


The readings for today

Eothinon 4, Luke 24:1-12

On the first day of the week at early dawn, the women went to the tomb, taking spices, which they had prepared. And they found the stone rolled away from the tomb, but when they went in they did not find the body of the Lord Jesus. While they were perplexed about this, behold, two men stood by them in dazzling apparel; and as they were frightened and bowed their faces to the ground, the men said to them, "Why do you seek the living among the dead? He is not here, but has risen. Remember how He told you, while He was still in Galilee, that the Son of Man must be delivered into the hands of sinful men, and be crucified, and on the third day rise." And they remembered His words and returning from the tomb they told all this to the eleven and to all the rest. Now it was Mary Magdalene and Joanna and Mary the mother of James and the other women with them who told this to the Apostles; but these words seemed to them an idle tale, and they did not believe them. But Peter rose and ran to the tomb; stooping and looking in, he saw the linen cloths by themselves; and he went home wondering at what had happened.

Epistle reading from Paul's Second Letter to the Corinthians 2Cor. 4:6-15

Brethren, it is the God who said, "Let light shine out of darkness", who has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Christ. But we have this treasure in earthen vessels, to show that the transcendent power belongs to God and not to us. We are afflicted in every way, but not crushed; perplexed, but not driven to despair; persecuted, but not forsaken; struck down, but not destroyed; always carrying in the body the death of Jesus, so that the life of Jesus may also be manifested in our bodies. For while we live we are always being given up to death for Jesus' sake, so that the life of Jesus may be manifested in our mortal flesh. So death is at work in us, but life in you. Since we have the same spirit of faith as he had who wrote, "I believed, and so I spoke", we too believed, and so we speak, knowing that He who raised the Lord Jesus will raise us also with Jesus and bring us with you into His presence. For it is all for your sake, so that as grace extends to more and more people it may increase thanksgiving, to the glory of God.



FROM FATHER'S SERMON

Today's reading from the Holy Gospel, my beloved Christians, reveals an essential Christian virtue: "as you wish that men would do to you, do so to them" (Lk 6:31). To love those who love us, to treat well those who treat us well, is common amongst secular people. To treat others the same way they treat us, seems logic enough when it comes to beloved friends and family. We receive love and so we give love in return. But what about when people treat us bad? That's where today's teaching clicks in place. Christians are called to be always superior, overcoming lower passions like being petty, hateful and vengeful. And how do we achieve that? By asking ourselves the question: How would I like to be treated? Would I like to be treated badly? Do I like it now that I'm being treated injustly by others? The obvious answer of course is no! What then does one give in return of hate and injustice? Love is the right answer! What does this mean? It means that when you receive hate, you do not respond to hate with vengeance, because that only prolongs your suffering which dwells in your soul and twists it to evil thoughts; thoughts that then become deeds, targeted at hurting people, bringing more evil to the world. But a Christian's mission upon the world is to heal, as our Lord does, to be a light in the darkness of the world (cf Mt 5:14), as He instructed us to be. So, by responding to hate with love, as Christ did to those who crucified Him with His dying breath (cf Lk 23:34), a Christian breaks the chain of hate and emotion that poison the soul of any ordinary man. And then the peace from above, the blessing of the Heavenly Father, comes and dwells in the heart, giving it strength to overcome any hate or injustice of this world.

DID YOU KNOW

That st. Dionysius the Areopagite, whom we commemorate today, was a disciple of the Holy Apostle Paul? He was the first Athenian to believe in Christ and was appointed by Apostle Paul first Bishop of Athens. Today he is the protector saint (or patron saint) of the City.


