Worship Committee Update -

The Color Purple: Why do we have purple as the color of advent? We all know that the color of purple is for the season of Lent. But did you know that purple is also the color for advent? Not green or red but purple. Purple Is the traditional color for Advent in the United Methodist Church because it symbolizes both royalty and penitence, which are fitting for the season of preparing for the coming of Christ.

Royalty: Purple represents the sovereignty of Christ and the anticipation of the coming of the King.

Penitence: Purple symbolizes the repentance and fasting, and reminds us of our need for forgiveness and salvation. The United Methodist Book of Worship also allows blue, the color of hope, to be used during Advent.

In addition, the four candles of Advent (John-Elizabeth-Joseph-Mary)

Church season colors: Beginning Christmas Eve the color changes to **white/ gold**. White and gold are joyous colors used during the Christmas and Easter seasons except on the day of Pentecost and in other days such as Baptism of the Lord, transfiguration, Trinity, All saints and Christ the King Sunday. **Green** – symbolizes the color of growth and is used in season after Epiphany and After Pentecost, except for special days when red or white is used. **Red** – the color of fire, symbolizing the Holy Spirit and is used when the work of the Holy Spirit is emphasized. Red is also the color of blood – the blood of Christ and the blood of martyrs.

This year the WC hopes to have new Advent banners using the color purple as the color for Advent and representing the four Advent candles – *Hope, Peace, Love and Joy.* Diane Wesloh and the quilting group will be making new Advent candle stand paraments that will be matching the new banners. If anyone would like to donate towards the purchase of new banners please put in the offering plate and designate "banners". Advent begins the Sunday after Thanksgiving Day - December 1st. We will be decorating the sanctuary on Saturday, November 30 at 10:00 am. If anyone would like to assist with the decorating, please come then so we can have it all decorated for the beginning of Advent. Thank you all.
