period of Jahiliya.

This hadeeth is very close to my heart as it teaches us that our most important duty is to recognize the Imam of our time and take the path of closeness to our



Imam Al 'Asr (ATF). We can do this by performing righteous duties, enjoining the good and avoiding the forbidden.

My favorite set of verses from the Holy Qur'an is in **Surah Ash Shams (The Sun)** where Allah (SWT) has mentioned 11 oaths and when He swears by something, it shows the importance of the object He is swearing by and thus elevating its status. Furthermore, whatever he mentions after the oath is very important as well; so - after the oaths - by the sun, the moon, the day and the night, the sky, the earth, then Allah (SWT) says قَدْ أَفْلَحَ مَن زَكَّنهَا 'Successful indeed is the one **who purifies their soul'** (Ash Shams, Verse 9)

So whoever has a pure soul, whether he is a doctor or a specialist, whether he is an economist or successful businessman- if his soul is pure, he is successful. This verse is very close to my heart and I feel it can be a **great reminder for all of us to continuously do self-purification (Tazkiya-e-nafs)** if we wish to be successful in this world and the hereafter.

Ali Naqi: What is the true definition of SUCCESS in your opinion?

Maulana Kumail Mehdavi replied: With reference to Surah al Jumu'ah, there is a subtle message especially for our youth -especially since they yearn for success in this world. Allah (SWT) has encouraged that you should move to places around this world, earn a reputable job, and if you achieve worldly success after hard work, do not consider it as the perfection of yourself, but rather consider it as the grace of God; do not be proud, do not be arrogant and remember Allah (SWT) at every point - and then, you 'might' succeed.

In a spiritual context, Allah (SWT) has mentioned definite success in 3 Surahs.

- In Surah Ash Shams, He says 'Successful indeed is the one who purifies their soul,' (91:9)
- In Surah Al A'ala, He says 'Successful indeed are those who purify themselves, remember the Name of their Lord, and pray.' (87: 14-15)
- In Surah Mu'minun, Allah (SWT) stresses on 11 qualities in a believer and said that possessing these will eventually lead 'The believers to have attained true success'. (23:1)

A believer is one who not only performs his prayers, but who does them with sincerity and attention; who has fear of God, who saves himself from foolish acts and words; pays his zakaat and khums on time and he who does acts like charity-with good intentions and in secrecy. These are just some, if not many things that define ways to succeed in both this world and hereafter, in my humble opinion.

Ali Naqi: The HOLY QUR'AN is the most inspiring Book for us; but in these times, how can we as youth keep ourselves close and connected with the word of but in these

Maulana Kumail Mehdavi replied: I can recommend the following easy steps:

- Keep a habit to recite 10 verses everyday
- Try and read them with translation. I recommend the translation by Maulana Zeeshan Haider Jawadi for Urdu readers, and the translation of Maulana Farman Ali for English readers.
- Sometimes you might not understand the message in the Qur'an, but I recommend that you make Du'a for the Qur'an to talk to you, allowing its message to enter the heart. It will take some patience and time, but eventually you will experience it inshaAllah.
- Sit with a highlighter and note it down (Qur'an journaling) because sometimes you might find that that Allah (SWT) spoke directly to you as it connects so directly with somethings happening in your life. So it will be beneficial to highlight that verse and make notes about them.

Because the Qur'an is hand in hand with Ahlulbayt (A), I strongly urge for all
of you to connect with the Nahjul Balagha - especially the shorter sayings
in the last section. Try to read one of those everyday. This can easily be
done using apps we can install on our phones - like Shi'a toolkit, Divine
pearls, etc. Therefore, whenever the Quran and the Ahlulbayt (A) are used
together, it has a rather 'complete' spiritual effect.

Ali Naqi: QIBLA, MashaAllah, you describe **Mir Anees Sahib's poetry** in your gatherings quite often. **What makes you admire his poetry** and use it for reference?

Maulana Kumail Mehdavi replied: First of all, I am very happy that I have been able to make Mir Anees Sahib more known amongst my listeners - especially the youth.

Indeed, because he dedicated himself to Ahlul-Bayt (A), Allah Ta'ala has kept his name alive even after his death.

