

7 SIGNS THAT YOU TRULY LOVE THE MESSENGER OF ALLAH

Extracted from Sulaiman Salem's Article

Love is hard to define, but for the sincere believer, love for the Prophet (s) is constant. His care for us was so deep that he prayed for his Ummah in every prayer. If we truly love him, our actions should reflect it. Here are seven signs of genuine love for the Prophet (s), along with action steps to implement:

1. Imitating Him

True love means emulating his actions, character, and lifestyle.

Action: Reflect on your actions and speech. Do they mirror the Prophet's teachings? Evaluate how you treat parents, family, and friends.

2. Studying His Life (Seerah)

Learning about the Prophet's life increases love for him. The companions taught their children about his life before anything else.

Action: Start reading about His (s) life and then start implement it in your life.

3. Following His Message

The Qur'an is the greatest gift brought by the Prophet (s). Regular recitation and study of the Qur'an is a sign of love for him.

Action: Recite the Qur'an daily, even if just a little. Add a study of Tafseer to deepen your understanding.

4. Sending Salutations Upon Him

Regularly sending "Salawat" increases Allah's blessings upon you and strengthens your bond with the Prophet (s).

Action: Start the habit of sending 10 salawaat upon him in the morning and evening.

5. Loving Whom He Loved

Love for the Prophet (s) includes loving his family, Ahlulbayt, and following his Sunnah in daily life.

Action: Follow his teachings in acts of worship, cleanliness, and treating others well. Show love towards the people he cared for.

6. Remembering Him

True love leads to remembering him often and desiring to be with him in the Hereafter.

Action: Recite Surah Dahr on Thursday mornings to get a place close to the Holy Prophet (s) in Paradise.

7. Encouraging Others

Sharing the Prophet's teachings and encouraging others to learn about him shows your dedication to spreading his message.

Action: Share knowledge about the Prophet (s) with friends and family.

O Allah, grant us true love for Your Messenger and allow us to follow his path until we meet him in the Hereafter.



SIMILARITIES BETWEEN OUR LAST PROPHET AND THE 6TH IMAM

"A believer should have eight qualities: dignity in times of hardship; patience during trials; gratitude in times of ease; contentment with what Allah has provided; not wronging enemies; not being harsh with friends; and ensuring people are safe from him (anger, rage, harm, etc.)." — Prophet Muhammad (s)

▶ Key Points:

They both shared the title (Laqab) "Sadiq," which means truthful and full of honesty. They both share the same birthday, on the 17th of Rabi' al-Awwal.

▶ The Relationship Between Prophet Muhammad and Imam Ja'far al-Sadiq

The relationship between Prophet Muhammad (s) and Imam Ja'far al-Sadiq is both significant and inspiring. Imam Ja'far is a direct descendant of the Prophet, part of the esteemed Ahl al-Bayt family, and a continuation of his noble lineage. As the sixth Imam in Shia Islam, he not only carried forward the teachings of the Prophet but also contributed his own insights. This connection makes him a vital figure in Islamic history, creating a direct link to the original message of Islam.

Spiritual Leadership

Both Prophet Muhammad (s) and Imam Ja'far al-Sadiq were essential spiritual leaders in Islam. They are both considered Ma'sum (infallible). The Prophet Muhammad was the last messenger, establishing the core teachings of Islam and guiding the early Muslim community. Imam Ja'far al-Sadiq, as the sixth Imam, helped people understand and follow those teachings. Together, they provided essential guidance, shaping the beliefs and values of their followers.



Emphasis on Knowledge

Both Prophet Muhammad (s) and Imam Ja'far al-Sadiq emphasized the importance of knowledge and education. Both Are Buried in Medina

→ Our Holy Prophet, Prophet Muhammad (s), is buried in Masjid-e-Nabawi, and our sixth Imam, Imam Ja'far al-Sadiq, is buried in Jannat al-Baqi.

As flags of guidance you carried them with love and pride on your shoulders


EXCELLENCE OF MAN OVER ANIMALS

Explained by Imam Ja'far al-Sadiq (s) to Mufaddal (r).

Just consider the excellence of man's creation over animals.

Man stands straight and can sit. Allah made his parts in such a way to help him hold things in his hands, to walk, to bend, and to assist him in work. If man had been hunched like animals, he could not have performed the tasks he does now.

Imagine not being able to stand or sit. What if we walked like horses or cats? Would we be able to do what we can do now? — Isn't this a great blessing?



Imam Ja'far al-Sadiq (s) points out a blessing of Allah for which we must be thankful. Consider the matter of feeding and resting, ordained for him and the reasons underlying them. Each of them has an urge which gives rise to a desire, and then it is fulfilled by man.

Allah created the feeling of hunger. Hunger demands food, which supplies life and energy to the body and its substance. If this urge were not there, man could deprive himself. Even a small baby cries when hungry, to communicate his/her need.

Isn't this amazing?

