## FROM THE PASTOR

Greetings and blessings dear friends and readers of the Freshwater's Current, may the Lord bless you with amazing peace, grace, mercy, and above all, love.

I spent yesterday meditating over Psalm 46, one of the many great songs we find in the songbook of the Bible called Psalms. You may not know this, but this Psalm formed the inspiration for the Martin Luther hymn, "A Mighty Fortress is our God." King David the Psalmist wrote in verse 7 "the Lord of hosts is with us, the God of Jacob is our fortress." Luther was inspired by that verse and composed the hymn while he was hiding from those who were given the license to kill him. Luther was hiding in a fortress called the Wartburg under the false name of Brother George. Martin Luther had just stood before the might of the imperial court and defended his stance on scripture and the corruption in the church at the Diet of Worms. It was in Worms that he made his famous "Here I Stand" statement. Luther took a stand on a matter of conscience that was grounded in scripture and human reason and for that stand, he was condemned and branded a criminal. His supporters "kidnapped" him and spirited him away to the protection of the Wartburg. While at the Wartburg, Luther composed the hymn A Mighty Fortress, and perhaps he was inspired by Psalm 46 while he was in the work of translating the whole Bible into the German language so the people could read the Bible for themselves.

Psalm 46 has a great message regardless of when David wrote it or how it inspired Martin Luther. Its message to us is very relevant in light of all the unsettledness we see in our country and the world. The message of this Psalm is that God is with us, God is our refuge and strength. It tells us powerfully that even though the world may shake, the seas roar, the mountains be moving God is there offering us hope and strength. One of the familiar sections of this Psalm is "be still, and know that I am God." My question to you is where in your life is there quaking, roaring, or unsettledness? The Psalmist is saying – ground yourself in God, say to your troubled spirit "be still, God is with you, God loves you, God knows you, God cares about you...be still my troubled soul." In these troubled times. I believe this is a moment of opportunity for us to lean into God with our uncertainty, with our hopes, fears, dreams, and disappointments. God is saying "be still, trust me I have not forsaken you."

I invite you once you have finished reading this newsletter that you take the next moment, open to Psalm 46, and read it slowly and out loud to yourself. Lift to the Lord whatever it is that is causing you to feel troubled, focus on the words of "refuge". "streams", "glad", "help", "morning", "with us", "still", and "strength". Let God speak into your anxiety and your trembling put him in the center and take refuge in him. May the Lord bless you!