He first tried his hand at the ghazals - as a ghazal poet- but failing to make much headway in this direction, he changed over, under the advice of his father, to the writing of marsiyas, in which domain he soon established a high reputation. The zikr of Ahlul Bayt (A) is always alive so when he started writing in their honor, he gained a lot of fame. The first stanza he wrote was:

اندیشہ توصیف شہنشاہ امم ہے۔ زانو پہ سر فکر ہے سجدے پہ قلم ہے ۔ اے راہ یہ باریک کہ لغزش میں قدم ہے۔ اے دست زبردست خدا وقت کرم ہے۔

So, in this way, he has some uniqueness that makes my heart flow and I have always noticed that whenever I refer to his poetry in my Majaalis, it makes the

environment more refreshing and the audience feel energetic. Hence, I really find inspiration in his words and referencing them.

Ali Naqi: How can we get closer to our Imam-e-Zamaana (ATF)?

Maulana Kumail Mehdavi replied: To get closer to the Imam of the time, one of the easiest things I can tell you is to love the Ahlul bayt (A) and follow their path.



Another way is to match your attendance in life with the attendance of Imam al 'Asr (ATF). That is, ask yourself - if there is a gathering where Imam e Zamaana (ATF) will not attend (for example - mixed gatherings), then I will not attend that either. In places like reaching our Salaat at Awwal waqt, we will find our Imam (ATF) present there and thus we should aim to be on our prayer mats ready for Salaat at the same time - inshaAllah.

By following this one simple step, you will automatically walk on the right path. Let's aim to match our presence with that of Imam-e-Zamana (ATF) in individual matters as well as collective matters, thus making us closer to our Imam (ATF) by making him happy and pleased with us, InshaAllah.

MIJS ONLINE GIVES TRIBUTE TO (LATE) ALLAMAH MOHSIN ALI NAJAFI



(Late) Allamah Mohsin Ali Najafi - a jurist, Qur'anic interpreter, and eminent scholar, passed away after a lifetime of struggle in the cause of propagating the teachings of Islam.

Rightly named "Mohsin", he sure was a 'mohsin-e-millat' (spiritual benefactor of the nation), and a spiritual father for many.

One of his important cultural measures was the establishment of Ahl al-Bayt schools- which is a collection of 27 schools across Pakistan, and the USWA education system in Pakistan - which has more than 50 institutes under its umbrella.

From helping flood victims, arranging marriages to building mosques, he took care of the community's needs like a father.

He has written various books out of which the spectacular Al Kausar fil Tafseer ul Quran الكوثر فى تفسير القرآن ('The Kauthar' Tafseer of the Holy Quran) stands out - which is a meticulous work of years of research.

He was prominently known as a very enlightening personality; who has left behind an luminous legacy preserved in the hearts of his students and books.

Below are some of Sheikh Mohsin's golden words for the Youth of our community:

- He said, "On the night of Shab e Qadr, pray more for your aakhirat than dunya. I feel people neglect aakhirat, the grave, the barzakh, standing ashamed in front of our Lord, so I really recommend keeping the du'as of your aakhirat foremost"
- Being a true follower and lover of Ameer al Momineen, Ali Ibne Abi Talib (A). He not only

May Allah place (late) Allamah Mohsin Ali Najafi with Ameer al Momineen (A), and help us live a life of God consciousness following his legacy.




FEB 24' Special Rajab Quiz



THE EXEMPLARY TEENAGER HZQASIM (A)

"DEATH IS SWEETER TO ME THAN. HONEY" ~ HAZRAT QASIM (A).



This Hadith by Hazrat Qasim leaves behind multiple thoughts to ponder over, but before any of those it brings my attention to the personality of the thirteen year old Qasim.

It is important to realize that this saying is of a thirteen year old boy, even though it may sound like one by an old man who probably has seen many difficulties of life that he is looking forward to and welcoming death.

However, this, is 13 year old Qasim, who had reached this level of ma'arifah in his youth to be able to see so much beauty in death, or rather, in volunteering to sacrifice himself to bits, with his only concern being whether or not he is on the path of Hagg, whether or not he is siding with the Imam of his time.

Considering, at this age, one is generally afraid of death, and Qasim (A) knew that this was going to be no ordinary death, but a brutal murder; yet he did not show the slightest of concern regarding it.