Sleep demands rest for the body to remove fatigue. If this urge for sleepiness were not there, man would overwork his body. Eating and resting are important for growth.



- 1 tbs Chocolate Chips




METHOD

SHAH ABDUL AZEEM HASANI (R)


Sayyid 'Abd al-'Azīm al-Ḥasanī was a distinguished hadith narrator and a descendant of Imam al-Hasan (s). Before his passing, he had the honor of meeting Imam al-Rida (s), Imam al-Jawad (s), and Imam al-Hadi (s). His shrine is located in Tehran, and some narrations state that visiting his tomb carries a reward equivalent to visiting the shrine of Imam al-Husayn (s).



Imam al-Hadi (s) once addressed Sayyid 'Abd al-'Azīm during a journey, saying: "O Abu al-Qasim! You

indeed are our wali... you have received the religion from us which God loves, May Allah support you in this world and the Hereafter."

In a letter to him, Imam al-Rida (s) wrote:

"Allah is Rich, and you are poor." (Qur'an 47:38)

Linguistically, "al-Ghanī" means: independence by virtue of having self-sufficiency. It is the opposite of faqr, which is poverty or need. No one is independent of needing anyone or anything other than Allah.

This meaning is implied in verse 64 of Sūrah al-Ḥajj: "His is whatever is in the heavens and in the earth, and most surely Allah is the Self-Sufficient, the Praised."

Faqr is realizing the fact that we are in need of His mercy. Everyone else besides Allah is needy.

To apply al-Ghanī in our lives, we need to understand what it means to be rich (ghanī). The Prophet (s) has said: "Wealth is not the abundance of availability; rather, it is the richness of one's own nafs."

What is a Rich nafs?


Shaykh Rajab ʿAlī Khayyāt explains: "Your price is as high as

you demand; if you demand God, your price is infinite, and if you demand the world (material possessions), your price is as low as what you have desired."

Benefits of Recitation

- \cdot Repeat Yā Ghanī frequently for contentment.
- · Recite 70x daily for abundance in rizq.
- · Recite and blow over the body for shifa ' from illness.



THE VIRTUES OF ABU DHARR AL-GHIFARI (R)



Abu Dharr's greatest and most profound virtue was the words of Prophet Muhammad (s), who said to him, "Oh Abu Dharr! You are from the Ahl al-Bayt (s)," a recognition that alone was enough to elevate his status.


Abu Dharr al-Ghifari was amongst the first people who converted to Islam, He holds a special place in Islamic history for his piety and devotion. Imam al-Sadiq (s) highlighted that the core of Abu Dharr's worship was deep contemplation, and he would cry out of fear of Allah until it harmed his eyes (Ṣadūq, al-Khiṣāl, p. 40, 42).

It is reported that Imam Kadhim (s) had said that Abu Dharr embraced three things what others would fear: death, poverty, and affliction. He would say that dying in obedience to Allah is better than living in sin, suffering for His sake is better than comfort in disobedience, and poverty with piety is better than wealth with sin (Kulaynī, al-Kāfī, vol. 8, p. 22).


Regarded as one of the "four pillars" of Islam alongside Salman al-Farsi, Miqdad, and Ammar b. Yasir, his loyalty was unmatched (Ṭūsī, al-Rijāl, p. 598). The



Prophet (s) himself stated that Allah commanded him to love Abu Dharr, Miqdad, Salman and Imam Ali (s), affirming their exceptional status (Al-Ghadir, vol.9, p.117)



SCHOLAR ADVICE




Let's take the words of wisdom from the one known the keeper of the knowledge of the successor of Allah's messenger.

Imam Hasan Askari (s) says: What a bad man he is, who has two faces and two tongues! He praises his brother when he is present and eats his flesh (backbites him) when he is absent. He envies him if he is given (becomes in a good state), and betrays him if he is afflicted.

Practical Implementation:

- → 1) Be Honest: Practice being sincere in your words. When you talk about someone, make sure you say good things, even when they're not around.
- → 2) Practice Kindness: Make it a habit to compliment someone every day. It could be as simple as saying, "You did a great job!" or "I really like your style!"
- → 3) Reflect on Your Actions: At the end of each day, think about how you treated others. Did you speak kindly? Were you supportive? If not, think of ways to improve tomorrow.



THE ZIYARAH OF LADY FATIMA MASUMA (S)

Ayatollah Wijdani Fakhr, a great faqih who is buried in the haram of Lady Fatima Masuma

(S), narrates that one Shab-e-Jummah, while he was at the shrine of Lady Fatima Masuma (S) reciting ziyarat, he suddenly saw a light descend upon the top of the zareeh. A voice was heard, announcing that Lady Fatima Zahra (S) had come to perform ziyarat of her daughter Fatima Masuma (S).

