3 EASY Ways to Give





A Note From The Ouilters

We have had a busy 7 months making quilts and other crafts. We have also had 2 sales to raise money for ongoing missions that UMW supports. The approved missions for this year are: \$1700 to local missions: Feed My Starving Children, Volunteers in Mission, Kinship in Princeton, and Giving Tree, and recently added \$200 to Laundry Love in Princeton. The largest is the District Pledge of \$4,120 to MN Conference of UMW, which also supports several outreach missions. UMW also gives the proceeds from the Roast Beef Dinner to our church. So far this year, the quilters and UMW have raised \$2871, with a Fall sale coming up on October 1st.

Many of you may not know that UMW is <u>every woman</u> in our church. You see us everywhere, organizing and packaging Bags of Blessings, working funerals, Vacation Bible School, Sunday School, serving at coffee hour, singing, decorating the church, baking for events, cleaning the kitchen, and participating in services. A big Thank you to our UM Men helping, singing, teaching, and working with us to support these missions and our church!

Our quilters' sales events have also brought in new sewers and crafters who wanted to join us and volunteer their talents to help people in need and for the fellowship. We are so excited to have a growing group of women with a passion to help others. Come join us Tuesdays from 8:30 - 12:00, and you don't even have to be a sewer or quilter!

We have a Fall Sidewalk Sale coming up October 1st, where we will sell our quilts and crafts to raise money that goes to UMW. This year, we are inviting other vendors and artisans to set up their tents and tables on the church lawn, with a \$25 fee for their spot. We would also love to have more volunteers to help make baked items to sell, help us set up a few tables, sell coffee and bars, etc. We are also looking for more donated crafts to sell with proceeds going to UMW.