This consequently makes me think about two aspects:

 First, the aspect of seeing beauty in the toughest of situations, and not just beauty, but such beauty to be able to call it sweeter than honey, and this something that the Ahlul Bayt (AS) has been the epitome of, and portrayed it to us time and time again for us to learn. It reminds me of Bibi Zaynab (SA) saying "I saw nothing but beauty", which further makes me realize, how they are truly reflections of one Light, the Light of Beauty, and truly, beauty does lie in the eyes of the beholder. • Secondly, the aspect of detachment from this world. What must be the level of detachment from this world, inner peace, tranquility, and nafs all mutmainnah in him to find letting it all go sweeter than honey? What level of maarifah, love, or rather, ishq, had this 13 year old boy reached to be able to not be concerned about the worldly consequences of siding with Haqq, and siding with the imam of his time? And how much of these capabilities, or rather, how much of this ishq, this love, this nafs all mutmainnah, this detachment, do 'I' have to be able to present myself, my whole self, in this way in front of the Imam of my time - to dedicate my whole existence to him?

We need to question ourselves by looking at the lessons we learn from Hz Qasim's character - if we even have a fraction of the same devotion to the Imam of our time; or are we at the level where we think we have done enough by attending a few majaalis and shedding a few tears. Of course those things also have it's own significance, but it is not enough- just like the 80,000 letters full of pledges and promises by the Kufans to the Imam of their time was not enough.

We need to question ourselves and ponder: Do I resemble the 72 companions of Imam more, or the force of 80,000 in opposition? And I am ready to be from 313 or not?



ALI AKBAR (A) AN INSPIRING YOUTH OF KARBALA



If we youth make Hz Ali Akbar (A) our role model, we can proudly face the Imam of our time and support his mission!



Tonight is the best night of the year after the night of Qadr, and it has become greater and more glorious with the birth of our Imam Al 'Asr (ATF). It is the night of Du'a and Ibaadah; a night of reflections and oaths - to think about how we can serve our dear Imam!

May Almighty Allah make us among his special companions and always help us to be on his right path, Ameen!

OUR LAST IMAM (ATF)

The Holy Prophet has said:

"Even if the entire duration of the world's existence has already been exhausted and only one day is left before the Day of Judgment (Qiyaamah), Allah (SWT) will expand that day to a length of time so to accommodate the kingdom of a person from my Ahlul-Bayt (A) who will be called by my name. He will then fill the earth with peace and justice as it will have been full of injustice and tyranny before then."

Our last Imam is Imam Mahdi (ATF). He was born on the 15th Sha'baan 255 A.H. in the city of Samarra in Iraq.

He was named Abu al-Qasim Muhammad - the same name and kuniyya as the Holy Prophet (S); however, he is more commonly known as Muhammad al-Mahdi (ATF).

His father's name is Imam Hassan Askari (A) and his mother's name is Bibi Narjis Khatoon (S). The young Imam's birth was shrouded in secrecy, much like that of Prophet Musa. Fearing the prediction of the downfall of his empire, the Abbasid king planned to eliminate the newborn Imam. However, Allah's protection shielded the Imam (ATF) and his identity remained hidden, except to a few loyal followers.

The evil king at that time, Al-Mu'tamad, was aware of the prophecy, and anxiously searched for the hidden Imam. Upon the death of the Imam's father, he learned that the Imam's five year old son had led the funeral prayer. This realization filled him with suspicion and a hidden desire to confirm the Imam's identity. To achieve this, he ordered the arrest of the Imam's mother.

The Imam's mystical hiding for protection from the world is known as Ghaibat (occultation). Imam Mahdi (ATF) stayed in ghaibat in two phases:

- Ghaibat-e-Sughra (minor occultation or shorter period of remaining in mystical hiding) for about 69 years- from 260 AH to 329 AH
- and Ghaibat-e-Kubra (greater occultation or meaning the longer period of remaining in mystical hiding), started in 329 AH and still continuing till Allah's decision to make him reappear in this world.

Backbiting is arguably the most common and deeply rooted vice in our society among all of the others. For many, backbiting has become second nature, so most people are unaware of their actions when they commit this serious sin. The evils of backbiting and its detrimental effects, which can seriously affect our interactions with others, are discussed in the Holy Qur'an.



We may not always think carefully about the things we say about the people in our lives when they are not present. If we do that, it can seriously harm our ability to build strong, enduring relationships with the Imam of our time (ATF).

So let us promise to avoid backbiting itself and to discourage our family and friends as well - and also try to avoid other kinds of sins in our daily lives. The key is to reflect on our actions and be self-aware about our actions.


