FROM THE PASTOR

Lenten Greetings to you in the name of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ! May the blessing and peace of Christ be with you and your families!

1 John 1:9 says "if we confess our sins, he (Jesus/God) is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness." This is one of my absolute favorite passages of scripture and I believe captures the essence of Lent. In Lent, we focus on our sin, on where we fall short, but we do not stay there – we confess to God; we receive from God grace, mercy, and forgiveness – and from that place of forgiveness, we experience cleansing from all unrighteousness. We experience and receive new life, a chance to start again anew. When we think of the journey of Jesus to the cross and the empty tomb – it is all about redemption, salvation, wholeness, restoration, renewal, new life, refreshing love. This experience can be summed up in one word: forgiveness.

Unforgiveness is a prison in which many people unknowingly put themselves into, and in this prison, people sit and become bitter and resentful toward themselves and toward others. Unforgiveness leads to resentment, resentment leads to bitterness, and bitterness can lead to hate. It is a vicious merciless cycle in which people put themselves. It is like a prison with a hamster wheel, people run and run but get nowhere. Forgiveness however in and through the person of Christ is the key that unlocks the nightmare of that prison. Is this easy? By no means! It is a choice that we must make – maybe each day – "today, I will forgive so-and-so, please Lord Jesus Christ give me the strength and will to forgive." Not to sound selfish, but forgiveness is about you and your freedom from the pain of whatever hurt you experienced, not the other person. Do you want freedom? Forgive!

Corrie ten Boom said. "Forgiveness is the key that unlocks the door of resentment." Here is an adaptation of a true story from Corrie's life from **Oh How He Loves You**. While in a concentration camp in Germany, Betsie ten Boom (Corrie's sister) was becoming frail. One day while doing heavy manual labor, she kindly said to her guard, "Don't give me more to do than I am trying to do already. because I am not strong enough to lift these heavy parts." The guard flashed back, "You don't decide what you do. I decide." At that the guard brutally beat Betsie. Corrie ten Boom, her sister, watched and was enraged. When the guard left, Corrie went over to Betsie who now had blood all over her face. Betsie immediately said, "No, don't hate, Corrie. You must love and forgive."

Corrie knew that she was unable. That night she went for a walk and told the Lord that she could not forgive "that brutal woman." The Lord reminded her of a Scripture, "God's love had been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit which has been given to us." (Romans 5:5) Corrie knew that what she was unable to do, the Lord, in her, was able to do.

She writes, "At that moment, when I was able to forgive, my hatred disappeared. What a liberation! Forgiveness is the key that unlocks the door of resentment and the handcuffs of hatred. It is a power that breaks the chains of bitterness and the shackles of selfishness. What a liberation when you can forgive."

In a world that is awash in hate, resentment, and unforgiveness may we find the strength in Christ to do the opposite of the world – not only for our own sake, but for the sake of our children and grandchildren – let us teach, model, live, and practice each day the gift of forgiveness!

Freshwaters Single Board Minutes February 9, 2021

Linda Olson called the meeting to order at 7:04 PM.

Present were Linda Olson, Andrew Harvala, Carla Lusche, Susan Kettelhodt, Phil Lingle, Scott Liestman, Dave Halverson, Cori Wallace, and Kevin Fox.

Kevin led the group with an invocation.

The agenda was amended to include a Worship committee report.

Cori reviewed the activities of the Youth program, ages 3 – 11. There have been between 4 and 9 in attendance on Sundays, and many more that are known to not attend due to Covid.

The Worship committee has been looking at the Audio/Visual technology used to stream the Sunday worship services. They have interviewed a number of other local churches to see what works for them and are getting proposals from some venders on upgrades to our equipment. They have proposed a three-stage improvement program beginning with the Sanctuary and feel it would involve around a \$3500 investment for the first stage. This would include some equipment and a subscription service that would be ongoing.

Due to the importance of having a strong on-line presence and the long term need for great technology the Board encourages the Worship Committee to keep a broad outlook and overall plan in mind, and endorses by consensus a budget of \$25,000 to come from Memorial funds.

Trustees are going to have a basement cleanup and revamp the storage area on March 13th.

Susan gave the financial report. Giving remains down some but expenses are also down and we continue to weather the Covid crises as well as we could expect.

Linda and Kevin reviewed some recommendations for changes to our Mission and Values statements.
