- 1. Approved agenda for meeting
- 2. Minutes from 1/10/23 were approved & published into February Freshwaters newsletter
- 3. Kevin led the group in prayer
- 4. Linda gave a financial report via Susan K report:
- -We broke about even in January.
- -\$25,000 was taken from the Growth fund to the Trustee fund for the new HVAC system.
- 5. Investments w/ Methodist Foundation & Edward Jones-Scott reported a Zoom meeting w/ Himself, Kevin, Linda, Sheri Meister & Diane Weller where the Foundation has oversight & enforcement of the investment rules.

Language in Freshwaters UMC Investment(Growth) account -adopted by the Freshwaters Single Board when the Zimmerman property was sold Spring 2000:

The Bishop and Cabinet have agreed that the proceeds from the sale of the building must be invested with the MN Foundation and not to be used until they have outgrown their current building and are ready to buy or build in another location. The interest earned from the investment can be used annually to make some minor changes to the current building in Princeton, but the principal balance of \$500,000.00 is restricted. The Board understands this and agrees to this.

- -Edward Jones Endowment account-Scott reported we cannot use the principal but we can use the current earnings available of \$40,000
- -Growth Account with MN Methodist Foundation-we can access the dividends but not the Principal or the earnings.
- -Gene made a Rescind motion (Scott 2nd)regarding withdrawal of the \$30,000 from the Growth account due to the restrictions of the account/Cabinet. Motion carried.
- -Gene made a Rescind motion(Scott 2nd) regarding to move all the assets in the MN Methodist Foundation to Edward Jones. Motion carried.
- -Andrew made a motion(Scott 2nd) to withdraw \$35,000 from the Edward Jones account & place into the Trustee account for the HVAC replacement in April. Any funds of the \$35,000 not used will be returned to the Edward Jones account. Motion carried. The estimated cost to replace the HVAC system is \$55,000.
- -Kevin will coordinate a meeting with the current District Superintendent Fred Vanderwerf and incoming District Superintendent Woojae Im to discuss options of our account with the MN Methodist Foundation. Included in that meeting will be Kevin Fox, Linda Olson, Scott Liestman,
- 6. Trustee Report-Andrew reported that replacement of the HVAC system will take place in April
- -Kitchen dishwasher has been fixed & is operational.
- 7. SPRC Report-Ryan reported that a new Custodian has been hired, Trevor Brown. Trevor started 1/12 & has already received compliments of how clean areas are. Trevor is planning to clean 3x a week.
- -SPRC needs to complete & update the Church Profile (demographics, ministries, etc). This profile helps UMC make Appointments as one example of purpose.
- 8. Annual Board Retreat 4/15-no new discussion
- 9. Next meeting- 3/14/23
- 10. Other/New Business
- -Elim Vulnerable Adult issue &. Elim Oasis is requesting that the Front Doors be locked during the day hours of their operation due to a vulnerable adult in their program. Multiple options were discussed & weighed against having a 'Welcoming Church'/logistics of daily operations/security of the building. No decision was reached however Linda will discuss with Mary(Elim Director) the options the Board explored, if the issue still exists, and any cost sharing of said options explored.
- 11. The meeting was adjourned by Gene, Ryan 2nd. Motion Carried