For this, and protection from all kinds of evils and sins, we can get help for this from Imam-e-Zamaana (ATF). How can we do that?

The answer is - to TALK TO OUR IMAM (ATF):

By instilling the habit to talk to Imam e Zamaana (ATF) daily, and share all things with him - then we maintain a relationship with him. Then, if we ask for help, you will come to realize his aid and presence in every moment of your life!

The Holy Prophet (S) has reported to have said to the Commander of believers, Ali (A) that: "There will be twelve Guides (Imams) after me, the first of whom is you, O' Ali, and the last one will be the 'Support' (al-Qa'im), who - with the grace of Allah (SWT) - will gain Victory over the whole east and west of the world."

May we live to see the reign of the Imam of our time (ATF) inshaAllah and may we be amongst the ones that have great Islamic character and values that allow us to be connected to him in this period of his ghaibat - Aameen!







IMPORTANCE OF SHAHR AR RAMADHAN

What is Ramadhan?

To understand the importance of Shahr ar Ramadhan, it is important for us to first understand what Ramadhan is.

Imām Ja'far ibn Muhammad al-Sādiq (A.S) said:

"Say not, "This is Ramadhan" and "Ramadhan has departed" and "Ramadhan has arrived" for surely, Ramadhan is one of the names of Allah, The Mighty, the Glorious, who neither arrives nor departs. Surely, arrives and departs that, which is short-lived, Instead say: "The month of Ramadhan". [Reference: Al-Kafi, 4, page 70]

According to this narration, Ramadhan is one of the Names of the Almighty Allah, hence it is more appropriate to refer to it as 'The Holy month of Ramadhan' instead of just Ramadhan. SHAHR meaning month - by calling it Shahr-ar-Ramadhan, we are in fact respectfully and appropriately pronouncing the name of the month with its true essence - and recognizing that it holds a permanent significance in our lives every passing year.

Although the word "Ramadhan" is mentioned in many other narrations for reference to the month of fasting, it's worth noting that the phrase "the Holy month of Ramadhan" (Shahr ar Ramadhan) is also recommended, possibly to align with how it's expressed in the Quran in Surah 2, Ayah 185. This phrasing also honours the holy month, which the Holy Prophet (S) called "THE MONTH OF ALLAH (S)."

SIGNIFICANCE OF THE HOLY MONTH

It is worth highlighting that this month is also the holiest month in the Islamic calendar. Fasting is prescribed in this month, as well as the Holy Quran was revealed. It is narrated from Imam ar-Ridha' (a.s): "Verily, the month of Ramadhan is a month in which the holy Qur'an was revealed. It was in this month that the Prophet of Islam was informed of being a Prophet. The Night of al-Qadr which is better than one thousand months and therein every matter of ordainments is decreed is in this month."

From this hadith by Imam Ridha (a.s) we can understand the value of this Holy month as multiple valuable aspects are related to this Month.

As the narration says the Holy Quran was revealed during this month, according to certain traditions, 'the Scriptures' of Ibrahim, the Torah of Moses and the Psalms of David were all also revealed in this Holy month.

In addition to that, the Night of Qadr is also in this month; a Night of power, and one which is described as better than thousand months. A night as special as the Night of Qadr being a part of this month also shows how valuable and holy the month of Ramadhan is.

IMPORTANCE OF FASTING

The benefits of fasting are various. Fasting has personal, social, hygienic and best of all spiritual benefits.

Hisham Ibn Hakam asked Imam As-Sadiq (a.s) about the reason(s) because of which fasting has been made obligatory. The Imam replied: "Verily, Allah made fasting obligatory in order to equalize between the poor and the rich. Surely, the rich people would not otherwise feel the pain of hunger to be kind to the poor. For the rich will reach anything they wish. Thus, the Almighty Allah willed to equalize between His servants and to give a taste of the pain of hunger to the rich so that he becomes more lenient to the weak people and be more merciful towards the hungry ones."

Thus, fasting is obligatory both for the poor and the rich.

Although fasting has some social benefits, this is not the main purpose of fasting.

The main purpose of fasting is to gain 'self-restraint' as stated in the holy Qur'an: "O you who believe! Fasting is prescribed for you as it was prescribed for those before you, that you may observe self-restraint (al-Taqwa)." [2:183]

It helps control our natural energies, guiding the body to follow spiritual values. This keeps the body healthy by avoiding excess and giving the organs a break to stay ready for regular activities.