Ayatollah Wijdani Fakhr recounts that he initially moved away in respect of Lady Fatima (S) but paused when she called him by name, saying, "Stay where you are, as this is the exact spot where my son, the Imam of our time, Imam Mehdi (ATF), stands to recite




ziyarat." She added, "Please continue reciting the ziyarat of my daughter Fatima Masuma (S), as the recitation calms the pain that I have in my ribs."

Following this incident, Ayatollah Wijdani Fakhr emphasized to his students the importance of performing the ziyarat of Lady Masuma (S) on every Shab-e-Jummah. One Shab-e-Jummah, while he was at the haram reciting ziyarat, he noticed fewer students present. To highlight the importance of ziyarat, he shared his meeting with Lady Fatima Zahra (S) with his students. That same week, Lady Fatima (S) appeared to him in a vision and cheerfully said, "This week, the pain in my ribs was calmer."



Agha Bahjat has mentioned: One of the best gifts that can be sent to Imam al-Mahdi is 11 times Surah Tawheed. It helps strengthen our relationship with the Imam and also helps us stay away from whispers of shaitan.



Surah al-Ikhlas, also known as Surah at-Tawhid, holds immense spiritual significance in Islam. Its deep monotheistic message encapsulates the essence of faith in the oneness of Allah. Despite its brevity with just four verses, this chapter of the Qur'an is regarded with high reverence.

It is narrated from the Prophet Muhammad (s) that the recitation of Surah al-Ikhlas holds multiple spiritual benefits. Some of these benefits include:

- 1. Reward of Tenfold Believers: Reciting it once brings a reward equivalent to ten times the number of people who have believed in Islam.
- 2.Blessings for Self and Family: When recited twice, blessings are extended to the reciter and their children. Reciting it thrice bestows blessings upon the entire family.
- 3.Palaces in Paradise: Reciting Surah al-Ikhlas 11 times promises the reciter palaces in Paradise.

4.Forgiveness of Sins: A person who recites it 100 times will have their sins from the past 25 years forgiven, with exceptions for grievous sins such as murder or theft. Reciting it 1000 times grants the unique blessing of seeing one's place in Paradise before death.

5.Wealth and Prosperity: The Prophet (s) once advised a poor man to recite this surah after saying 'salaam' when entering his home, even if alone. The man soon witnessed great wealth and prosperity.

6.Essential for Daily Prayers: The recitation of Surah al-Ikhlas in one of the five daily prayers is so important that neglecting it for seven consecutive days is likened to following the faith of Abu Lahab. It is also considered makruh (disliked) to recite it in one breath.

Additionally, this surah is regarded as a source of protection, a cure for ailments, and a prayer of strength when facing difficult situations, such as traveling or dealing with a tyrant.

The virtues of this surah encourage regular recitation as a means of gaining closeness to Allah and securing blessings in both this world and the hereafter.








An Exclusive Quran PTM was arranged for parents to discuss their child's Quran level and progress in their Quranic journey




Special Crash Course Sessions

THE LEGACY OF ALLAMAH AMINI (R)

On July 2, 1970 (28th Rabi' al-Thani), the renowned Islamic scholar and theologian, Allamah Abdul-Hussain Amini, passed away at the age of 68. He was the compiler of the invaluable book Al-Ghadeer. Born in the city of Tabriz into a religious family, he pursued preliminary studies before moving to the holy city of Najaf in Iraq, where he studied under prominent ulema such as Sheikh Abdul-Karim Haeri and Mirza Mohammad Hussein Naini.



At a relatively young age, Allamah Amini attained the status of ljtihad and began writing books. Al-Ghadeer is his most significant work, as it establishes the wilayat (spiritual authority) of Ameer al-Momineen (Imam Ali). To compile this book, he endured the hardships of traveling to various countries, including India, Turkey, Syria, Egypt, and Iraq, in order to study different sources. He dedicated nearly 18 hours a day for many years to this endeavor. Besides Al-Ghadeer, he wrote several other books, including an exegesis of the Holy Qur'an, and founded a large library in Najaf, which continues to serve scholars today.

It is narrated through a dream that Allamah Amini was granted a drink from the Kauthar directly by Imam Ali (s). In another dream, he informed his son after his passing that a high

status was bestowed upon him because he had recited Ziyarat Ashura daily for 30 years. He advised that even if one cannot visit Karbala, reciting this Ziyarat brings the reward of visitation and should never be neglected.



Allamah Amini also made the intention of sharing the reward of his work with all those who recite "Ajjil Farajahum" after Salawat.

The power of tawwasul: One day, Allamah Amini was distressed because he could not obtain an important book related to the subject of Imamat, which he needed as a reference for his work on Al-Ghadeer. In his difficulty, he sought the intercession of Ameer al-Momineen (a.s.), asking for help in finding the book.

Allamah Amini recalls that after a brief sleep, he was awakened by a knock at the door. It was his neighbor, who explained, "I recently purchased a new house and moved my belongings there. This book was found in a corner of my old house, and my wife suggested that I should present it to you."

Amazingly, it was the very manuscript that Allamah Amini had been searching for.
