

FROM THE PASTOR

Greetings and blessings, dear friends, sisters, and brothers! May the blessing and peace of the Holy Spirit rest upon you all!

The season of Lent is not too far away, and as I reflect upon this, a prayer comes to mind that we usually hear on Ash Wednesday. The prayer goes like this: "We acknowledge and bewail our manifold sins and wickedness, Which we, from time to time, most grievously have committed, by thought, word and deed, Against thy Divine Majesty, Provoking most justly thy wrath and indignation against us. We do earnestly repent, And are heartily sorry for these misdoings." These are heavy words from the Book of Common Prayer, a book used by our Anglican and Episcopalian sisters and brothers. This prayer would have been very familiar to John and Charles Wesley and the early Methodists.

These words convey a deep mournful sorrow towards the sins we have done, left undone, or have turned away from, such as in acts of injustice.

Today, sin is an uncomfortable subject and seemingly out of place in this anything goes "whatever feels good to me" culture. Yet, sin is at the heart of many issues we see facing us. Racial tensions stem from sin, sexual immortality stem from sin, the corruption in our institutions stem from sin, and so on. Scripture tells us that sin is the killer of individuals, families, friendships, communities, nations, and yes, even churches. Jesus tells us graphically that if a hand causes us to sin, we should cut it off, or if our eye causes us to sin to pluck out our eyes. He is speaking metaphorically, of course, but his point is that sin is deadly; it kills our soul, joy, hope, and love for God,

Jesus Christ came to deliver us from the hell of sin, set us free, renew our hearts, lives, souls, bodies, and minds; to be righteous, humble, loving, forgiving, and holy people.

In this season of Lent, I invite you to look into your lives, see where there is sin, confront it by confessing it, rejecting it, repenting of it, and turning once again to the Savior who is with you; in all your battles! Jesus Christ destroyed sin's hold over you and me – THIS IS LOVE! Amen!

Purchase flowers in honor or memory of loved ones to decorate the church for Easter.