Scientifically, it acts like medicine for many physical and nervous issues. Both the wealthy and the poor, women and men, powerful and weak – everyone must observe fasting. It encourages generosity and empathy towards those in need, reminding believers to consider the needs of others.

Muslims share the blessings given by Allah with one another. Believers build a strong connection with Allah by fasting, as it shows their constant desire to follow His commands. They also strengthen bonds with each other during Shahr ar Ramadhan: a month focused on generously giving and positive social interactions. Islam emphasizes moral excellence during this sacred month.


IMAM HASSAN (A) THE GIFT FROM GOD

Was in fact this man, al-Hassan, the man of generosity.


Oh Hassan, a leader whether stood or in a 'seat',

MARTYRDOM OF IMAM 'ALI (A)

The term Kharijites came from the Arabic word Khawarij which means "those who left". It refers to a group of Muslims who were initially followers of Imam Ali (A), but later went against him and broke away from him.

Abdur Rahman bin Muljam was amongst the Kharijites who were consumed with the desire to kill Imam Ali (A), and was in quest of an opportunity to do so. By a coincidence, he met a Kharji woman, one Qattama, whose father and brothers had also been killed in Nehrwan, and she too had nursed an undying hatred of Imam Ali (A). Abdur Rahman fell in love with Qattama, and proposed marriage to her. She told him that the price of her hand was the head of Ali ibn Abi Talib (A). This only strengthened Abdur Rahman in his resolution.

Abdur Rahman bin Muljam carefully worked out his plans to kill Imam Ali (A). A few other trusted Kharjis also volunteered their services to him, and together they rehearsed the assassination. Abdur Rahman bin Muljam took one extra precaution – he put his sword in deadly poison, and let it soak in it for three days.

On the morning of the 19th of Ramadhan of the year 40 A.H., Imam Ali (A) came into the Great Mosque of Kufa, and recited the Adhaan (the call to prayer). He took his place in the mehrab, and moments later, the worshippers began to arrive. They stood behind him in jama'ah, and the prayer began. Standing in the front row, with other worshippers, were Abdur Rahman bin Muljam and his confederates. They were watching Ali's movements. In the folds of their cloaks, they were carrying swords burnished to a high sheen, and soaked in poison. Just when Imam Ali (A) touched the ground with his forehead for sajda, Abdur Rahman bin Muljam stepped out of his row, and crept into the mehraab. And just when Ali (A) lifted his head from the ground, ibn Muljam struck the fatal blow at his forehead with such deadly force that it split open.

Blood squirted from Ali's forehead in several jets, and he exclaimed: "By the Lord of the Kaaba, I am successful!" The members of the congregation realized what had happened, and as soon as they concluded the prayer, they surrounded him. His sons, Imam Hasan (A) and Husain (A), carried him to his house. A physician came, and tried to dress the ghastly wound but could not stop the bleeding. The blow of the sword was fatal anyway, but the poison from its blade was also spreading rapidly in his body.

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The crime of assassinating Imam Ali (A) remains one of the cruelest, brutal and hideous acts in history - because it was not committed against one man, but against the whole rational Islamic leadership. By assassinating Imam Ali (A), they actually aimed at assassinating the message, the history, the culture and the nation of Muslims embodied in the person of Imam Ali bin Abi Talib (A). In doing so, the Islamic nation lost its guide of progress, and at the most wondrous opportunity in its life after the Holy Prophet (S).

Imam Ali (A) suffered from his wound for three days. During those three days, Ali (A) spent the time still left to him in prayer and devotions; in dictating his will; in giving instructions to his sons, ministers and generals regarding the conduct of the government; and in urging them all never to forget the old, the sick, the poor, the widows and the orphans at any time. Ali (A) declared that his elder son, Hasan (A), would succeed him as the head of the Kingdom of Heaven on Earth, and as the sovereign of all Muslims.

Though Ali (A) was steadily weakening from the loss of blood and from the action of poison, all his faculties were sharp and clear right to the last moment. To all those people who came to see him, he said that they ought to be aware, at all times, of the presence of their Creator in their lives, to love Him, to serve Him, and to serve His Creation. Alas, the poison had done its work, and on the morning of the 21st of Ramadan of 40 A.H., Ali ibn Abi Talib (A) left this world to go into the presence of his Creator whom he had loved and served all his life. He was "God-intoxicated." His greatest ambition in life was to wait upon his Creator, every moment of his existence, and he realized it, and this is the meaning of his exclamation in the alcove of the mosque when he felt the edge of the sword at his forehead: "By the Lord of the Kaaba, I am successful."

