

FROM THE PASTOR

Greetings dear friends, sisters and brothers in Christ Jesus, fellow disciples and companions on the journey of faith and readers of this edition of the Freshwaters Current.

How are all of you in these days? How is it with your souls and your faith? How are your families? For those of you who have children, grand-children, nieces and nephews I pray that they have all gotten off to a good start with school. As I sit and write this article to you, I have been teaching a class at the University of Northwestern on the history of the Roman World. It has been a great experience so far; I am truly thankful to God for this opportunity. We have not only been studying a civilization that is long gone; we have been looking at a civilization that influences us today. Our system of government was modeled after the Roman Republic; our buildings reflect the classical world of Rome and Greece; when we go to the race track or to a football stadium we are sitting in places that were modeled after the Romans. Our Christian faith emerged in and transformed the Roman world. In my class we just finished exploring the period of the rapid Roman expansion during the Roman Republic, and how this rapid expansion would be a consequence of the demise of the Roman Republican system and give rise to persons like Julius Caesar and Augustus. Today was a sobering day as we began to look comparatively at the stresses and strains the Roman Republic faced with our own republic. We saw similarities and we also saw differences. The point is - the Roman Republic faced moments of profound change, and we are in the midst of moments of profound change. I told my students that they should be documenting

A Kingdom Divided Cannot Stand what they see, hear, and experience because it will be important to future scholars when they look back at this period in time.

My friends one of the big differences is that we have the teachings of Jesus Christ to guide us in the days ahead as we move toward the election. Jesus teaches us that we are to love God, to love our neighbor (including our "enemies"), and to love the person who God made us to be. He teaches us to forgive, he teaches us to treat others as we want to be treated. He teaches us to rest in him. He teaches us that we should be defined by love but also to stand for what is right, good, and holy – even if it is hard. He teaches us that we must pray and seek first his kingdom. He teaches us not to worry about tomorrow, but rather be focused on the present day. When I think about these principles it does not surprise me that the early Christian movement was called "The Way." I believe that these principles of Jesus Christ are a wonderful guide in the way ahead – as we navigate through the CoVid, as we navigate our way through this election season, and as we navigate our way into the holidays (which is hard to believe, but they are coming!). We need to care for each other, love each other, encourage each other, be there for each other in these days. I believe that we do have something to offer this hurting world - it is the life-aiving refreshing waters of Jesus Christ who invites us together into life-giving relationships and moments of restoration and rest. Invite people to experience that with you and with us! - May God bless and keep all of you in his love and care! Pastor Kevin

SINGLE BOARD MEETING MINUTES

September 8, 2020

The meeting was called to order by Linda Olson at 7:00pm.

Members present were Andrew Harvala, Roger Leider, Linda Olson, Kevin Fox, Darren Wesloh, Scott Liestman and Philip Lingle. Also present was Youth Director Cory Wallace.

The agenda was approved as written.

Cory outlined how they plan to provide Sunday School with appropriate Covid safety. They will decide on purchasing a final curriculum after a few weeks to access how much they need. Preschool to 8th grade will participate. Pastor Kevin will begin Confirmation classes in October.

Carla Lusche will be joining the Board in January.

Andrew reported a final settlement has been reached with the insurance company for \$91,000, and repairs to the sanctuary will begin soon.

Roger submitted the financial reports, showing collections down by \$11,000 YTD, but expenses also down so net is down \$900 from budget. He also created a new report titled Freshwaters Church Holdings. This separates out the endowment, memorial, youth, and growth funds that are not part of the general fund. The policy statement describing the use of those funds was discussed, some changes made and will be voted on at the next meeting.

The Board Retreat is scheduled for October 10, 9-3, and changed to the MN. Propane building (former Zimmerman church) due to the addition of more people attending. Scott will coordinate lunch and snacks. This meeting will combine the regular October Board meeting with the retreat and cancel the October 13 meeting.


Prefilled Communion Cups
