Greetings and blessings dear friends and readers of the Freshwaters Current, may the Lord bless and keep you as you receive this newsletter!

By the time you receive this newsletter we will be well into our present message series called Backward Living. In this series we are looking at the wisdom contained in the book of Ecclesiastes. King Solomon is writing this as he looks back over the course of his life and reign. The common refrain that he uses is "all is vanity, all is meaningless." Not exactly the most encouraging and inspirational messages you will find in scripture. When one looks at the deeper message, we can see that Solomon is saying to us "do not make the same mistakes that I did." The overarching message of Ecclesiastes is do not waste your life on chasing after things that do not ultimately satisfy such as worldly possessions, wealth, status, fame, beauty, superficial relationships and the like. Solomon knows this from personal experience, hence the warning he is communicating in this book of the Bible. At the end of his life Solomon is saying to us that our relationship with God is what truly matters, it is that relationship that will truly satisfy us and complete us.

This should not surprise us because when we look at scripture we can see that it is God who made us. It is God who shaped from the dust and

breathed with love life into the lungs of Adam and Eve. It is God who said to Adam that it is not good that he should be alone, and made for him a companion to walk alongside. Indeed when we are at the end of our life what is it that matters to us? We want to be at peace with God, and to be at peace with our friends and family. What I experience is the power of God's love and life in the presence of family and friends. This is what matters; this is Solomon's message: do not waste your life on "stuff" rather focus on your relationship with God and cultivate friendships and family connections that are life giving. Is this not the deepest longing and hunger of the human heart? As I look at the worn exhausted faces of people, I think that is what lies in the depths of each and everyone.

Freshwaters Church – here is an opportunity for us! How can our congregation or we as individuals help connect people to that which gives life? Remember the woman at the well? She was empty, she found Jesus, she connected with people and because of that – many came to believe! May it be so for all of us, that we experience that life-giving relationship with Jesus and in turn overflow into the lives of those around us! Amen

On December 14th, Linda Olson made a motion to take another \$30000 from the investment account for a total withdrawal of \$55000 to pay for the new RTU air conditioning unit, and the motion carried.

☐ The meeting opened with a scripture reading of Psalm 100 and a prayer led by Pastor Kevin.

☐ The Single Board welcomed Gene Stoeckel and Karen Oudekerk

☐ Financial Report:

☐ Currently, there is a special fund for Elim Oasis, which offers the opportunity to people to try out Elims' services. The trustees will let Elim's new director know that these designated funds are available.

☐ Great news! Tithes/Offering are up 14,000, and loose plate collections are up \$1000 compared to last year..

☐ Unfortunately, our Income is still down \$16,000 compared to last year, leaving Freshwaters with a year end deficit of 9%

☐ If each family could find it in their hearts to give an additional 5%, we could close that deficit.

☐ There is a small amount of money remaining in the Investing in Congregations funds, and this will be moved to the general fund for use in Sunday School. ☐ Scott Liestman shared the letter regarding the request to withdraw additional funds from our Methodist Foundations investment account. Because it can be challenging to access funds with Methodist Foundations, Scott proposed moving the investment to a mutual fund with more liquidity and easier access.

■ Gene Stoeckel made a motion to transfer our Foundations account to Edward Jones. Susan Kettelhodt seconded. Motion carried.