Hasan (A) and Husain (A) washed the body of their father, draped it in a shroud, offered the funeral prayers for it, and then buried it silently at midnight at Najaf Ashraf, at some distance from Kufa. Imam Ali (A), Islam's greatest saint, hero, statesman, philosopher and martyr, had left this world, and the world was not to find a man sublime like him for all eternity.

Such was the heroic end of this great man! The loss to the Mission and the nation was the gravest after the loss of the Holy Prophet (S). By the death of Imam Ali (A), the nation lost; Aaheroism that had become the song of the time; acourageous history that has never dreamt of its like; wisdom no one can fathom, except Allah; purity, the like of which was only in the prophets; an abstinence from the pleasures of life that could be attained only by the nearest to Allah; an eloquence such as to be the echo of the Book; and a jurisprudence, and a thorough knowledge of the laws of religion, that made him the 'gateway of the city' of the Prophet's knowledge, and the authority to whom the Islamic nation referred in all its affairs.

FROM BISMILLAH TO AN-NAAS

UNVEILING THE REVELATION OF THE HOLY OUR'AN

The Qur'an is the Holy Scripture of Muslims and the Words of God. It is a miracle that from the 'Ba' of Bismillah to the 'Seen' of 'An-Nas' (the last Word of the Qur'an) was revealed to Prophet Muhammad (S) word by word.

We believe that the Quran is the only book that has not changed ever since its revelation was completed. As the Infallible Imams are protecting this Holy book, they have tried to tell us the significance, value and tafseer of the Surahs at countless occasions.



The term used in the Qur'an for revelation is 'al-Wahy'. Al-Wahy literally means a quick and mysterious way of communication.

The Qur'an was revealed to the Prophet of Islam from the beginning of his mission to the end of his life, that is from the 27th Rajab in the 40th year of his life up to the 28th Safar (or 12th Rabi'u 'I-Awwal) 11 A.H - a total span of 22 years 5 months 1day (or 15 days).

The first revelation was the first five verses of surah Iqra' which begins with the words "Read" or Iqraa'. And the last verse connected with the shari'ah, revelead on Ghadeer e Khum:

الْيَوْمَ أَكْمَلْتُ لَكُمْ دِينَكُمْ وَأَتْمَمْتُ عَلَيْكُمْ نِعْمَتِي وَرَضِيتُ لَكُمُ الْإِسْلَامَ دِينًا "This day have I perfected your religion for you, completed my favor upon you, and have chosen for you Islam as your religion" (5:3) Although the first revelation to Prophet Muhammad (S) occurred in the cave of Hira at Mount Noor, there was never any restrictions of the times or places for receiving revelations. Sometimes he was receiving revelations whilst he was eating, praying, on the pulpit, riding his horse, etc. The revelation was also sometimes foretelling the future (30:2,3) or it would reveal after occasions or incidents, like the revelation about the Battle of Uhud (3:121-180) or the Battle of Bani-Nadheer (59:2-10). Sometimes he was asked a question and instantly the answer would be revealed to him (48:1-4), but in some other occasions it took more than a month for an answer to be revealed to him.

The Quran has been given so much significance that it was revealed in the best of months and is given the title of the best of nights. Laylatul Qadr is a celebration to commemorate the arrival of the final guidance for humans. It is a tribute to the commencement of the message revealed to mankind by their Creator, a message which shows them the way to achieve happiness in both the worlds.

Just as the arrival of a child is celebrated, on its birth and then every year, as a bringer of joy and fulfilment for the family, Laylatul Qadr is celebrated as a bringer of light and guidance for mankind.

Unlike the birthday which is celebrated with a feast for the senses, Laylatul Qadr includes a feast for the spirit, a feast of worship and prayers.

Some Ahadeeth indicate that the fate of every believer for the coming year is decreed on this night. That is why the Du`as for this night ask for special favors in the decree for the year. Believers are encouraged to stay awake the entire night, and pray for blessings and forgiveness. It is the holiest night of the year, and it would be unwise to be heedless of the tremendous benefits of this night.
