As many of you know I have started to do reenacting as a British Soldier for the period of the American Revolution. This is something I have wanted to do since I was in the 7th grade after watching the movie April Morning. Why British? Superficially I love their uniforms - the red coat, the bicorne hats, the tall bear skin grenadier hats, the Brown Bess musket with bayonet, and the large regimental flags waving in the breeze. More personally I had ancestors who served on the British and the Colonial sides of the war. Simply the 18th century is an interesting time period in the history of the world and it is fun to be part of a group that seeks to recreate a part of it as best and as professionally as we can in the 21st century.

For me it is interesting to reflect on the motivations of those who fought it from the British and Colonial sides. As one looks at the American Revolution it is not as cut and dry as one might think – the Revolution was not just Great

Attendees: Andrew Harvala, Jim Hennessy, Brad Wesloh


- All approved of getting the sidewalks leveled. We had multiple bids and decided to go with A-1 Concrete Leveling.

Wesley argued that as he h was not a landholder in England, he could vote for a representative and therefore had representation in the Parliament but still remained loyal to the King and governmen

As I put on my uniform as a British soldier, I think about the conflicted nature that faced both the Colonists and the British. What both sides went through for what they thought was right and true. What did freedom and liberty mean to them? How did their faith sustain them, what did it teach them in the face of this bitter conflict? Next year we will begin to celebrate the 250th anniversary of the American Revolution – what are its lessons today especially in a nation that is so bitterly divided? What can our faith teach us as we reflect in this month of July as we celebrate our hard won freedoms and liberties? Lots to think and pray about! May all of you be blest by our awesome God and Savior Jesus Christ!


